

Jesus gave him back to his mother.


Everyone was amazed.

John the Baptist was in prison when he heard about the things Jesus was doing.


He sent his friends to Jesus and they asked, 'Are you the One God promised to send? Or is God going to send someone else?'




Then Jesus said,




The disciples woke Jesus up and shouted, 'Master, we are going to drown!'



Jesus stood up and spoke to the wind and the waves saying, 'Be quiet! Lie down!'


Amazingly, the wind stopped blowing and the sea became calm.


Jesus looked at His disciples and asked, 'Where is your faith?'


Evil Spirits lived in this man and made him wild. He didn't wear clothes and lived among the graves.

Jesus answered. 'They don't need to go. You give them some food.'


They said,

all these people.'




Jesus said, 'Bring the food to Me, and tell the people to sit down on the grass.'




Do you remember hearing about Jesus feeding five thousand people?


These people liked being fed and wanted to make Jesus their king.

He looked at the big waves and was afraid.


He started to sink







what the story means.





'The seed is God's word.



Jesus answered her saying, 'It is not right to take the children's food and give it to the dogs.'




The lady believed that God's blessing was not just for Israel, but for her as well!

'My church will never be destroyed by evil. You will be like a gatekeeper, letting people into My kingdom.'


Then Jesus said to His disciples, 'Don't tell anyone that I am the Christ.

You are thinking the way men think.'




Then Jesus said, 'It will not be easy, for anyone to live God's way but keep following Me.
