

God saw that what He had made


was good.

The sun was for shining in the day and the moon at night.


He saw that what He had made was good.




On the fifth day as God was creating the world, He said, 'Let there be fish in the sea and birds in the sky.'

He blessed them so they could have baby fish and baby birds. God saw that what He had made was good.








Last of all God took some dust and made man.


This man could love and share in what God would do.

God showed Adam all the birds and animals, and he gave each of them a name.






Then God looked at everything He had made, and said it was VERY good.





He called out, 'Adam, where are you?'


Adam answered, 'I heard you coming and I hid myself. I was afraid because I was naked.'


'Have you eaten the fruit?' God asked.


'Eve gave me the fruit,' said Adam.

'The snake tricked me,' she said, 'and I ate the fruit.'








God made clothes for Adam and Eve. He sent them out of the garden and put two angels and a flaming sword there.







One day Cain and Abel brought offerings to God. Cain did not trust God but he brought some wheat and corn to Him.

Cain knew that God was not pleased with his offering. He was jealous of his brother and he was angry with God.






He was so angry he took his brother out into the field and killed him.


God asked Cain, 'Where is your brother? What have you done?'

Then God came down to see what they were doing.



This city was called Babel,











Just as Abram thought, officers came and took Sarai away to their king. They gave him gifts of sheep, cattle, servants and donkeys.




But the Lord made the king and the people in his house very sick. The king realised he had been told a lie.







Abram and Lot lived near Bethel. Both of them had lots of sheep, goats, donkeys and servants.





On Abram's way home, two kings came to meet him. One was King Melchizedek. He saw that it was God who helped Abram. He brought bread and wine to him and praised God.









God took Abram outside and said: 'Look at the stars.

Then God said, 'I brought you to this land so I could give it to you.'






God said,




Abram listened to Sarai and took Hagar.



'Oh!' Sarah laughed.







The Lord said to Abraham, 'I am going to destroy Sodom because the people there are wicked.'





Will you destroy the city then?'


'I will not destroy the city if there are forty-five people,' said the Lord.

The Lord said, 'If I find thirty I will not destroy the city.'




So he said again, 'O Lord, I will speak only once more. What if there are ten there?'



Then the Lord left Abraham. Abraham went home.



Abraham gave Isaac the wood to carry. He carried the fire and the knife.






Abraham looked up and saw a ram caught in a bush. He took Isaac off the altar and put the ram there instead. He killed it and burned it to worship God.






In heaven the angels came to meet God. Satan came too but he hated God.

God said to Satan, 'Have you seen My servant Job? He loves Me.'


Satan replied,

So, God told Satan, 'You can take everything away from Job, but you cannot kill him. You will see that he does love Me.'




That is what Satan did. He killed Job's family, his animals and his servants.


Then God allowed Satan to make Job sick and sores came on his body. He was showing Satan that Job loved Him, even though he was sick.
