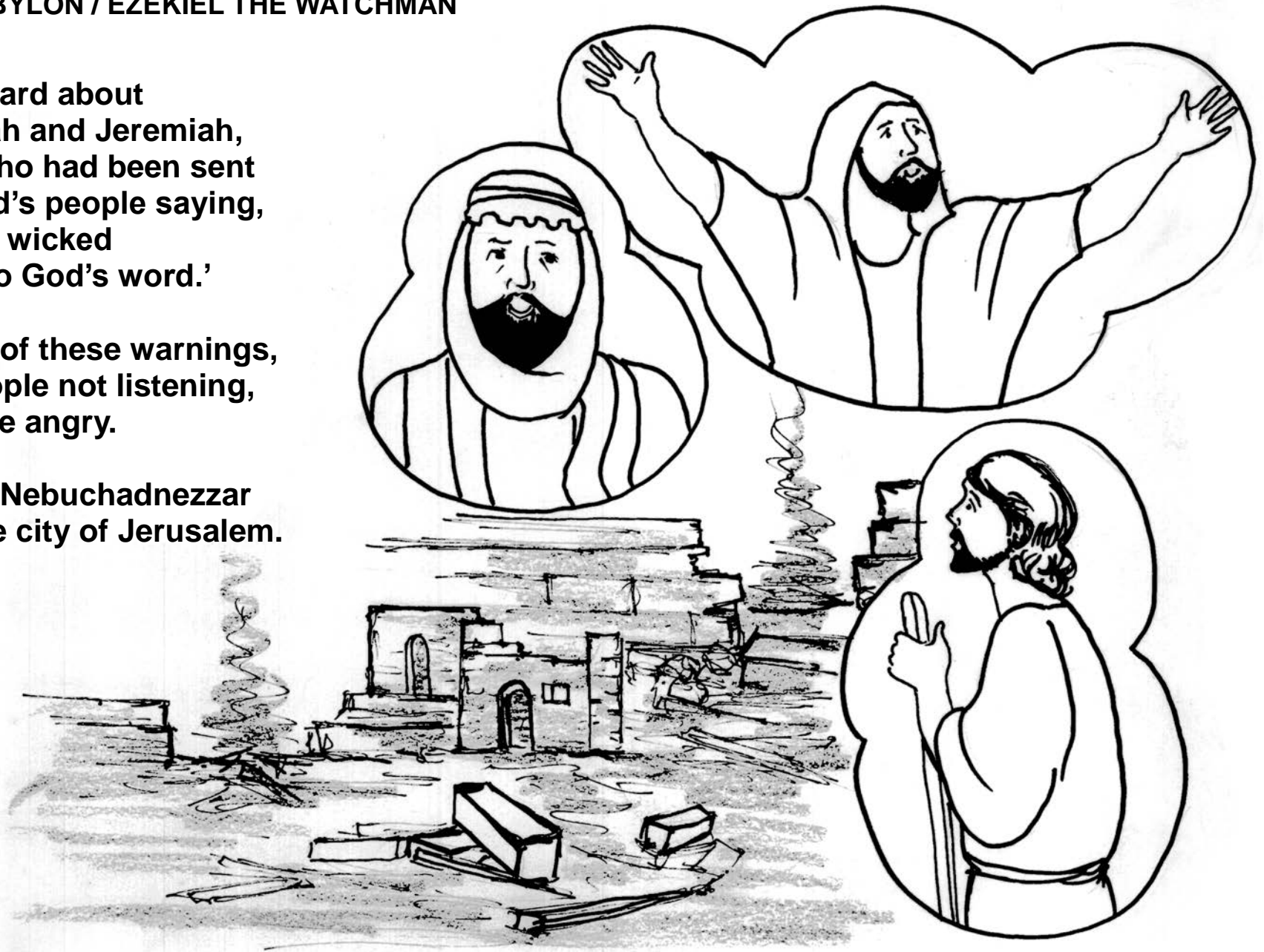

and listen to God's word.'**

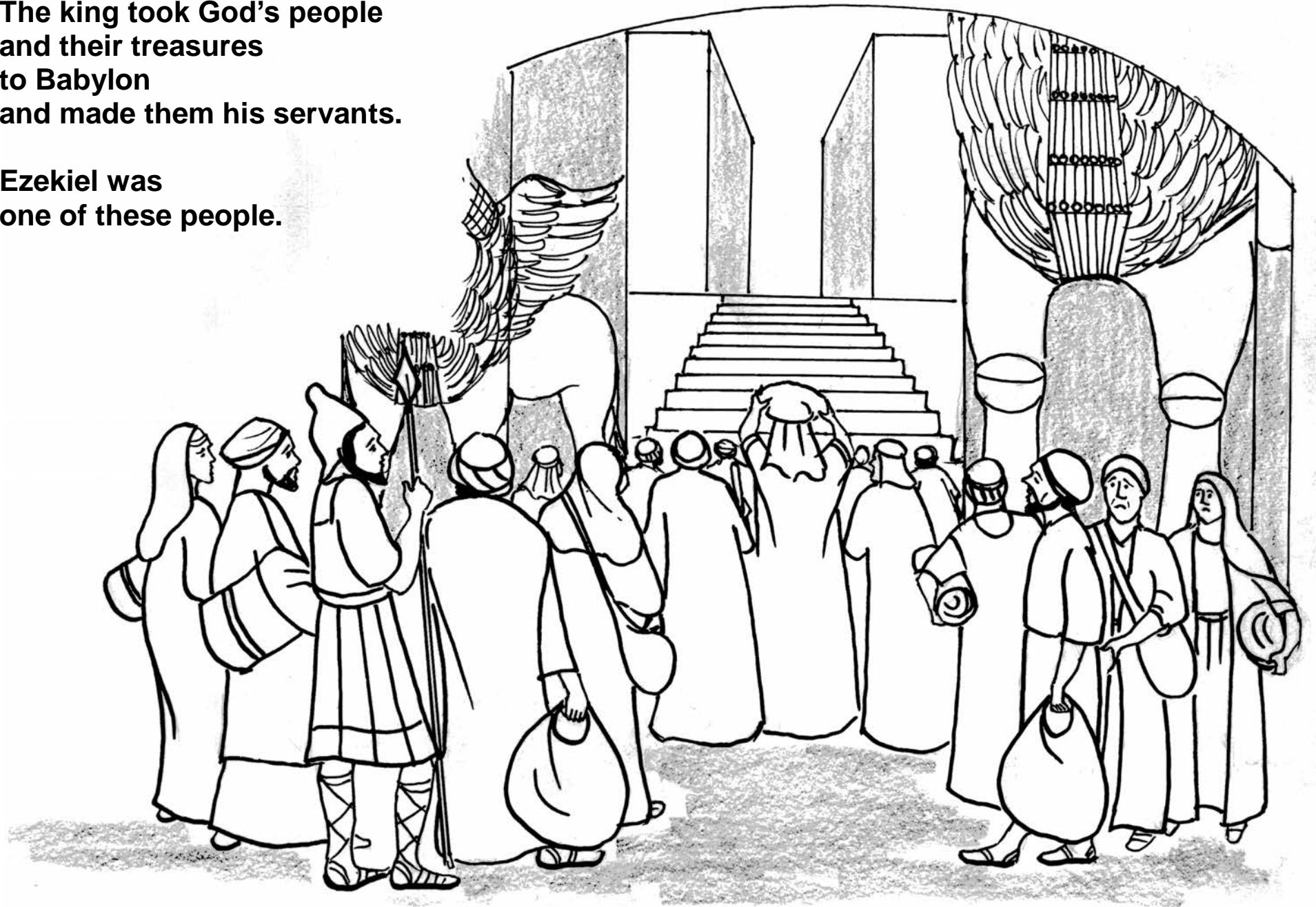
**After years of these warnings,

conquer the city of Jerusalem.**

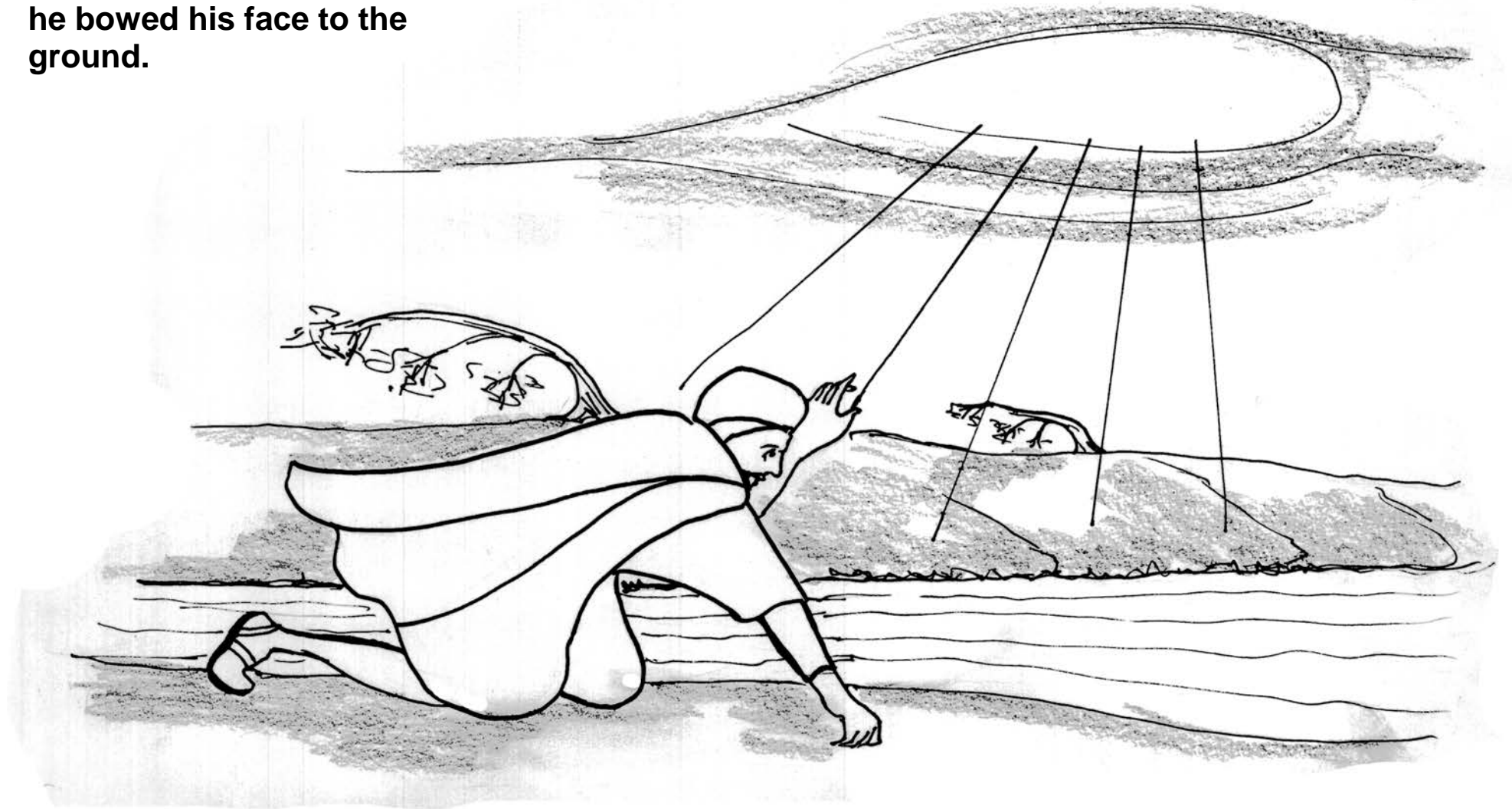


**The king took God's people

one of these people.**

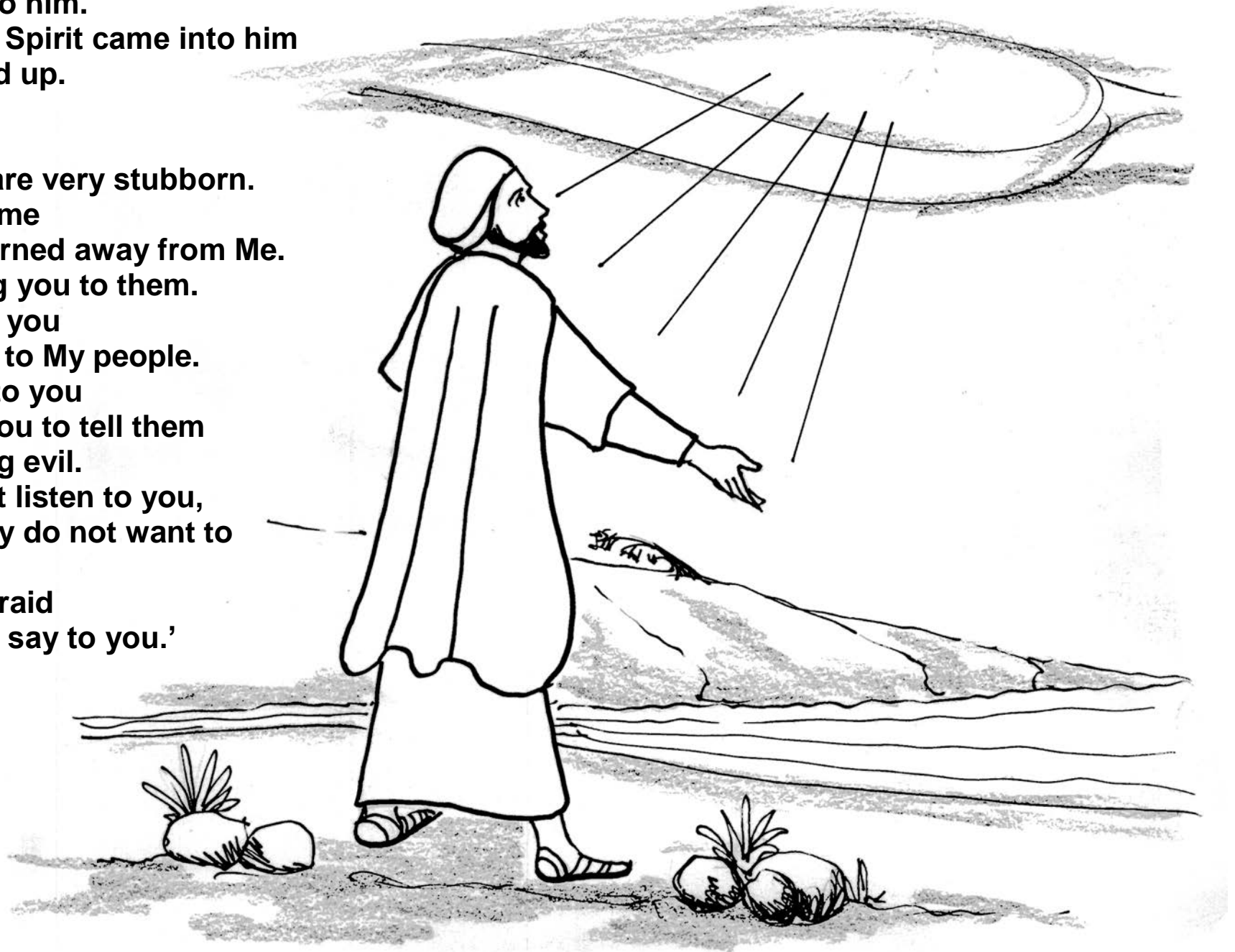


**In Babylon,

ground.**

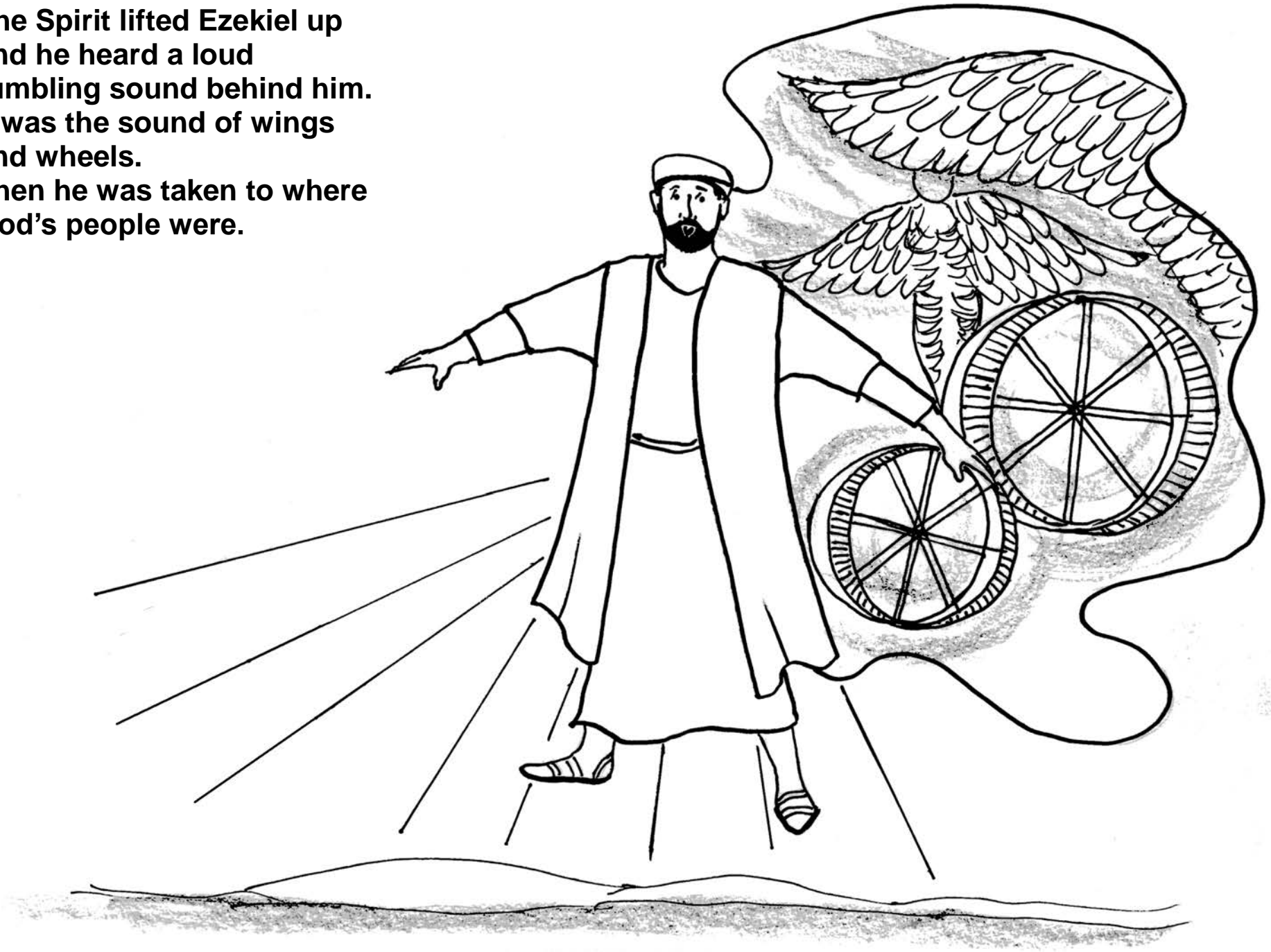


**God spoke to him.

God's people were.**



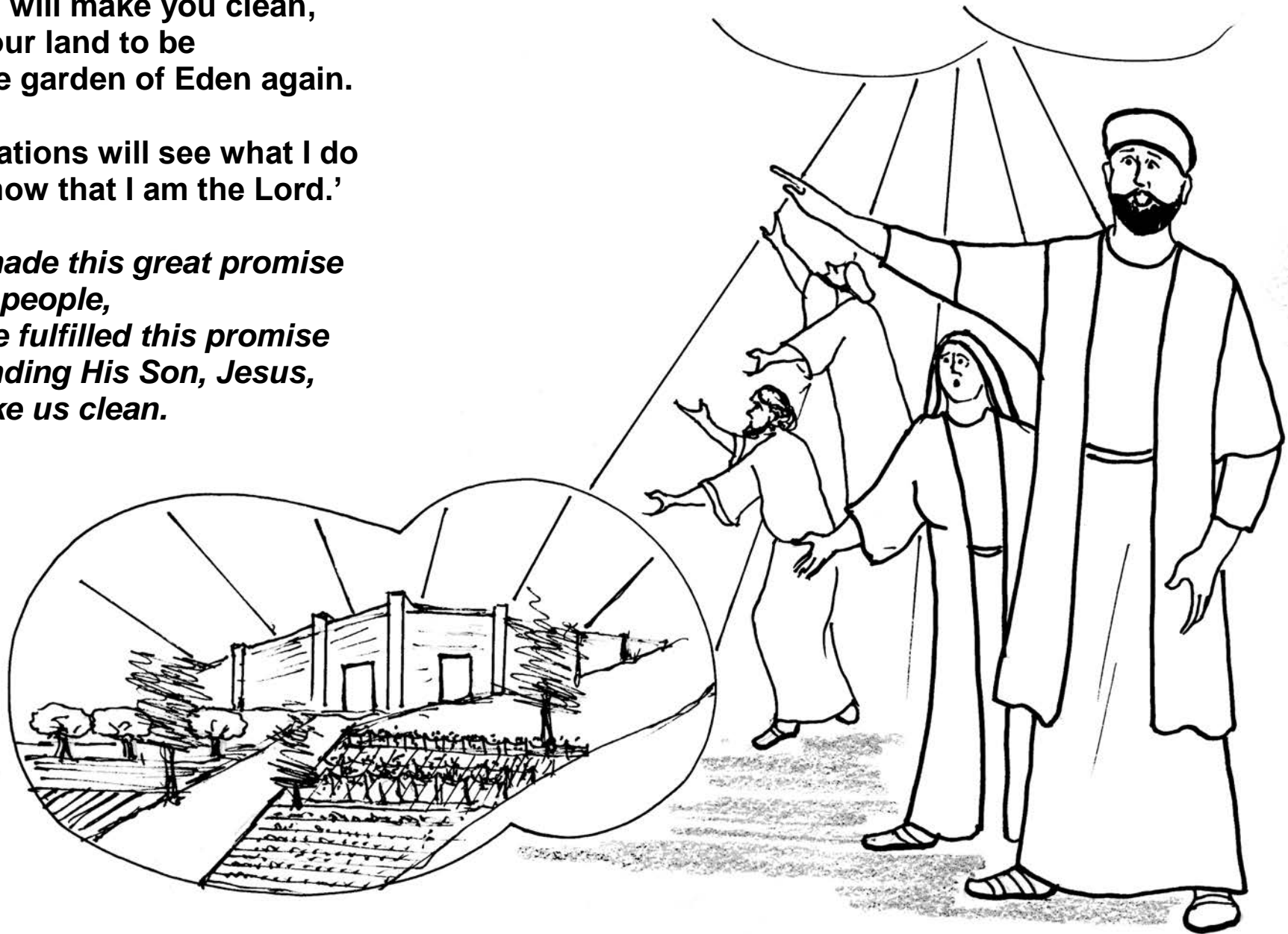
**God said to Ezekiel,

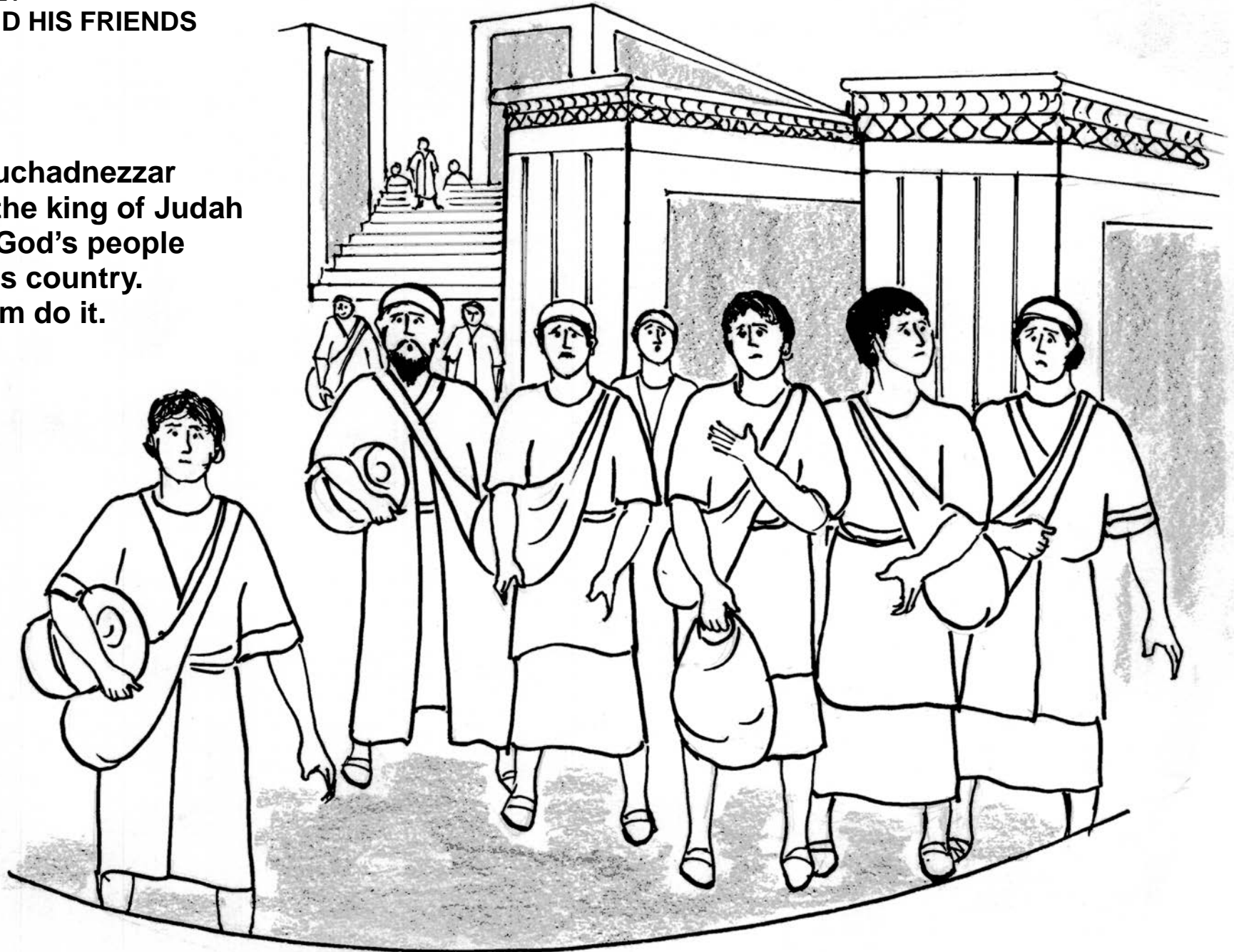

good looking and clever.**

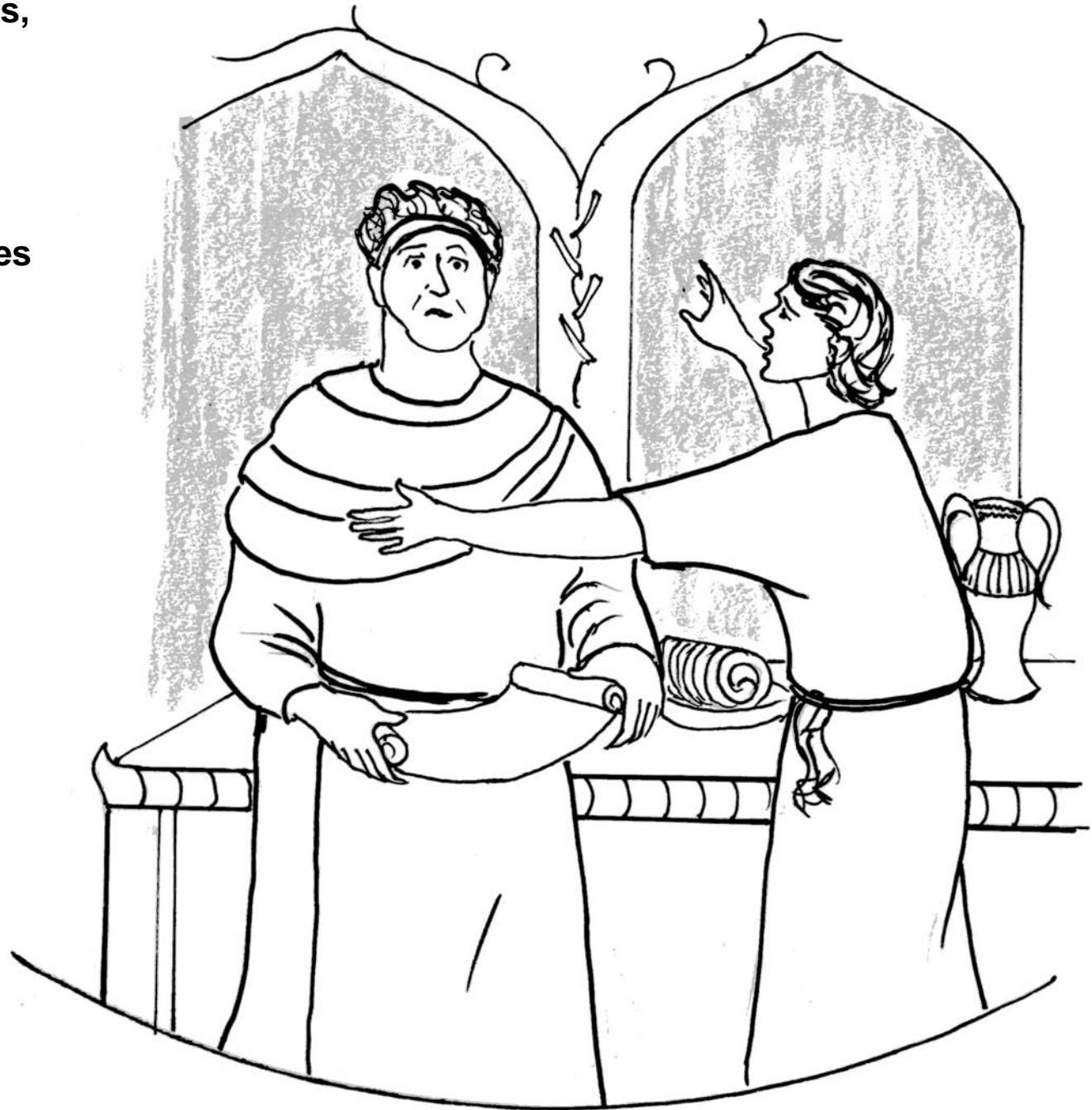
**'Teach them

of the king's servants.**

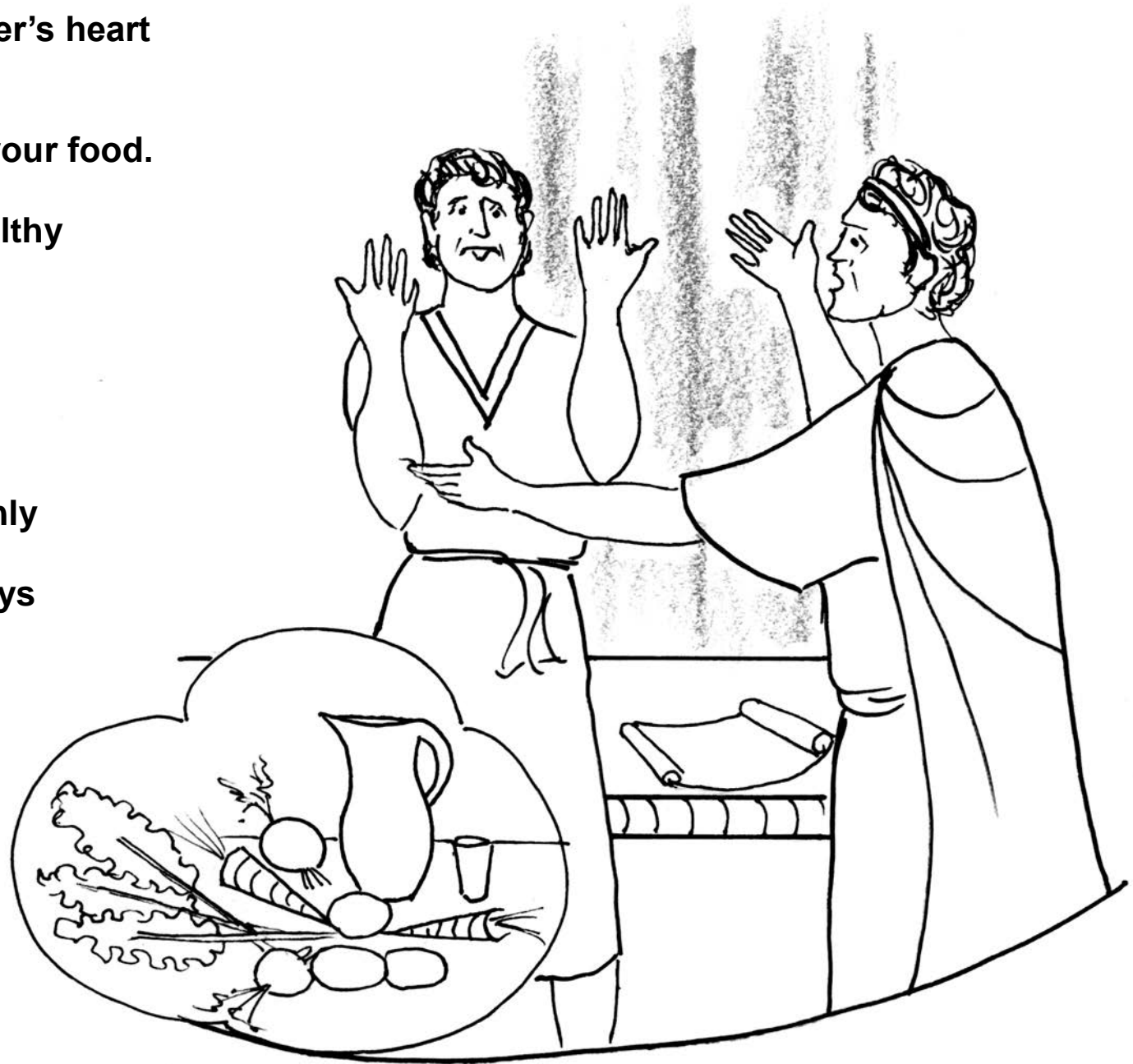
**They were given new names

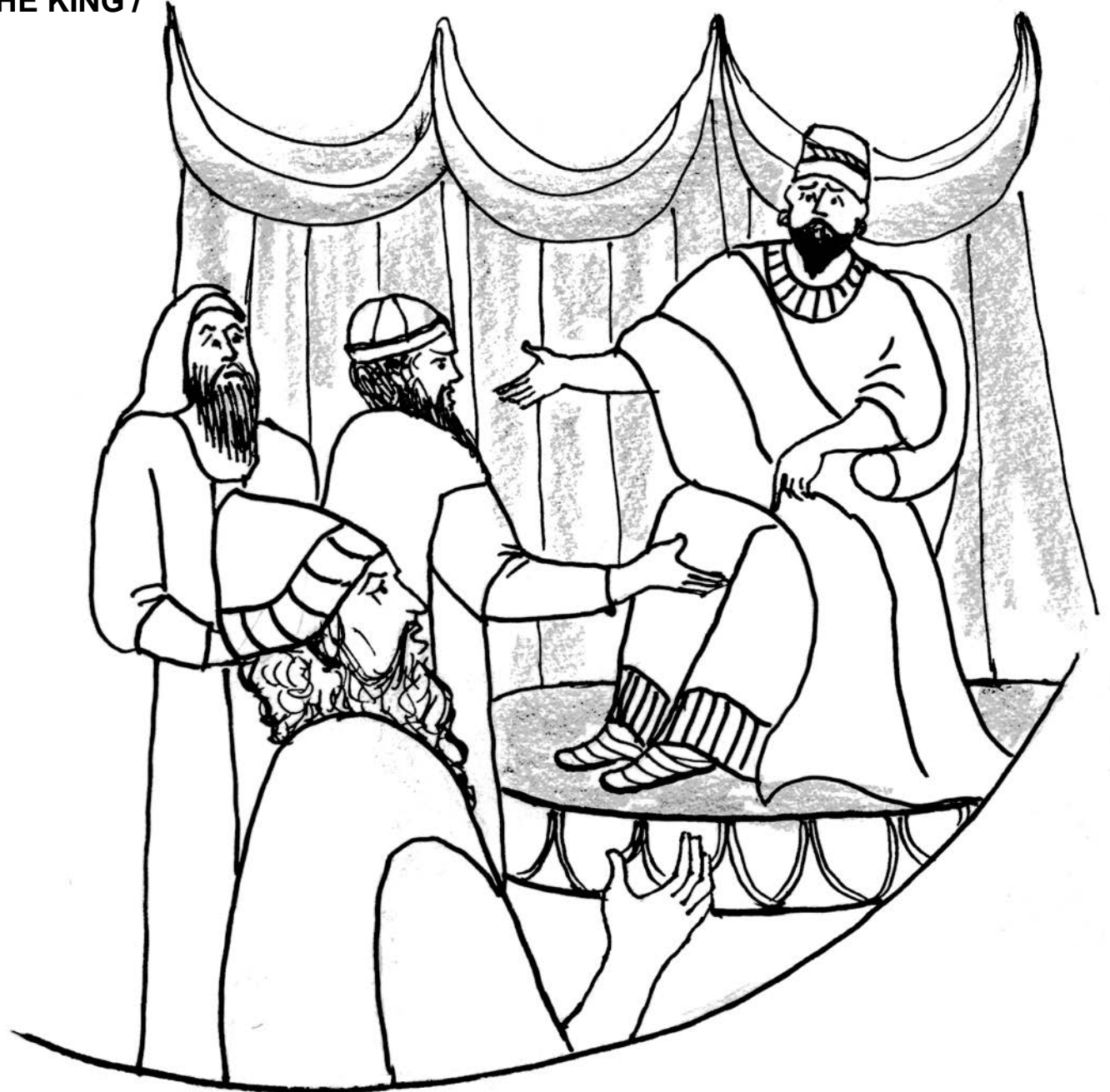
DANIEL 2:1–49

to get rid of all the wise men.

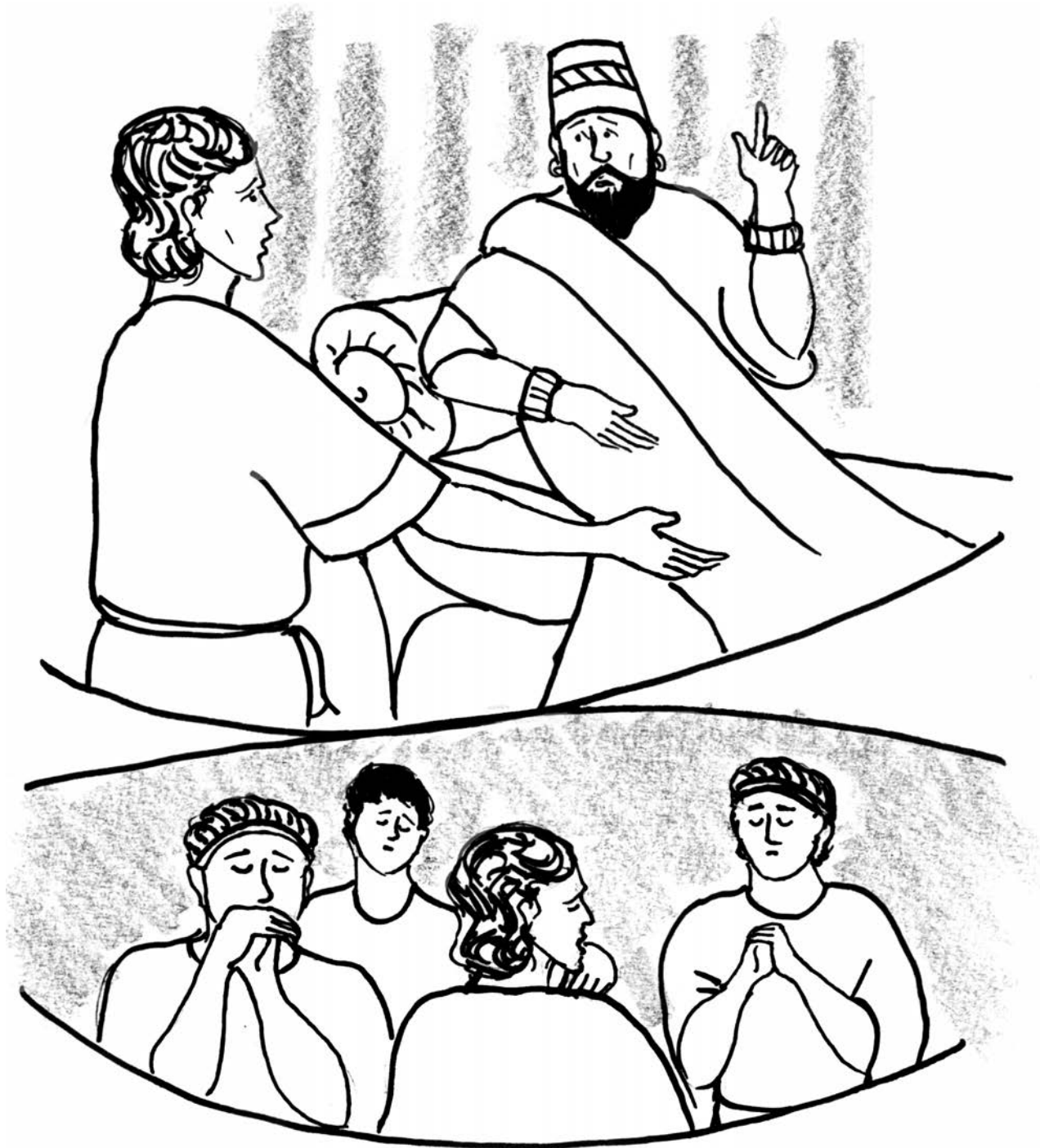
They came to get Daniel

and its meaning.'

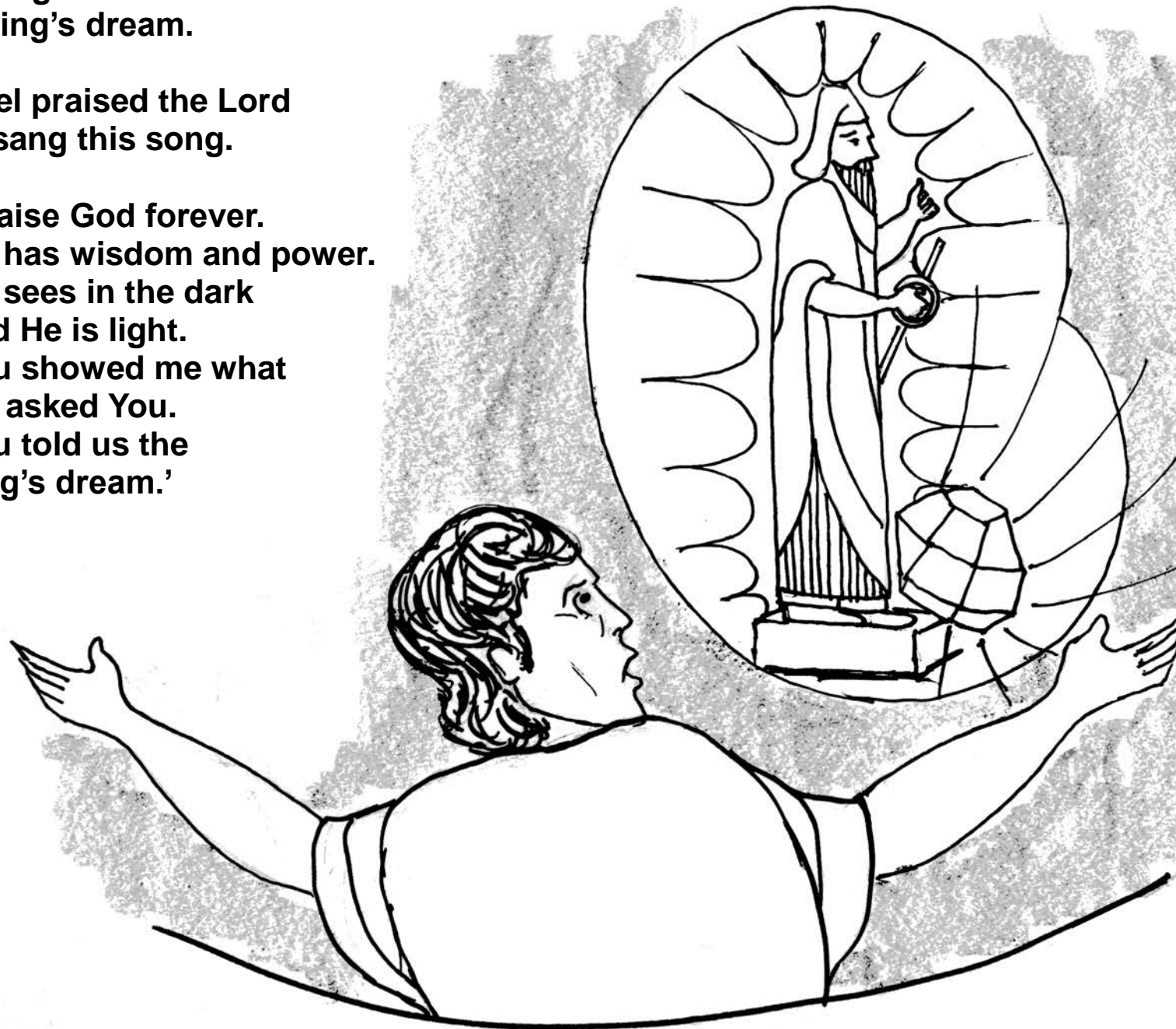
Then Daniel asked

and sang this song.**

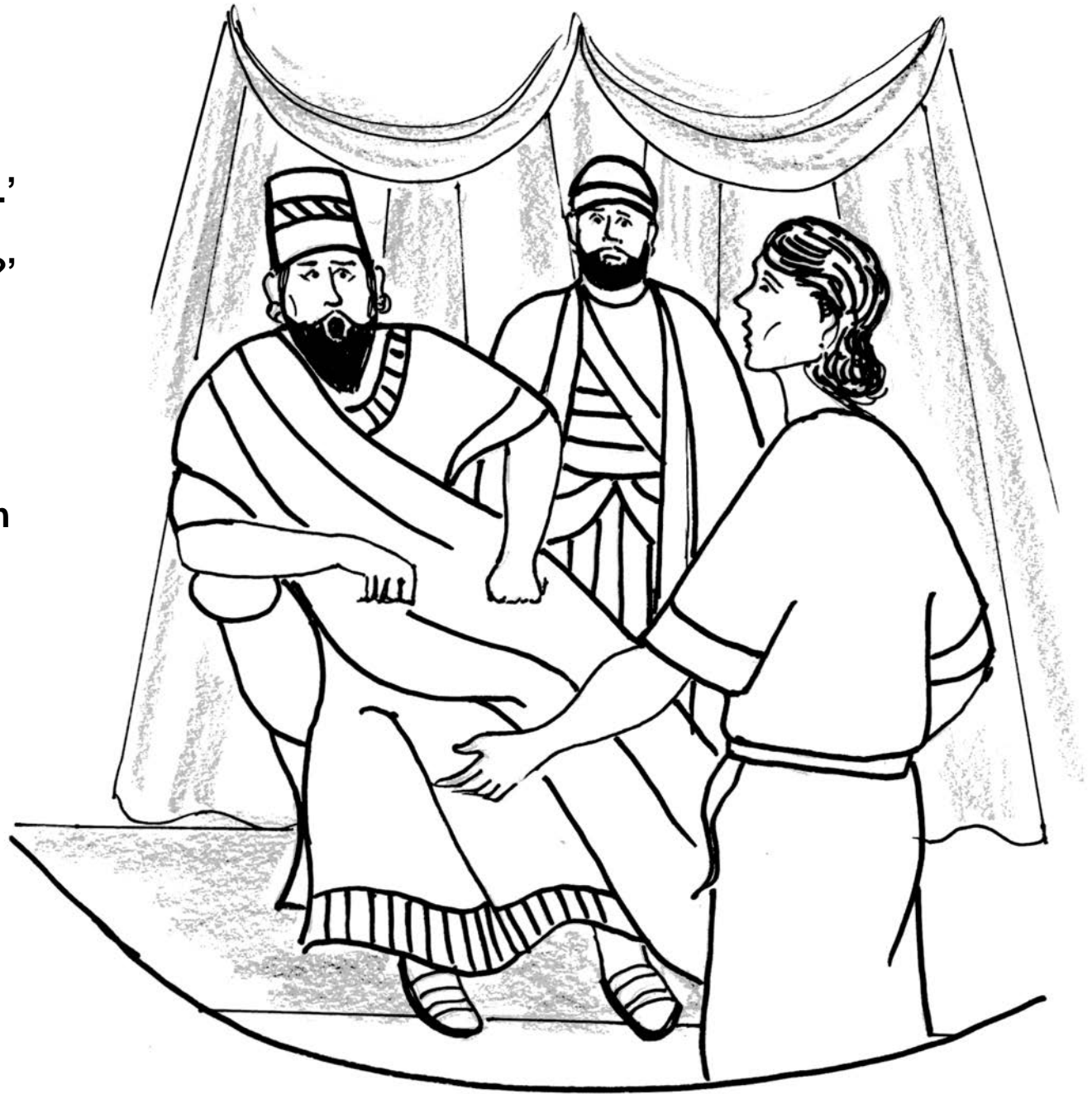
**'Praise God forever.

and I will tell him his dream.'**

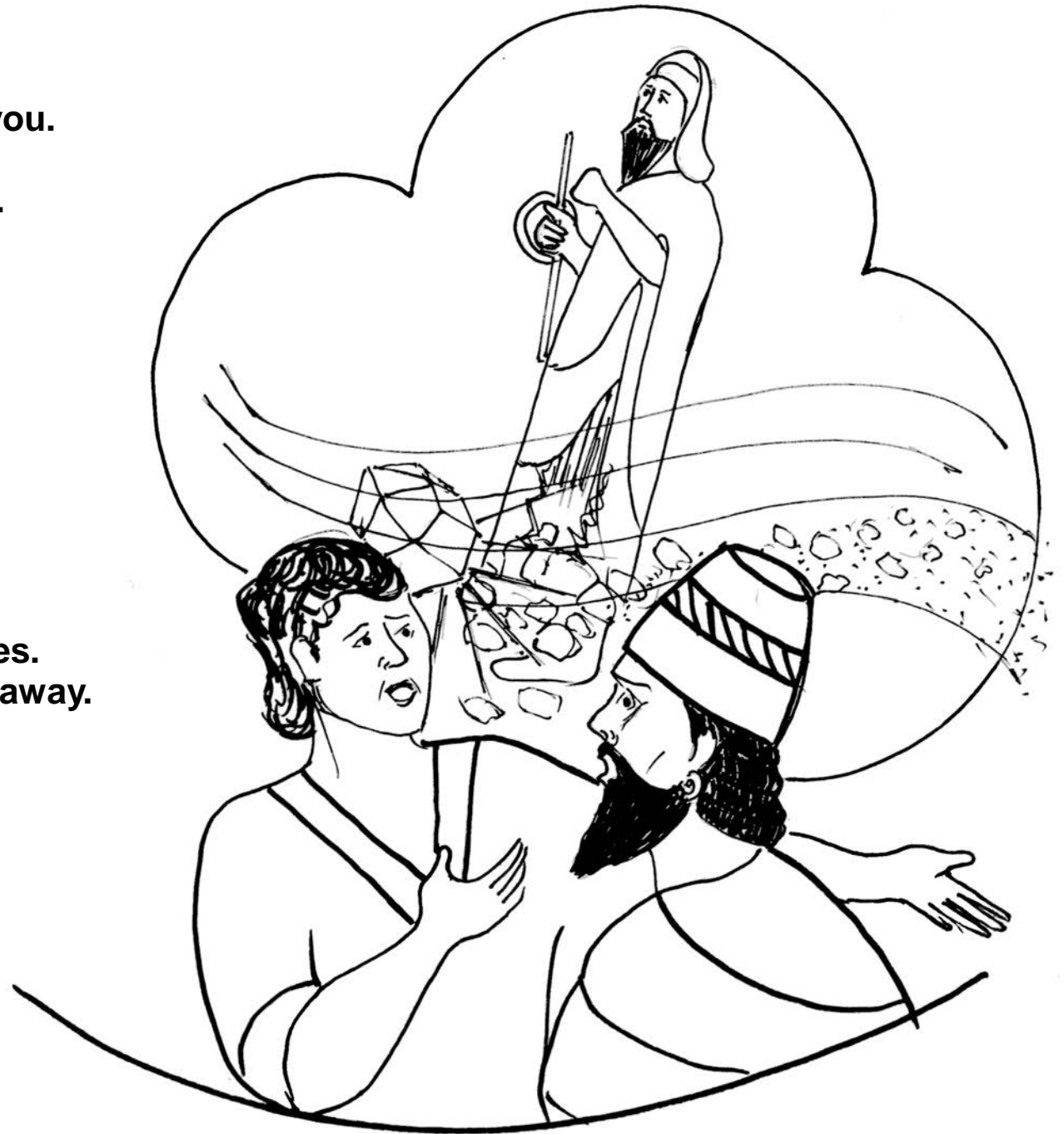
**'Can you tell me my dream?'

who knows all things.'**

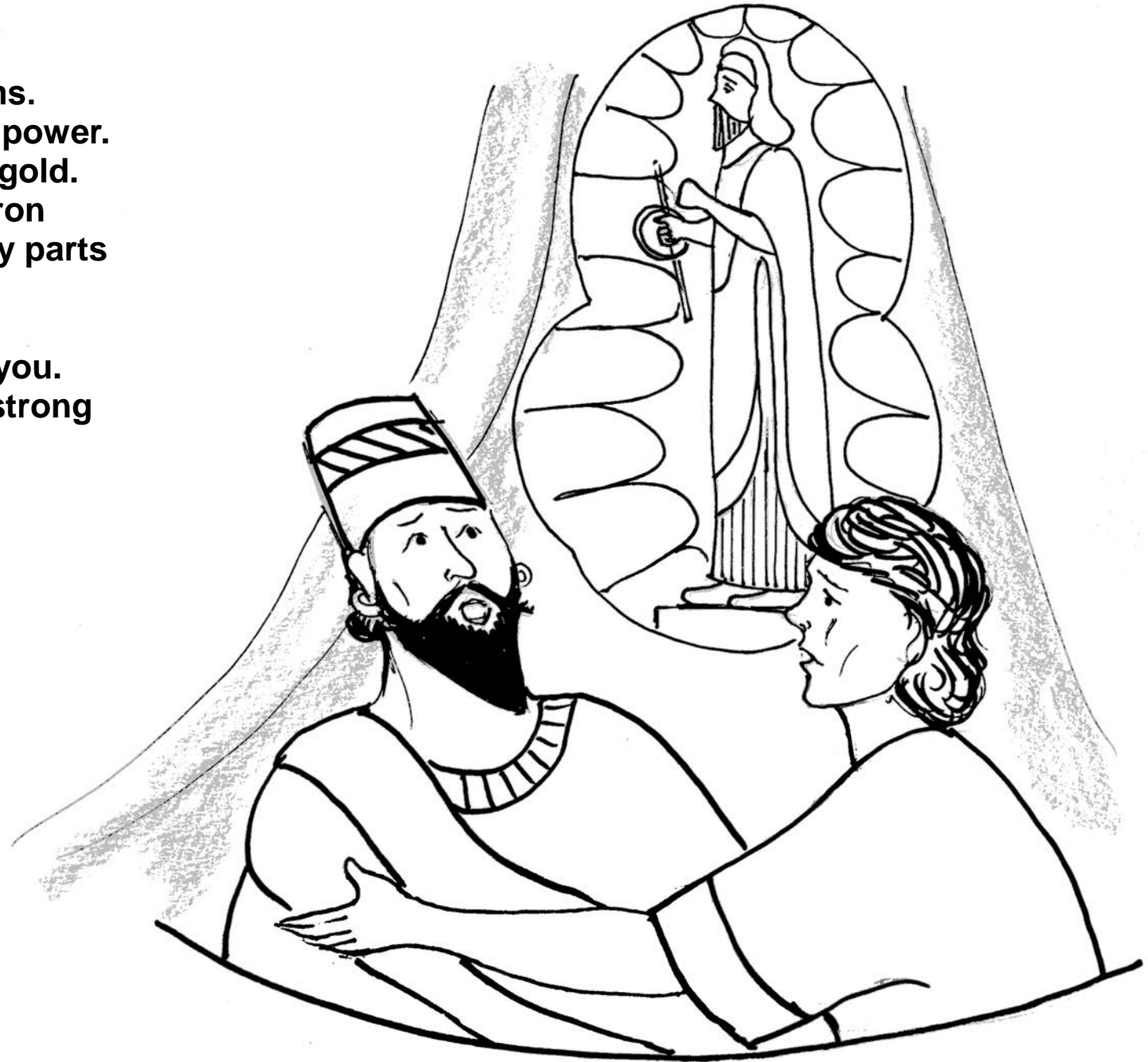


**'My king, in your dream

That was your dream.'**



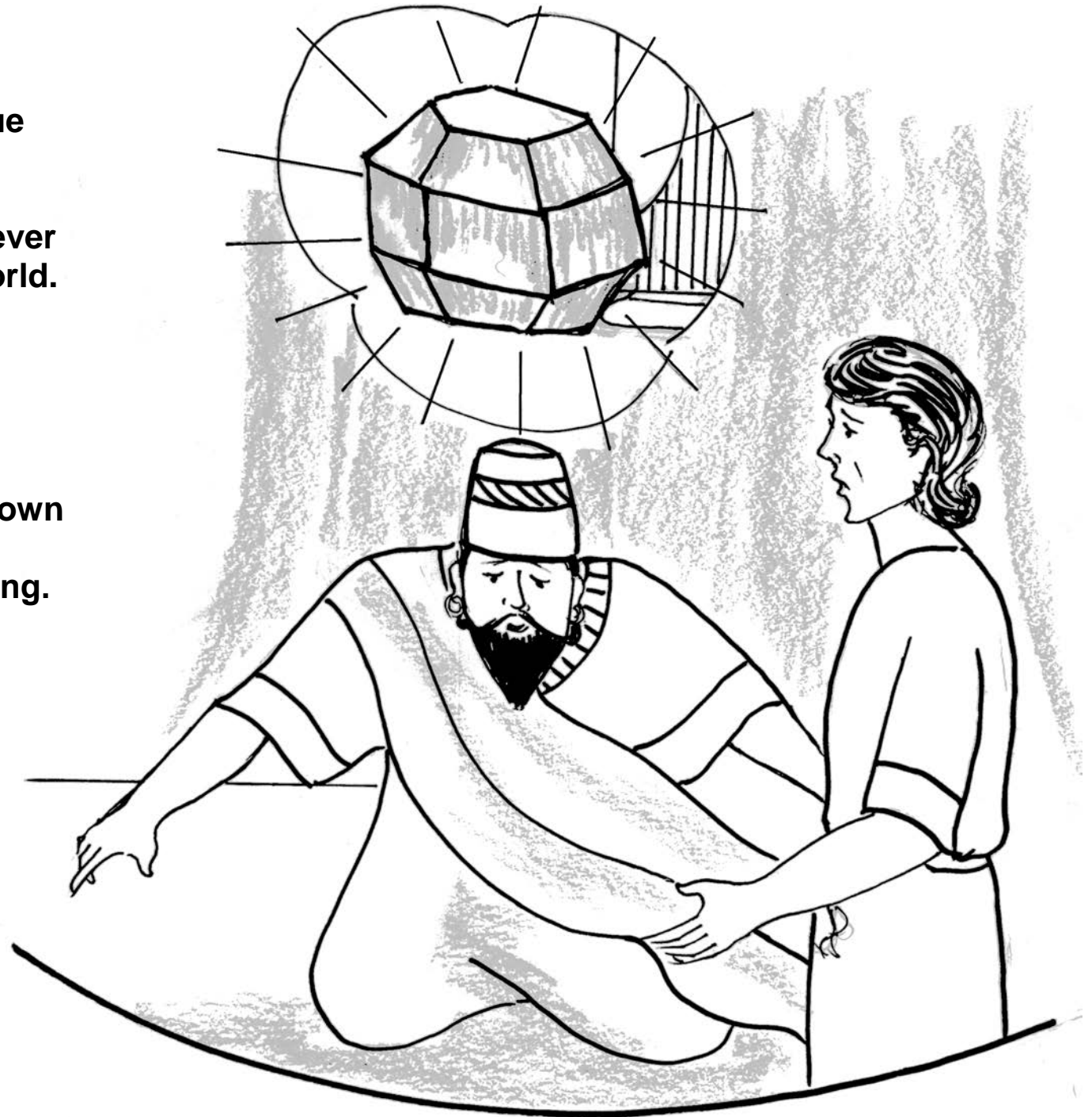
**'This is what it means.

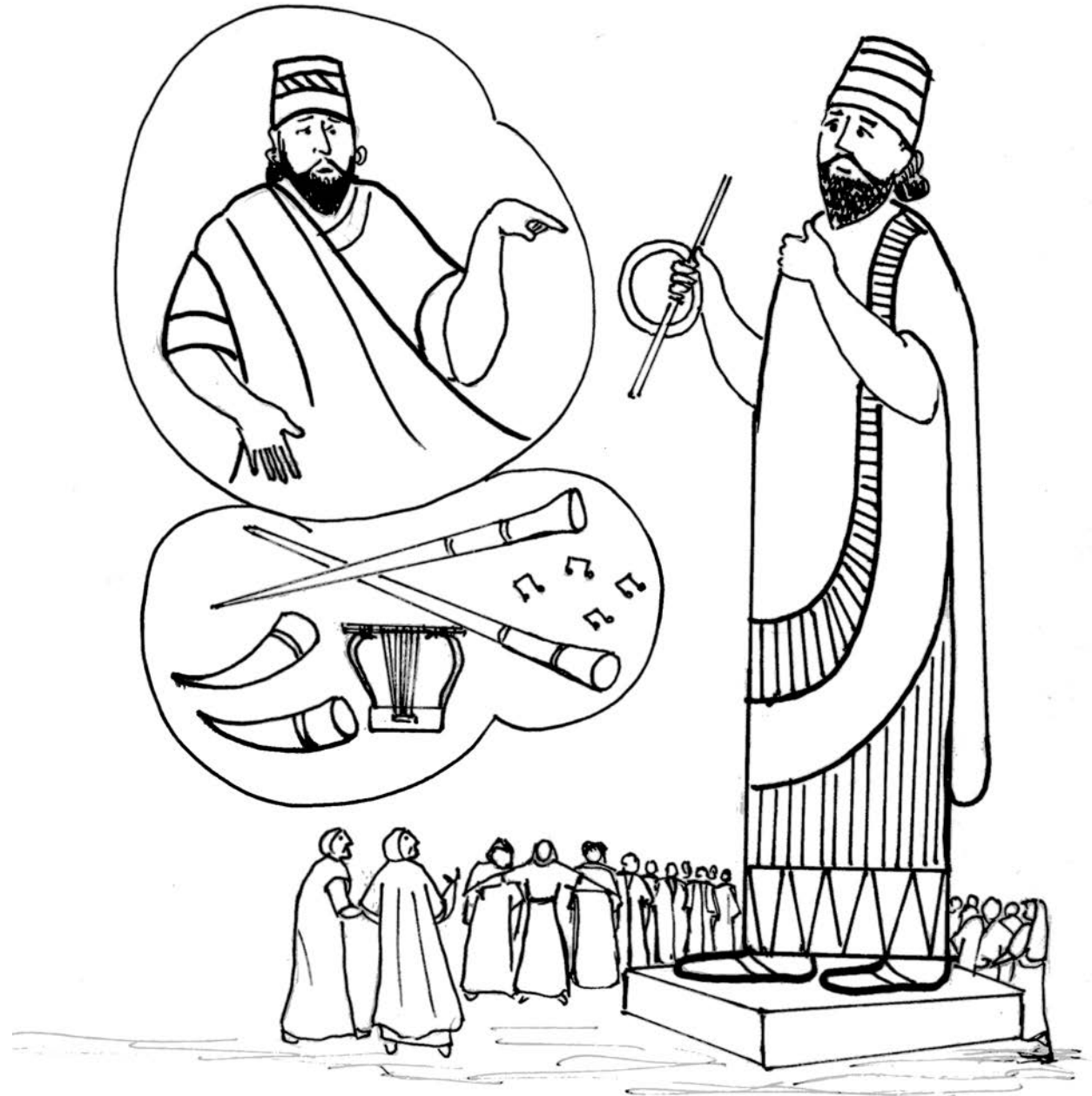

DANIEL'S FRIENDS IN THE BURNING FURNACE

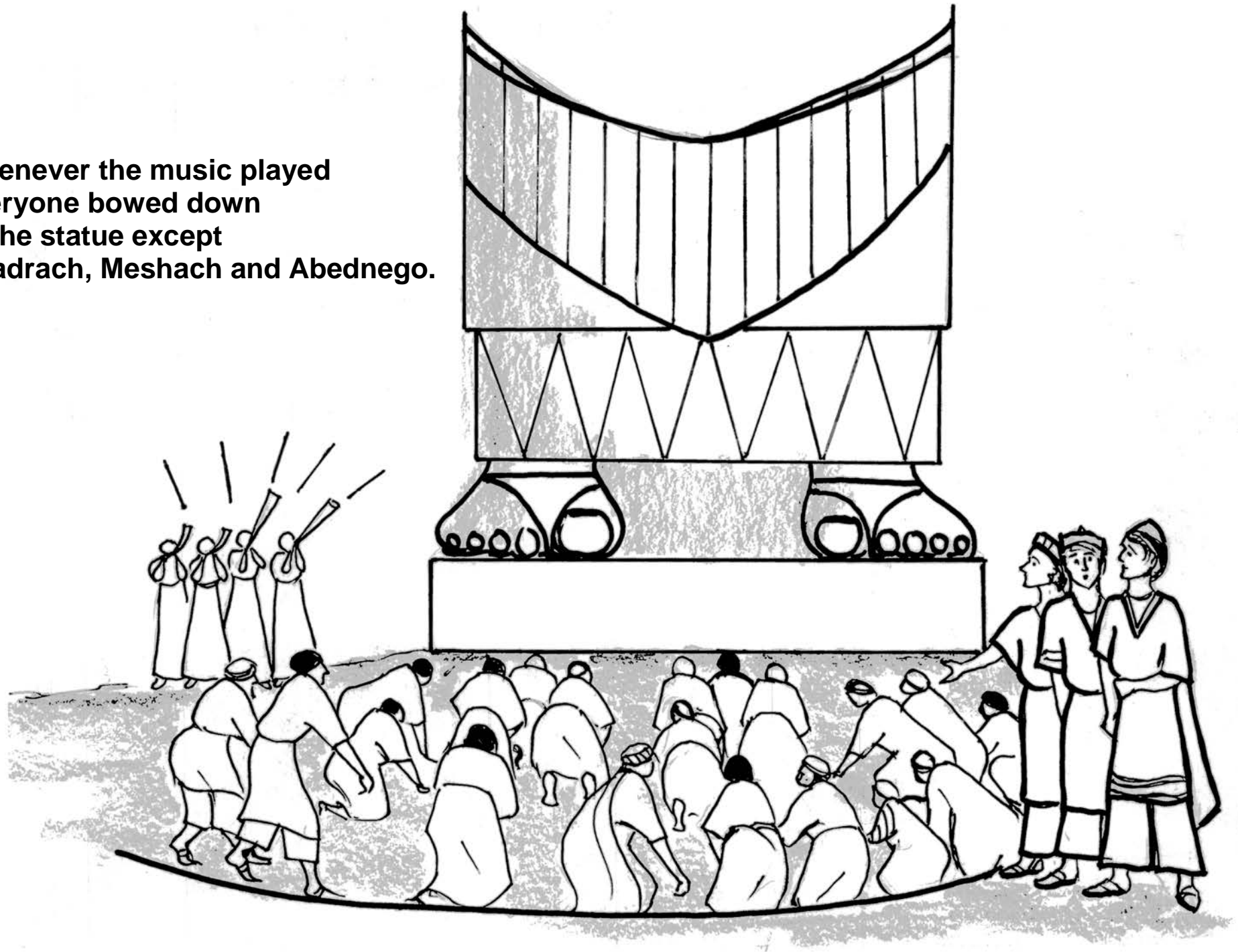

or my gold statue?'**

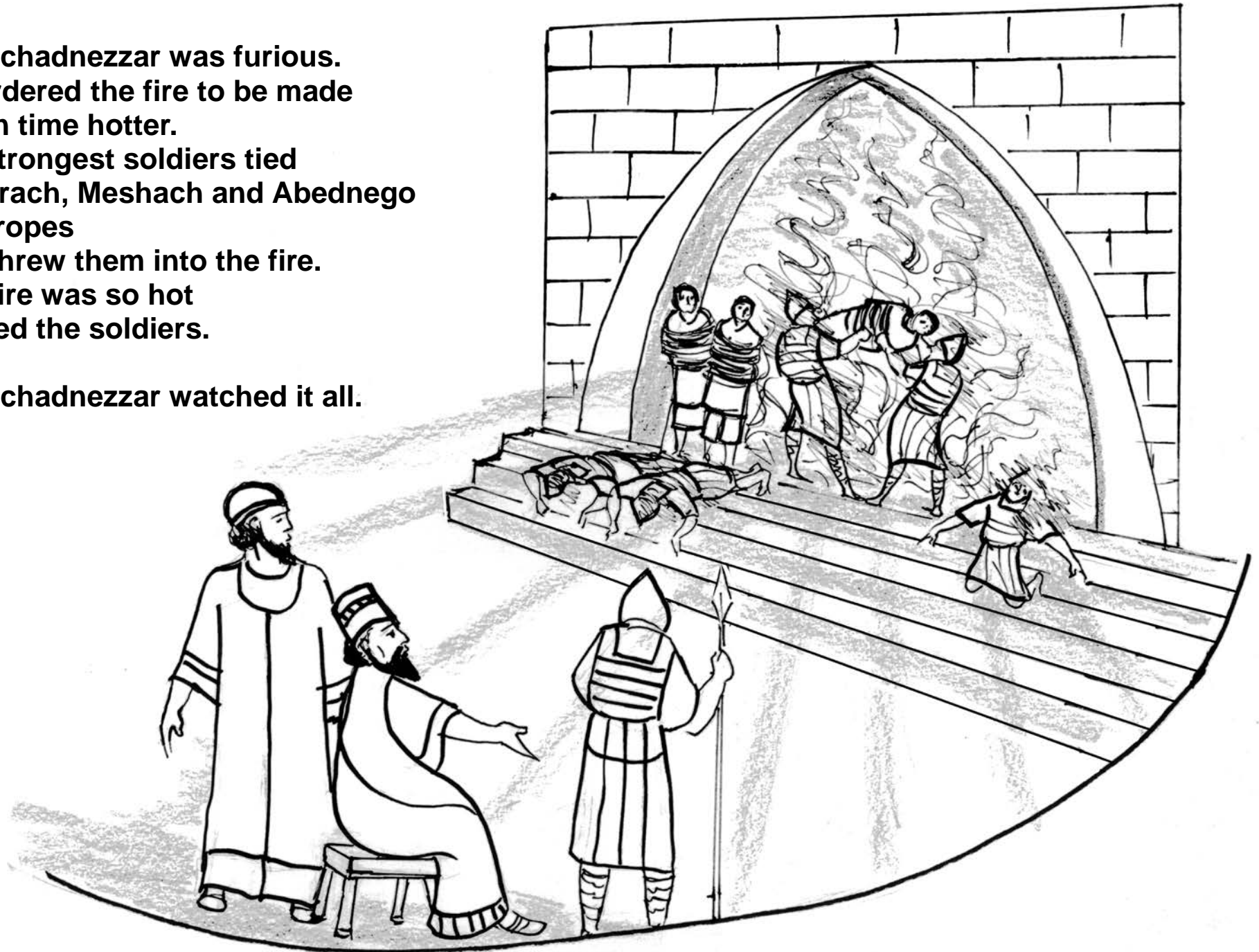
**'If you do not worship it

your golden statue.'**



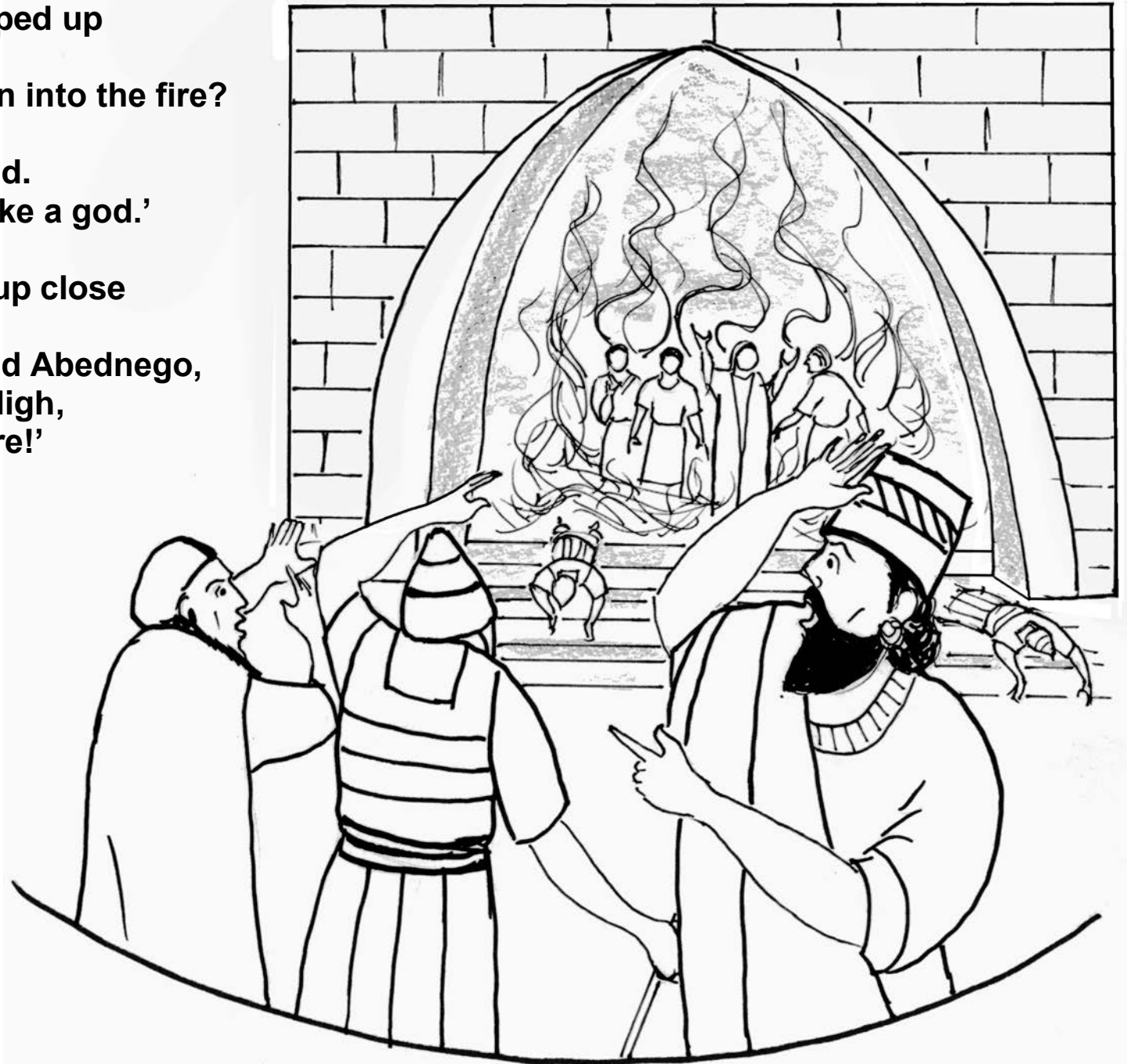
**Nebuchadnezzar was furious.

The fourth man looks like a god.'**

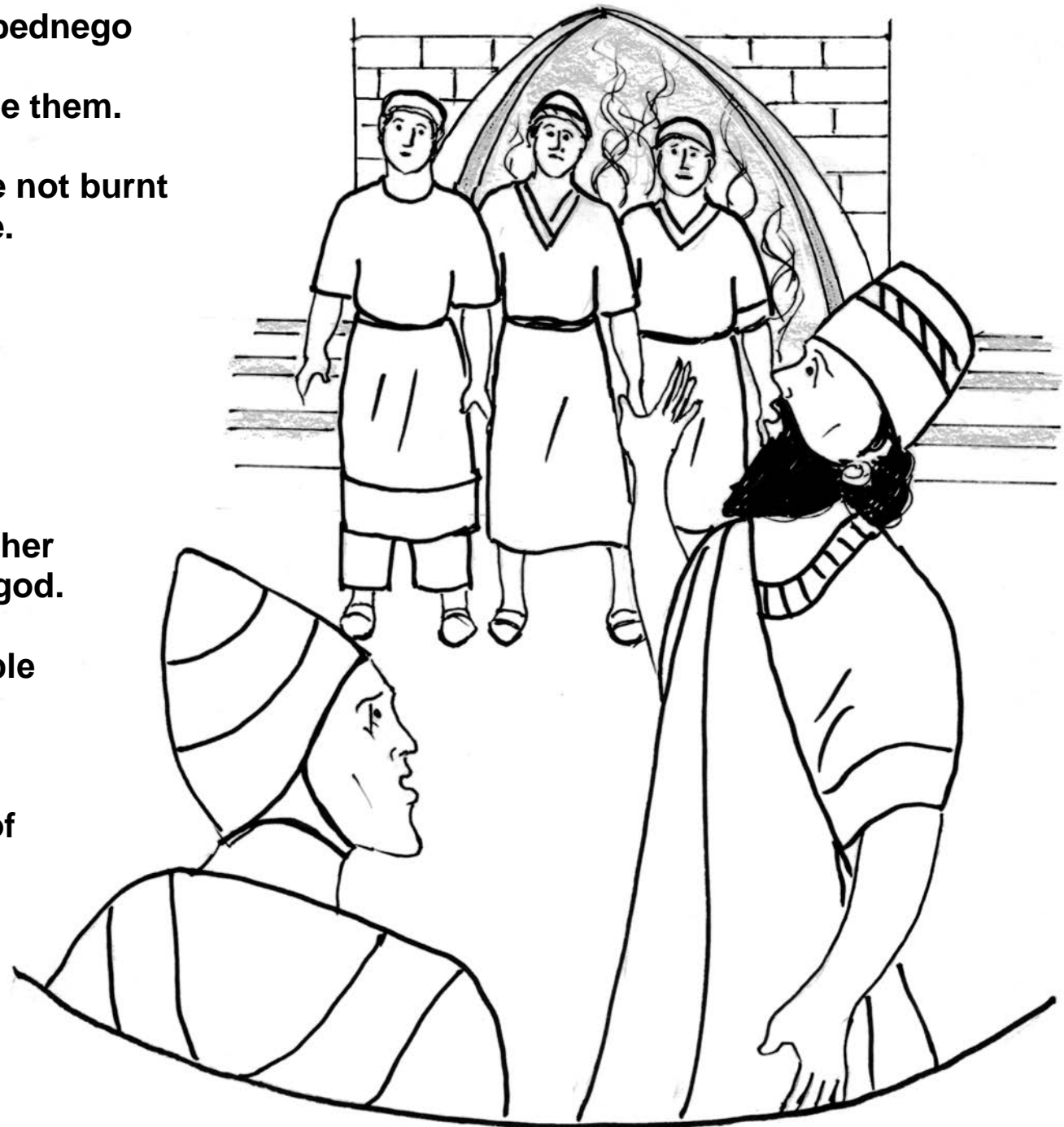
**Nebuchadnezzar went up close

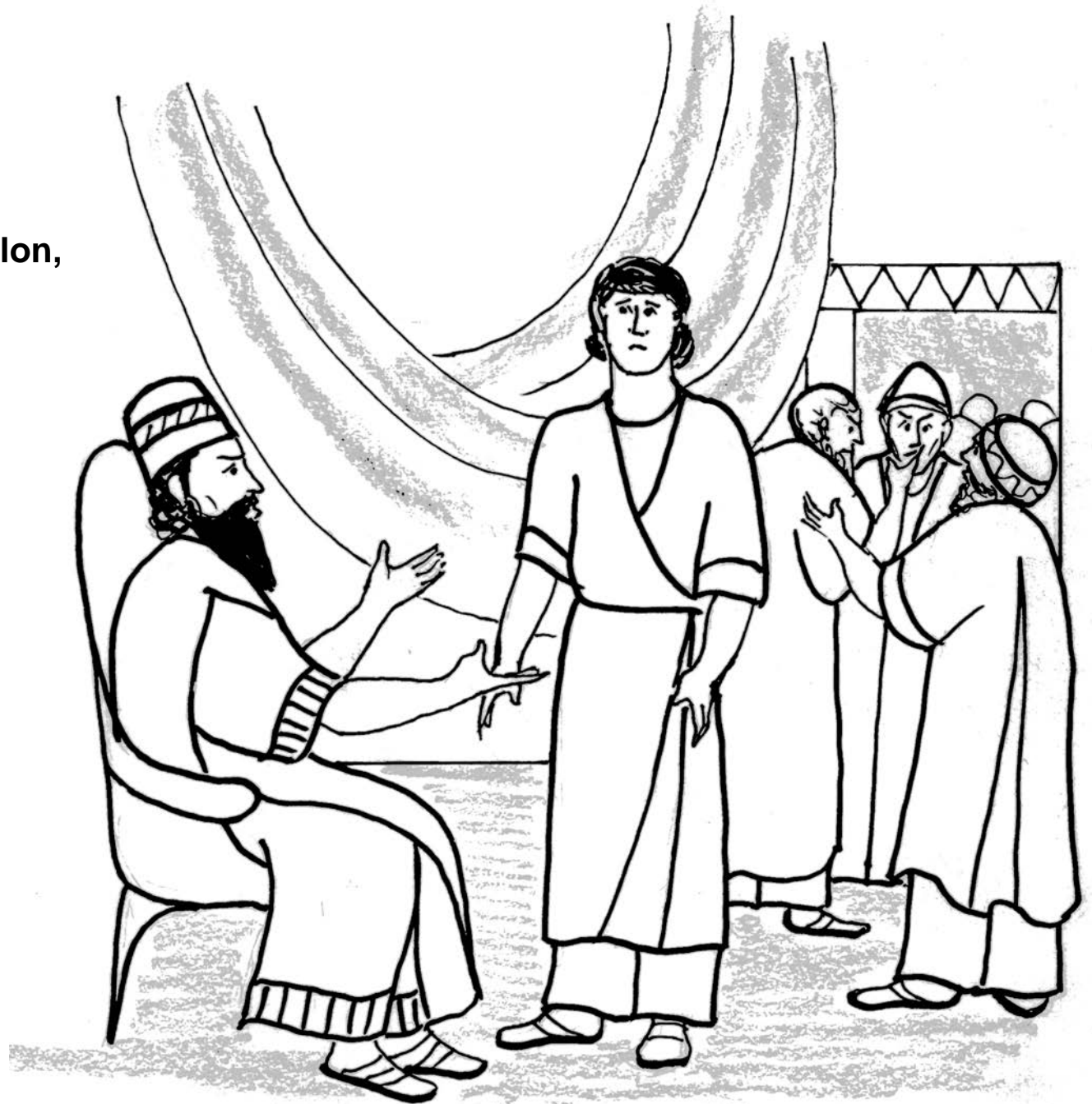
DANIEL 4:1-37

from anywhere on earth.**

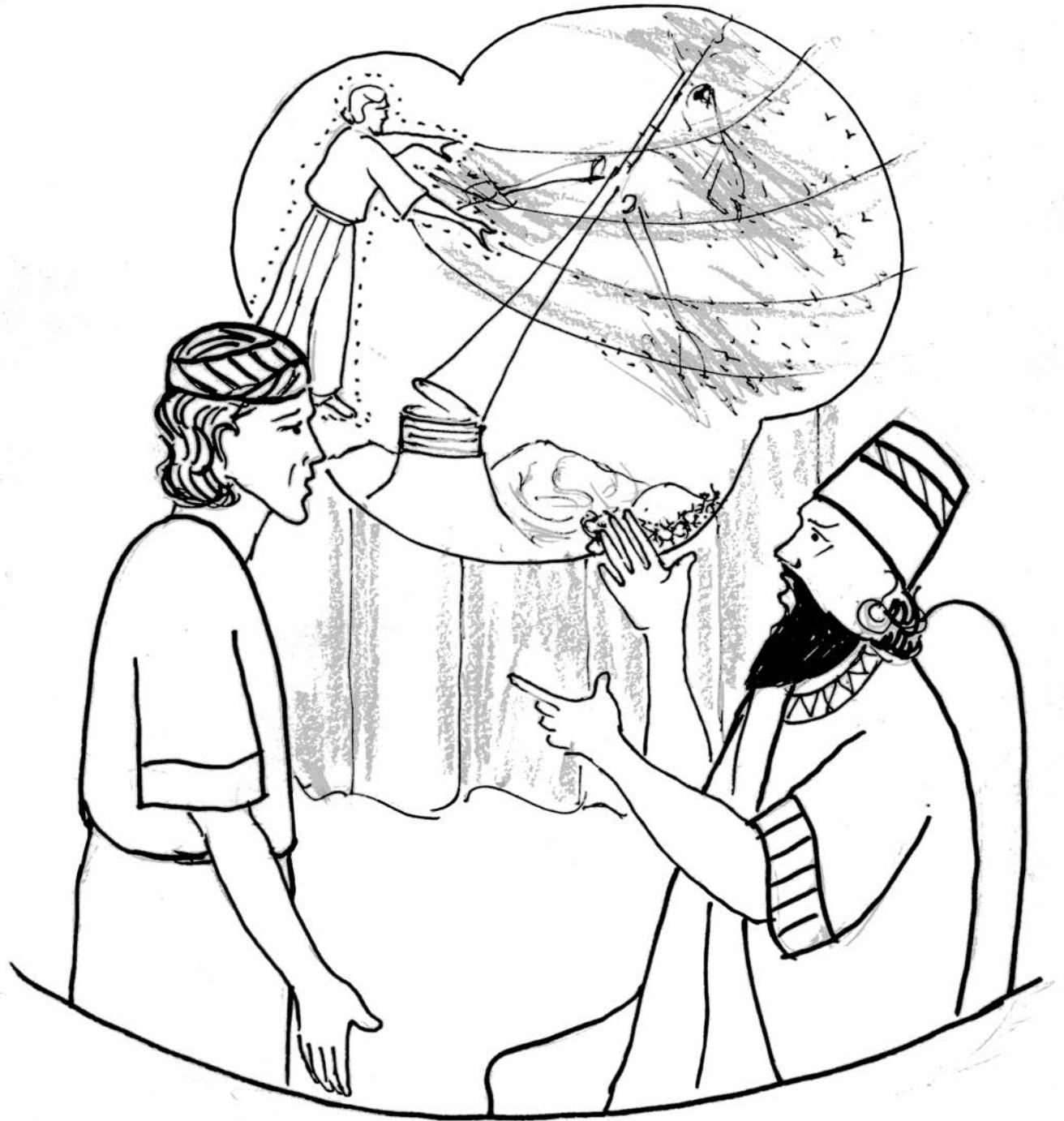
**'It looked beautiful

all the earth.'**

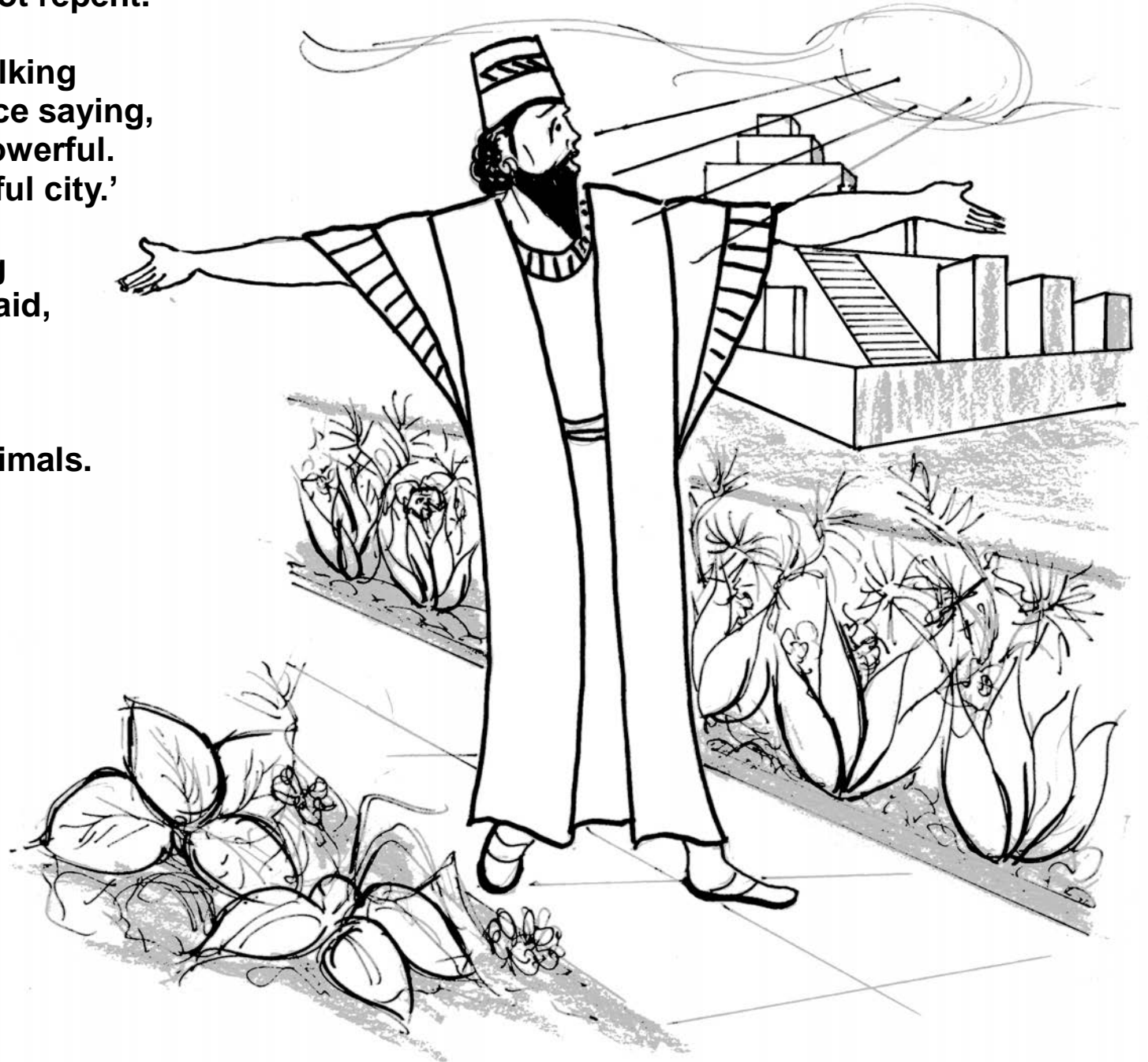
**'Stop sinning.

over all the earth.'**

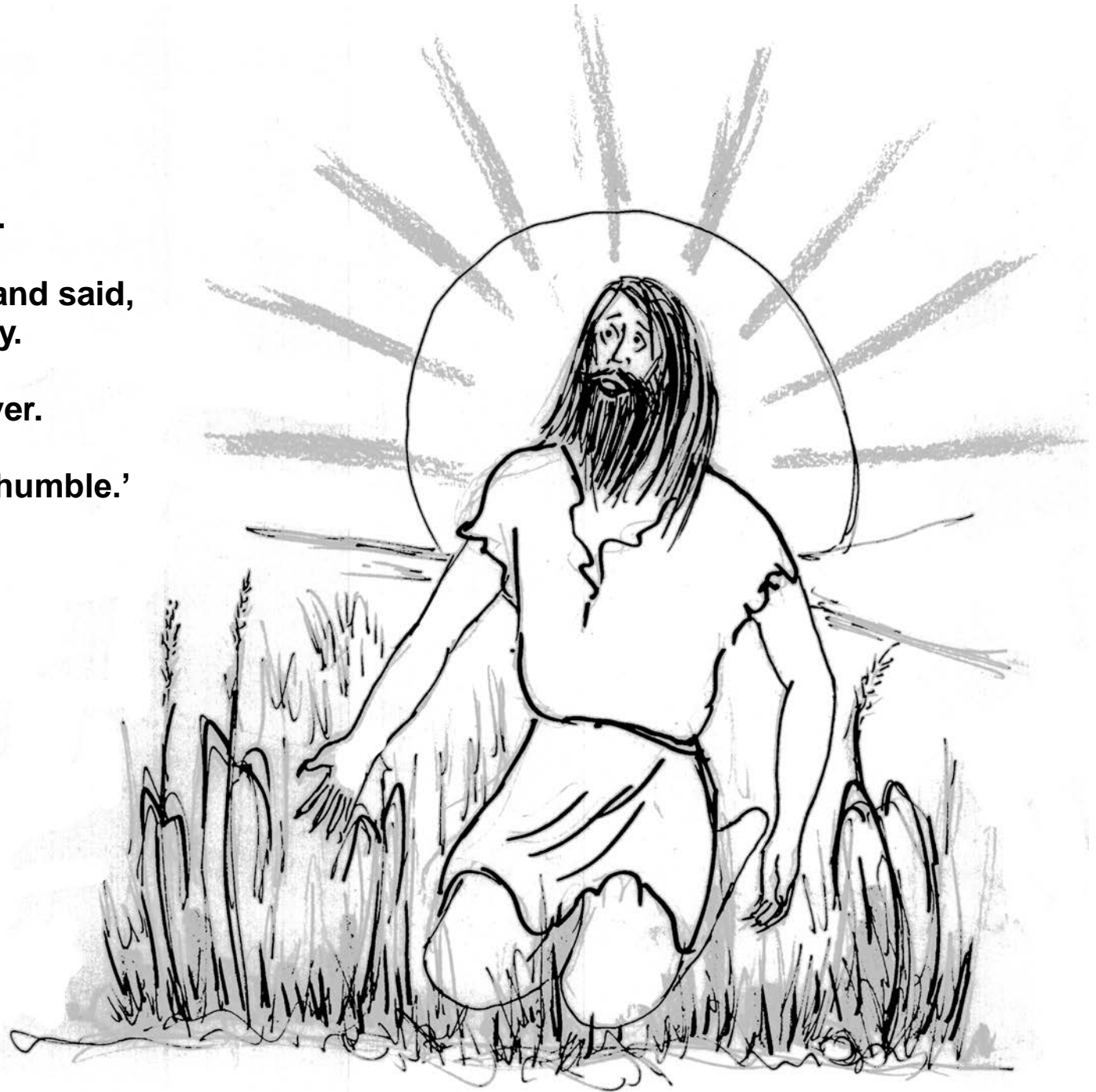


**Immediately something happened

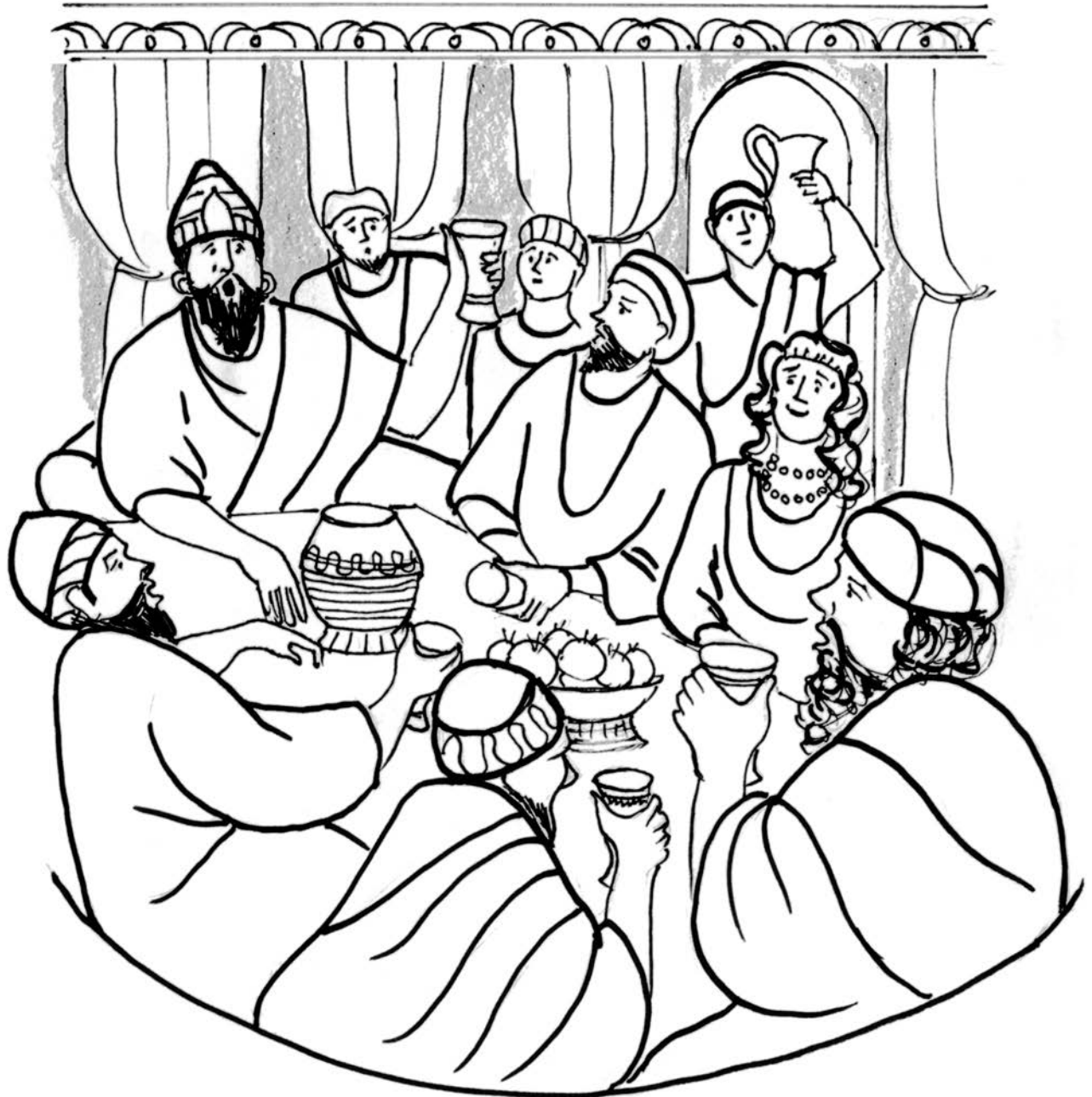

in Jerusalem.



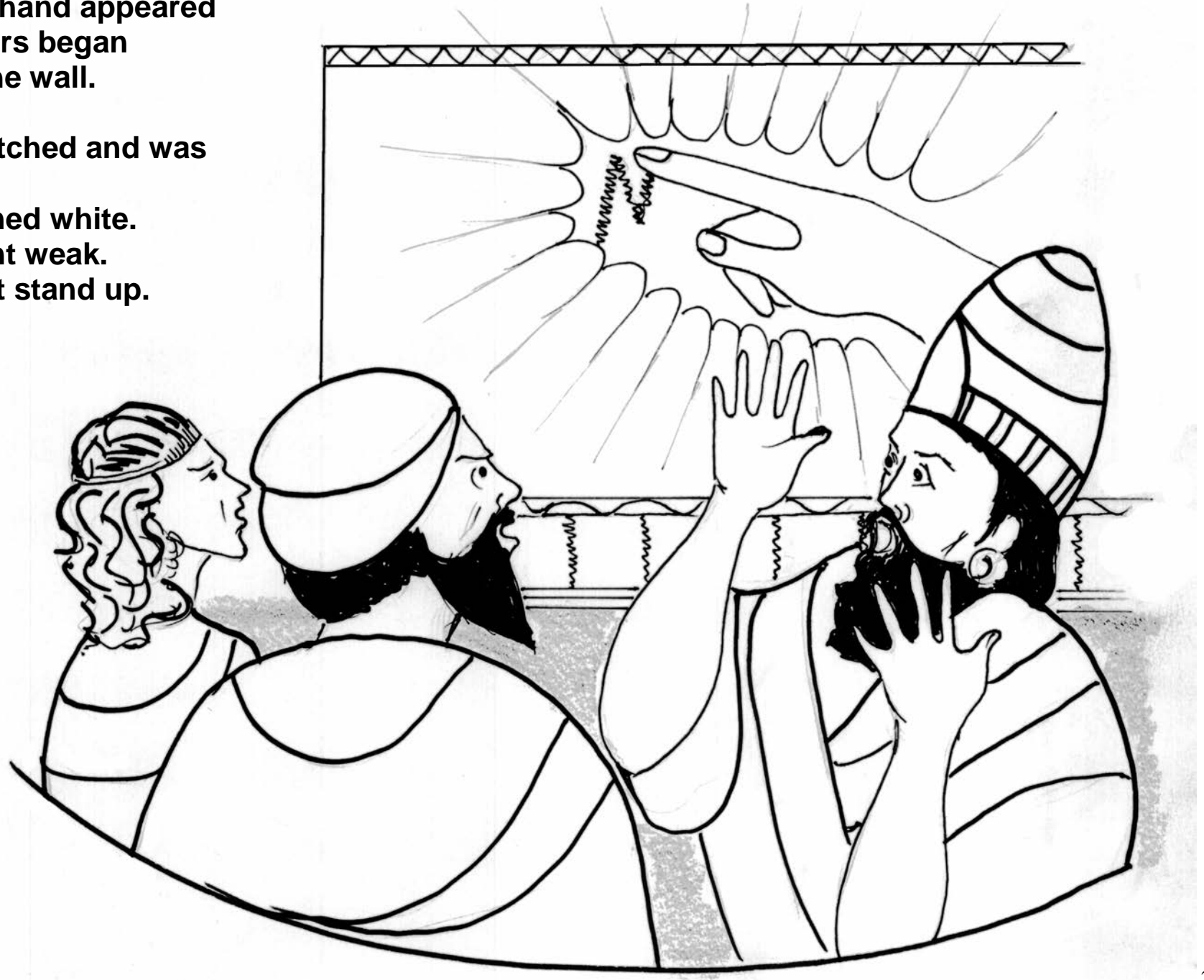
**Suddenly, a hand appeared

in my kingdom.'**

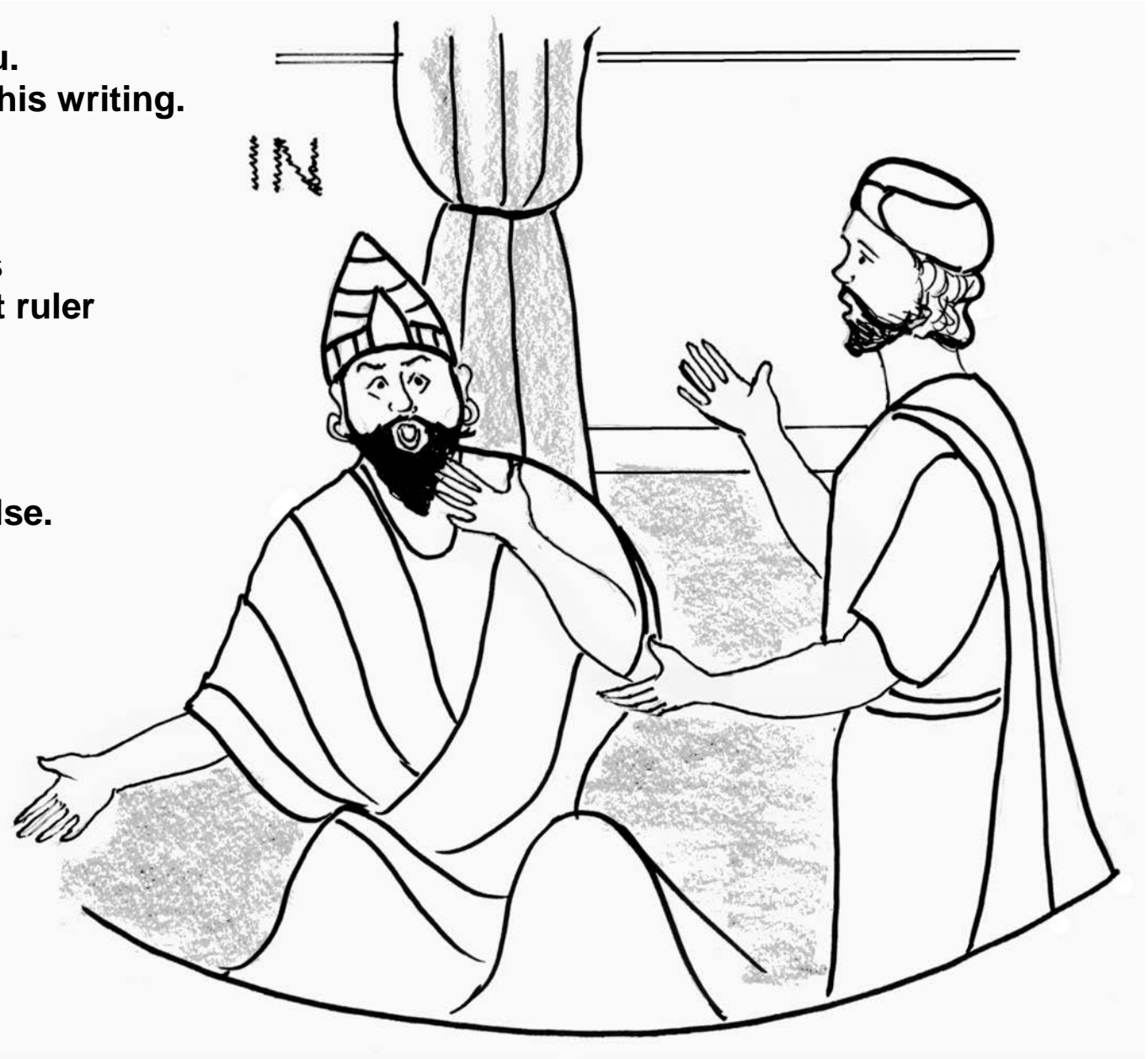
**The wise men looked at the writing.

to write on the wall.**



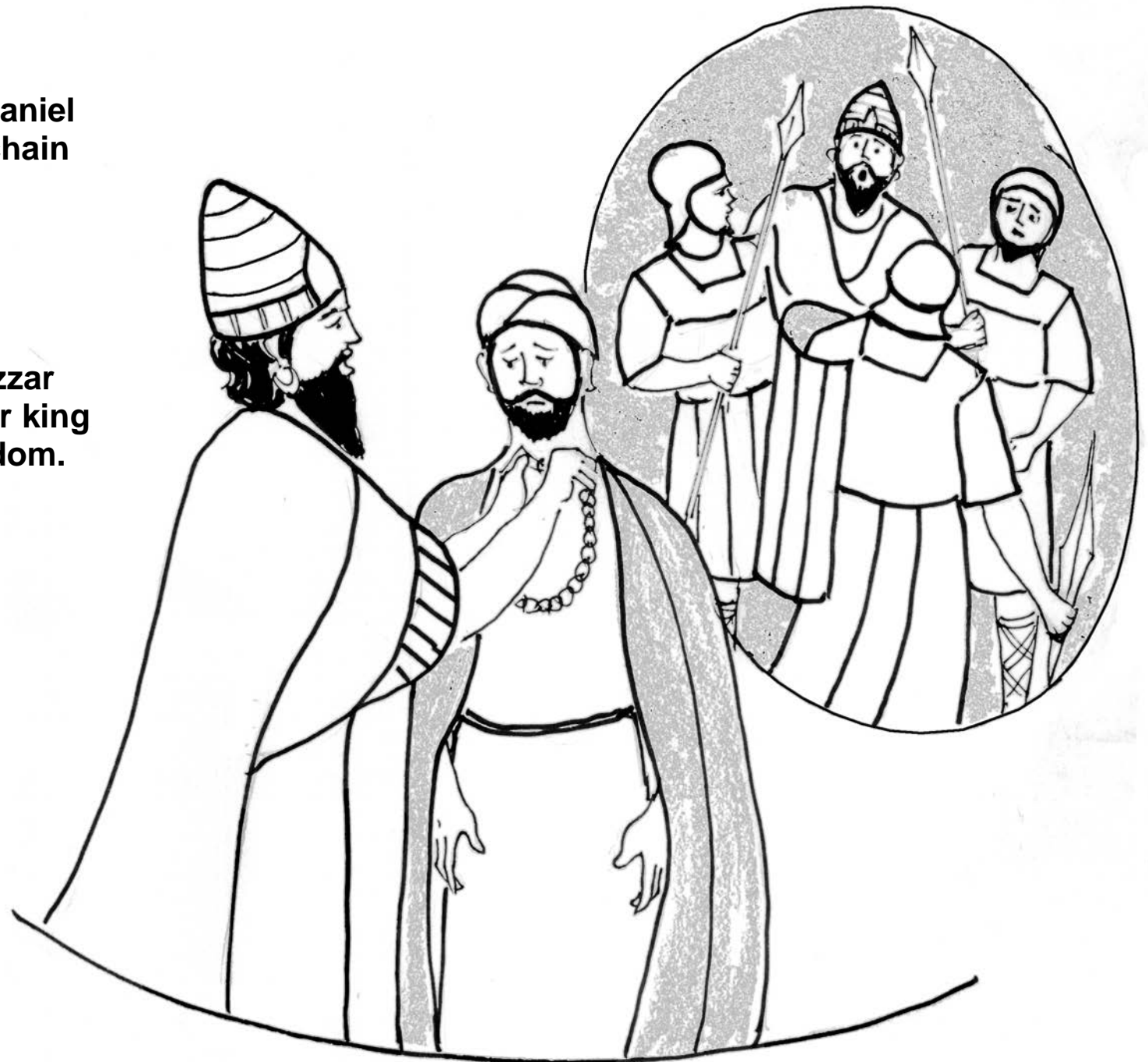
**‘The words you see, are:

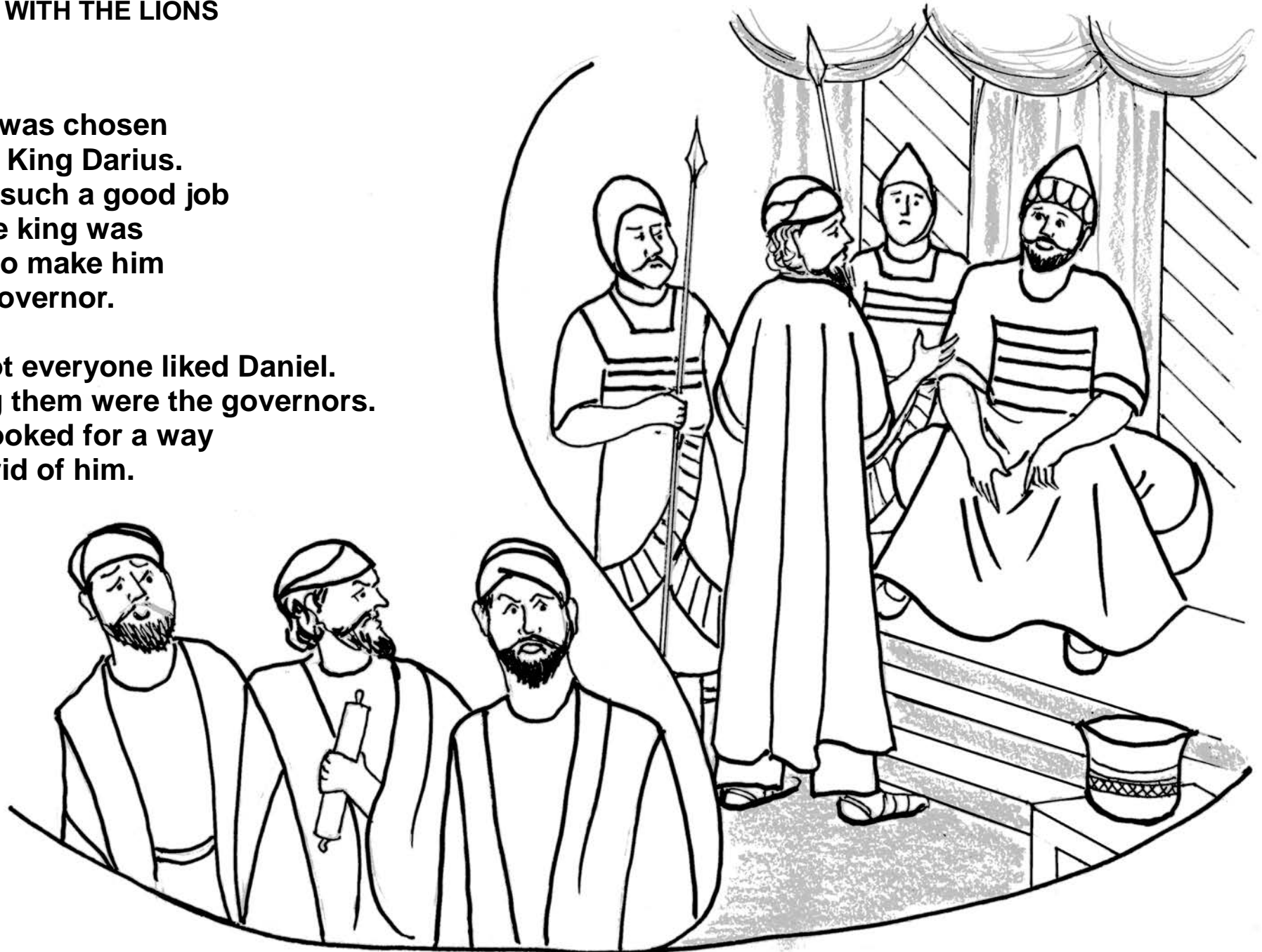

chief governor.**

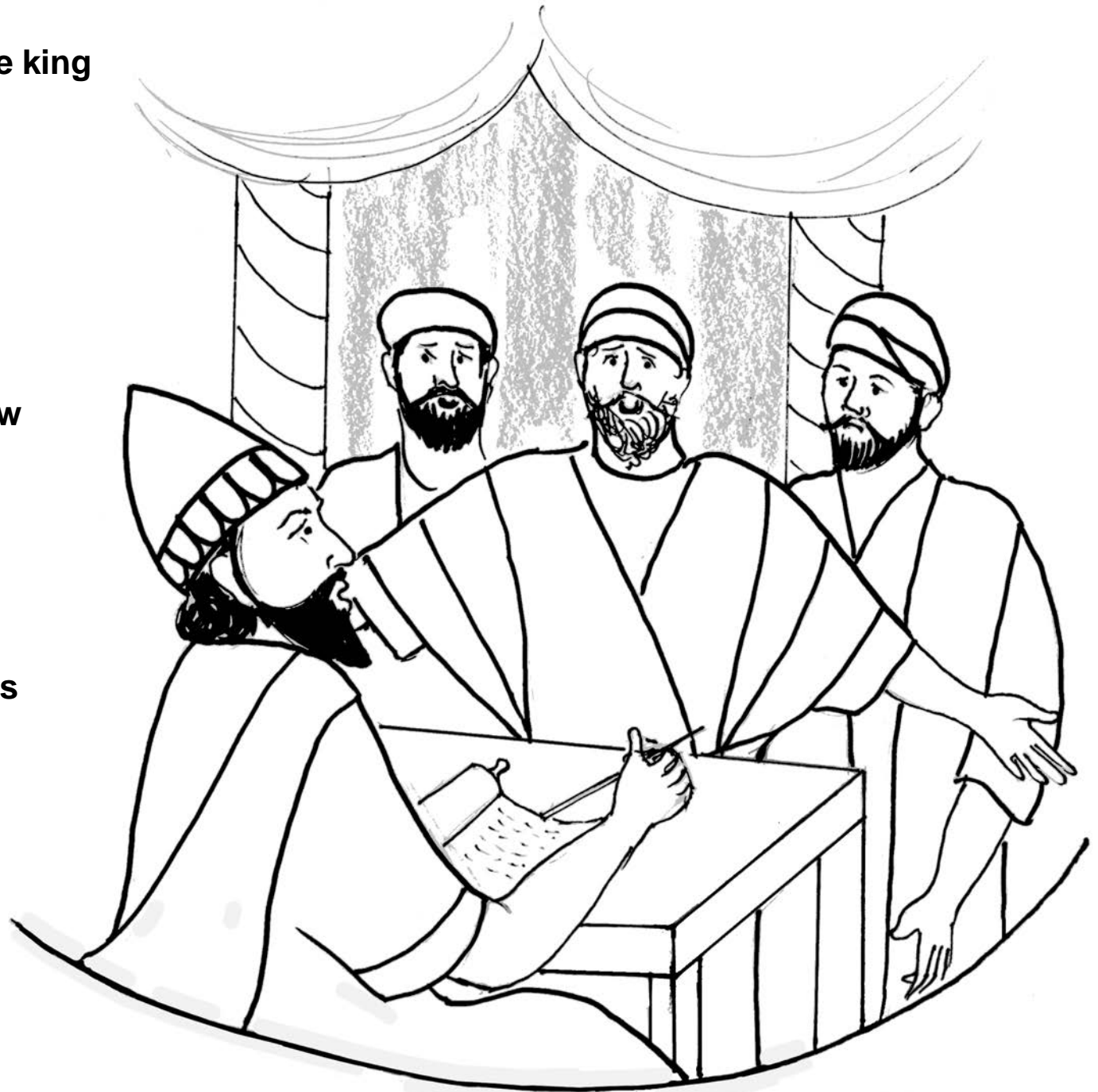
**But, not everyone liked Daniel.

the lions' den."

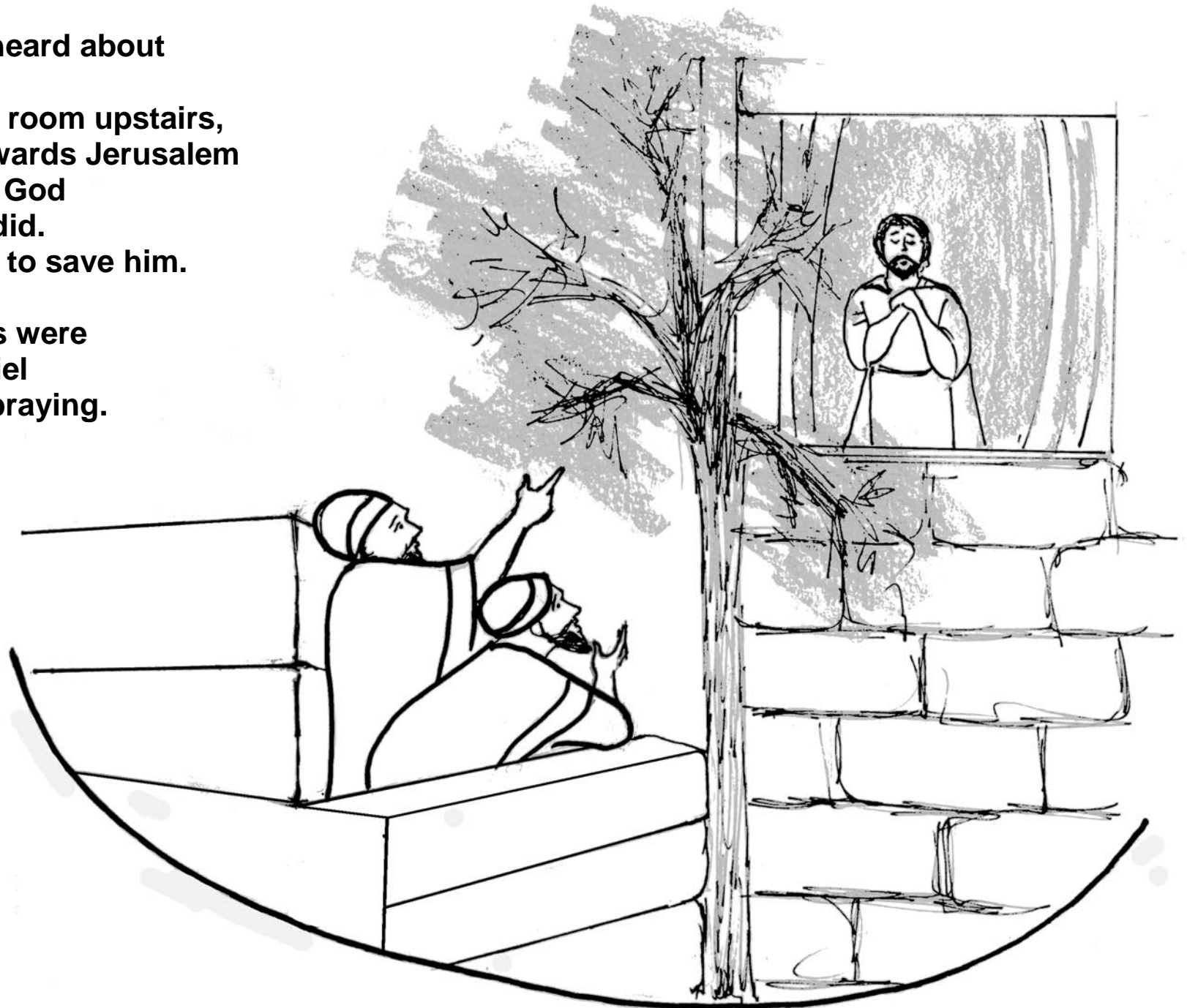
'Write it down and sign it

He asked God to save him.**

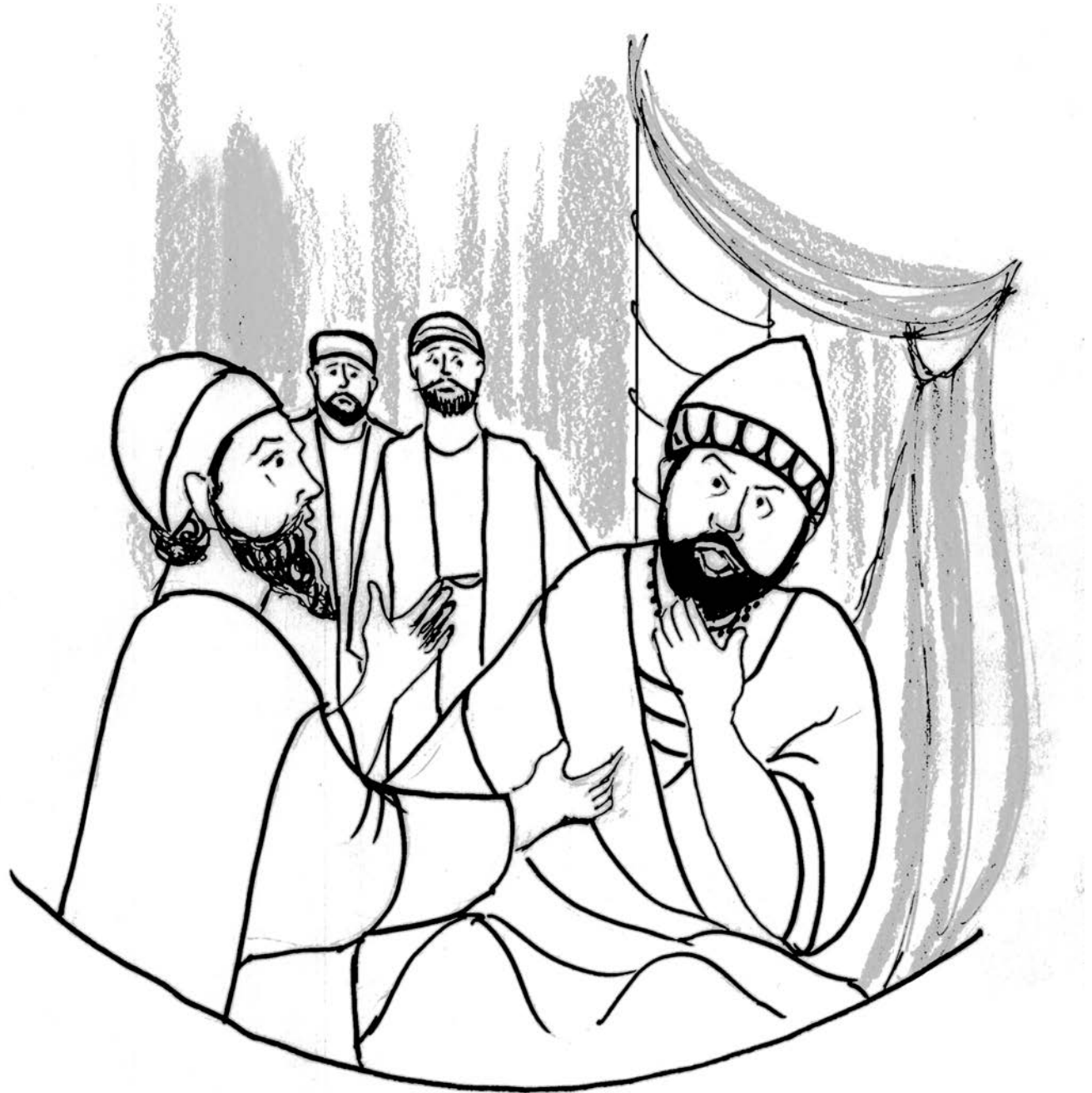
**The governors were

and it cannot be changed.'**

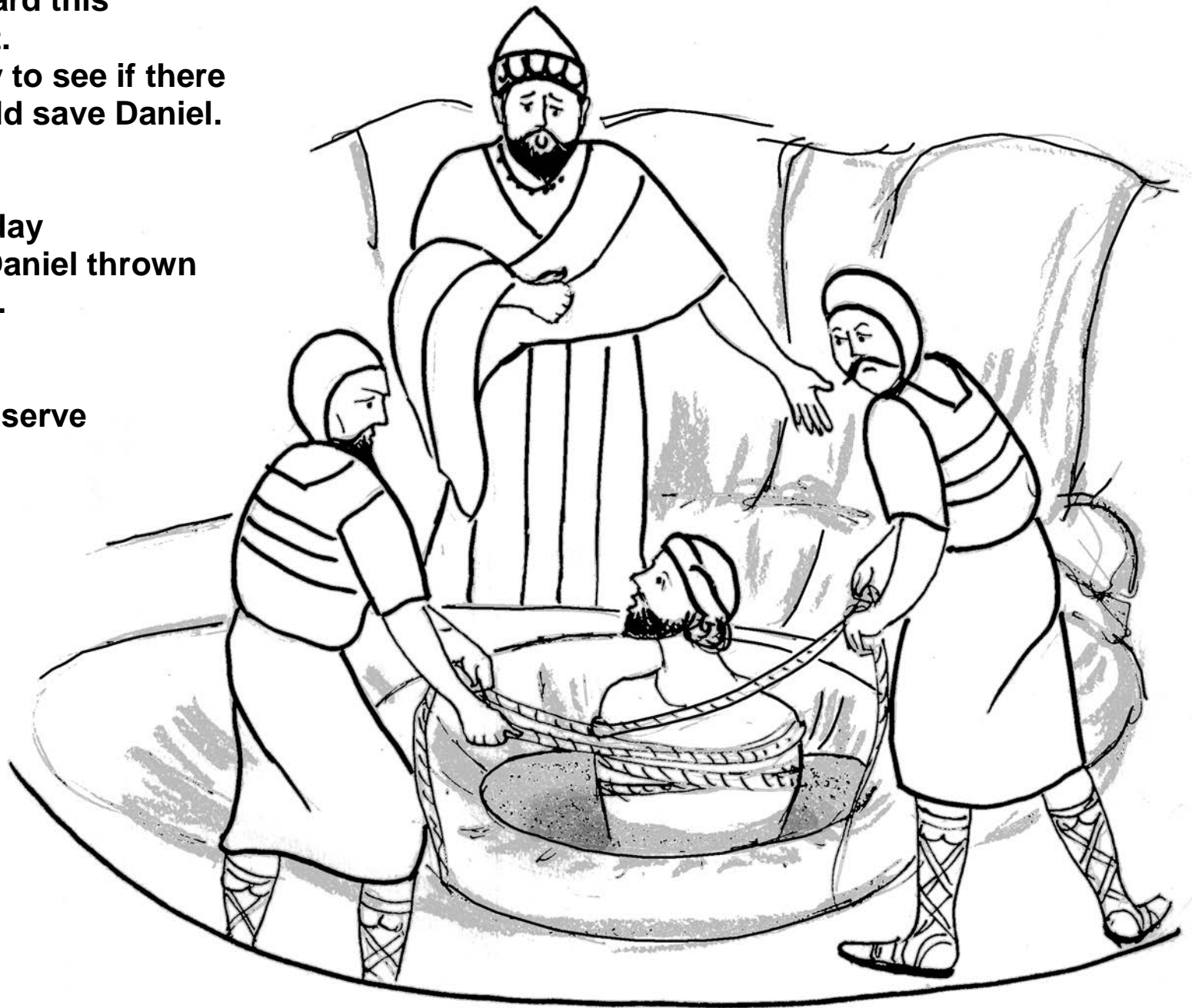
**The governors said,

He takes no notice of your law.'**



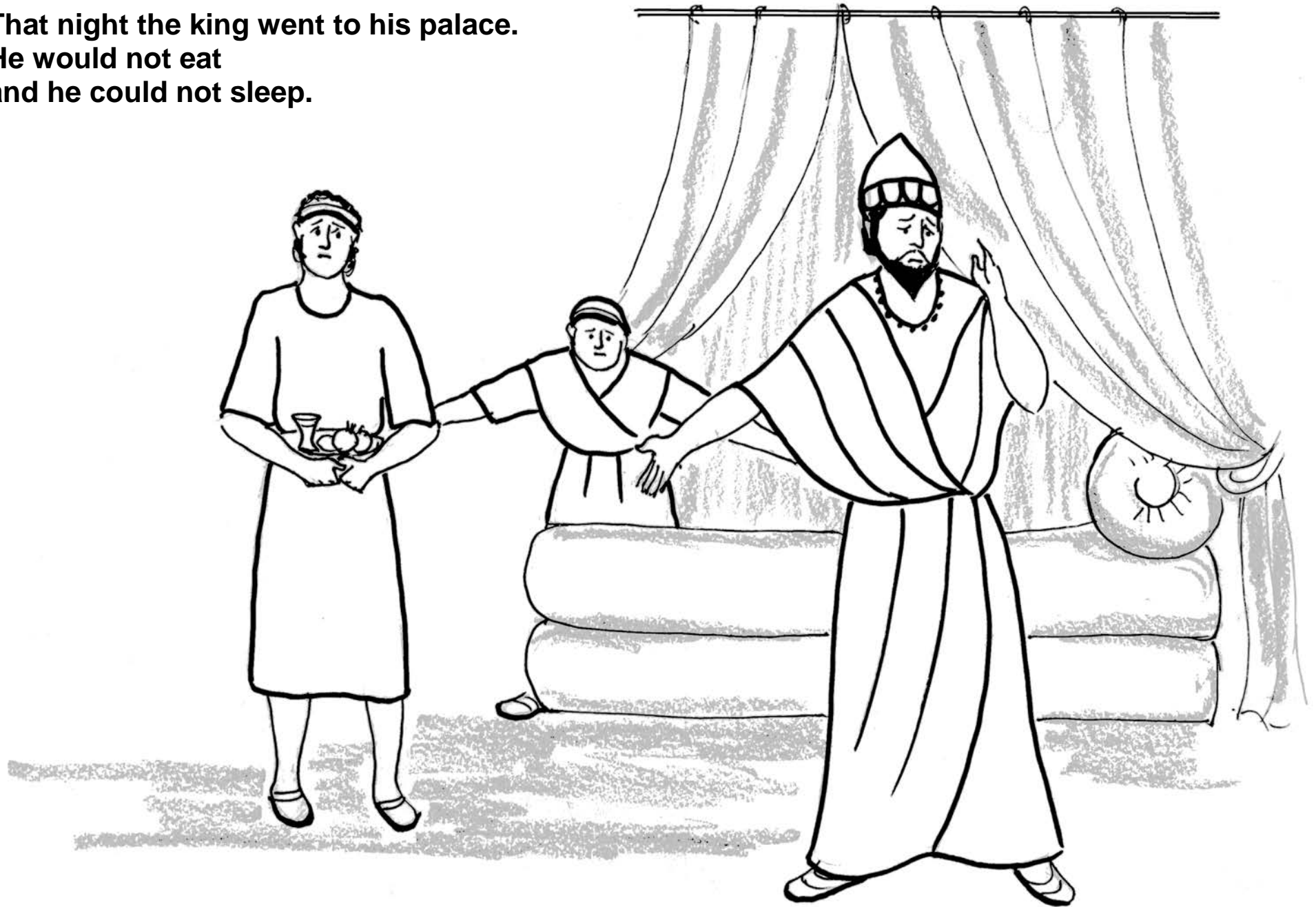
**When the king heard this

save you!'**

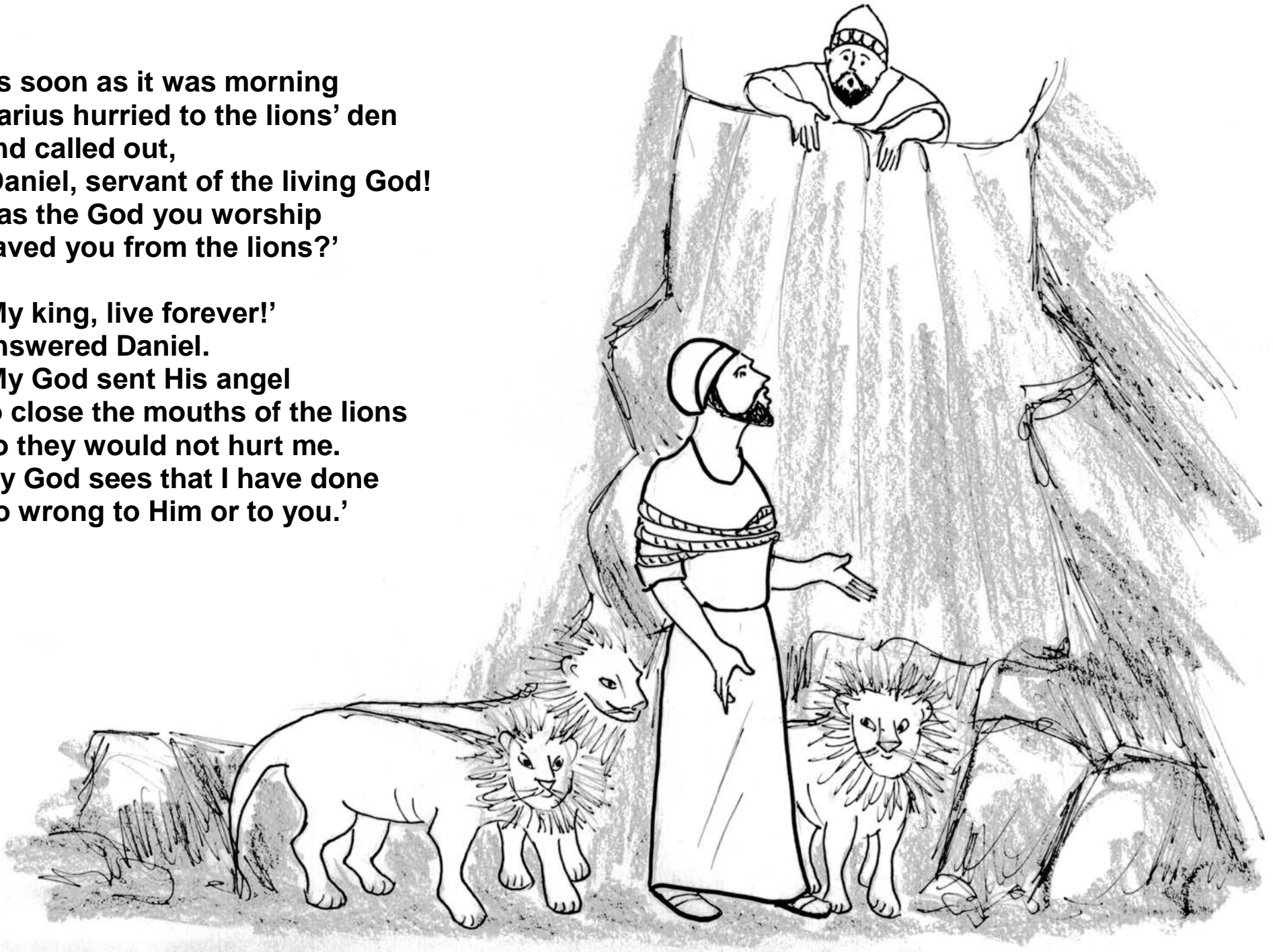


**That night the king went to his palace.

and he could not sleep.**



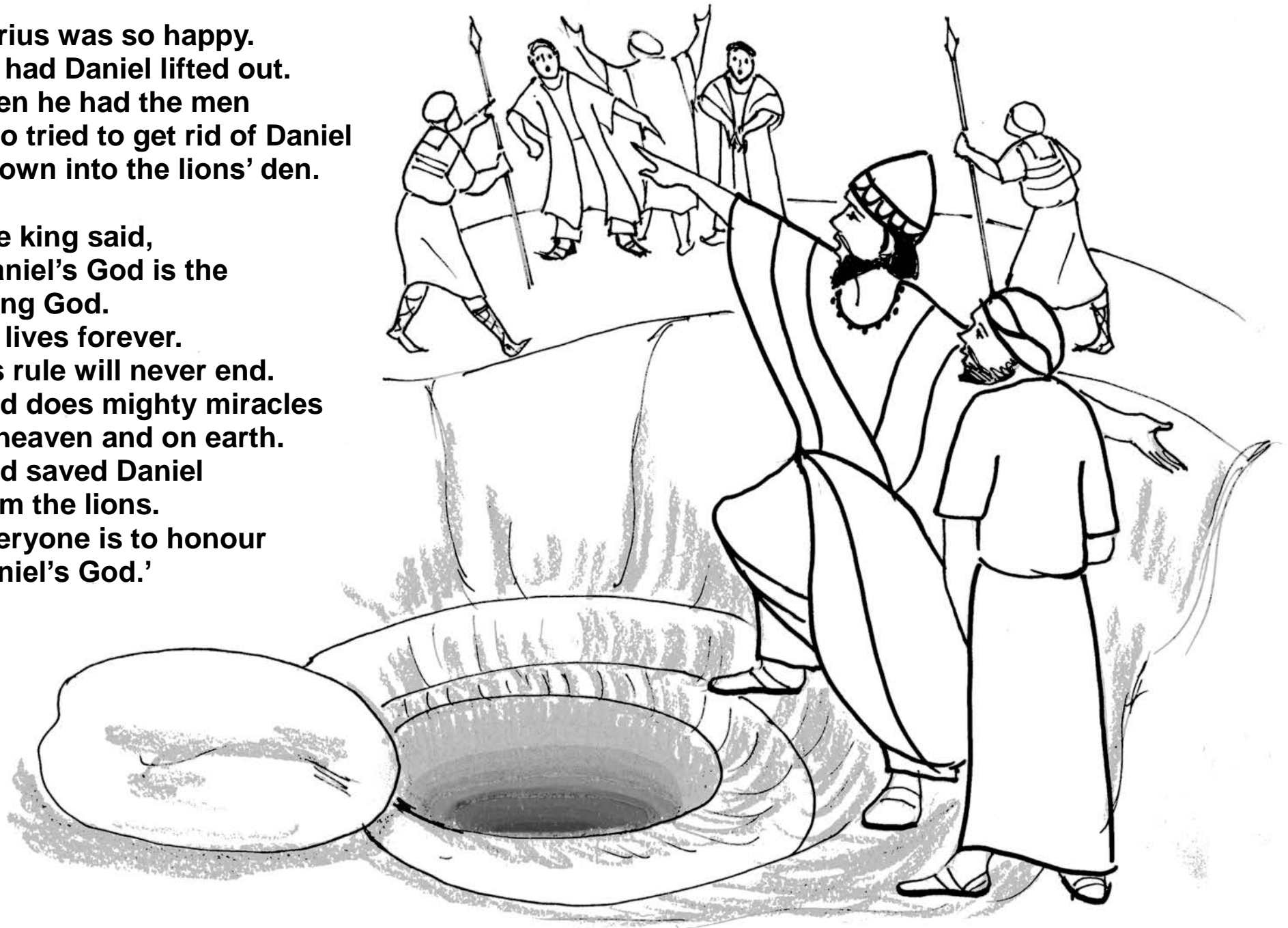
**As soon as it was morning

May God be with you.'**

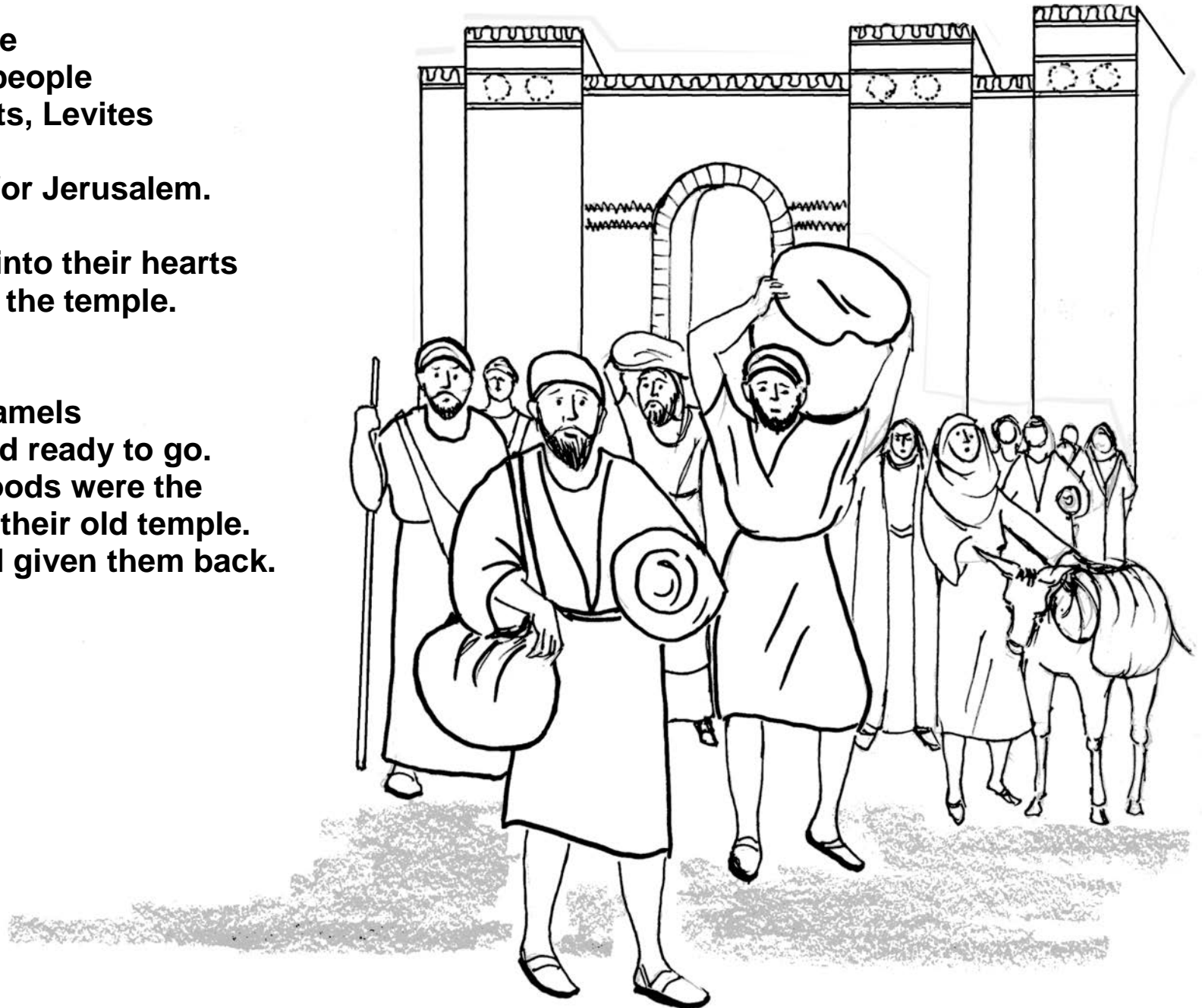
**'Those people

King Cyrus had given them back.**

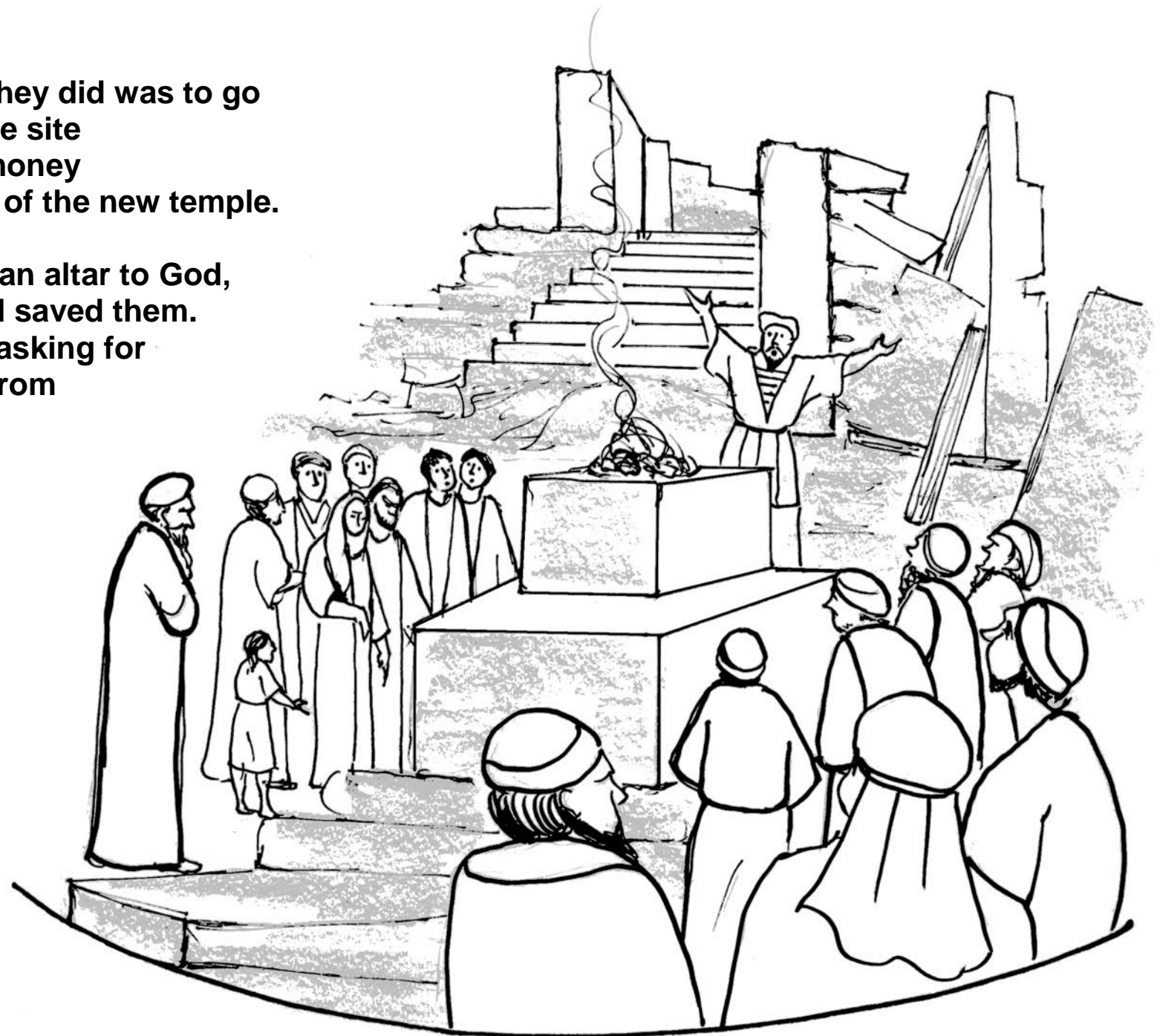


**They walked for many days,

The first thing they did was to go to the old temple site and give their money for the building of the new temple.

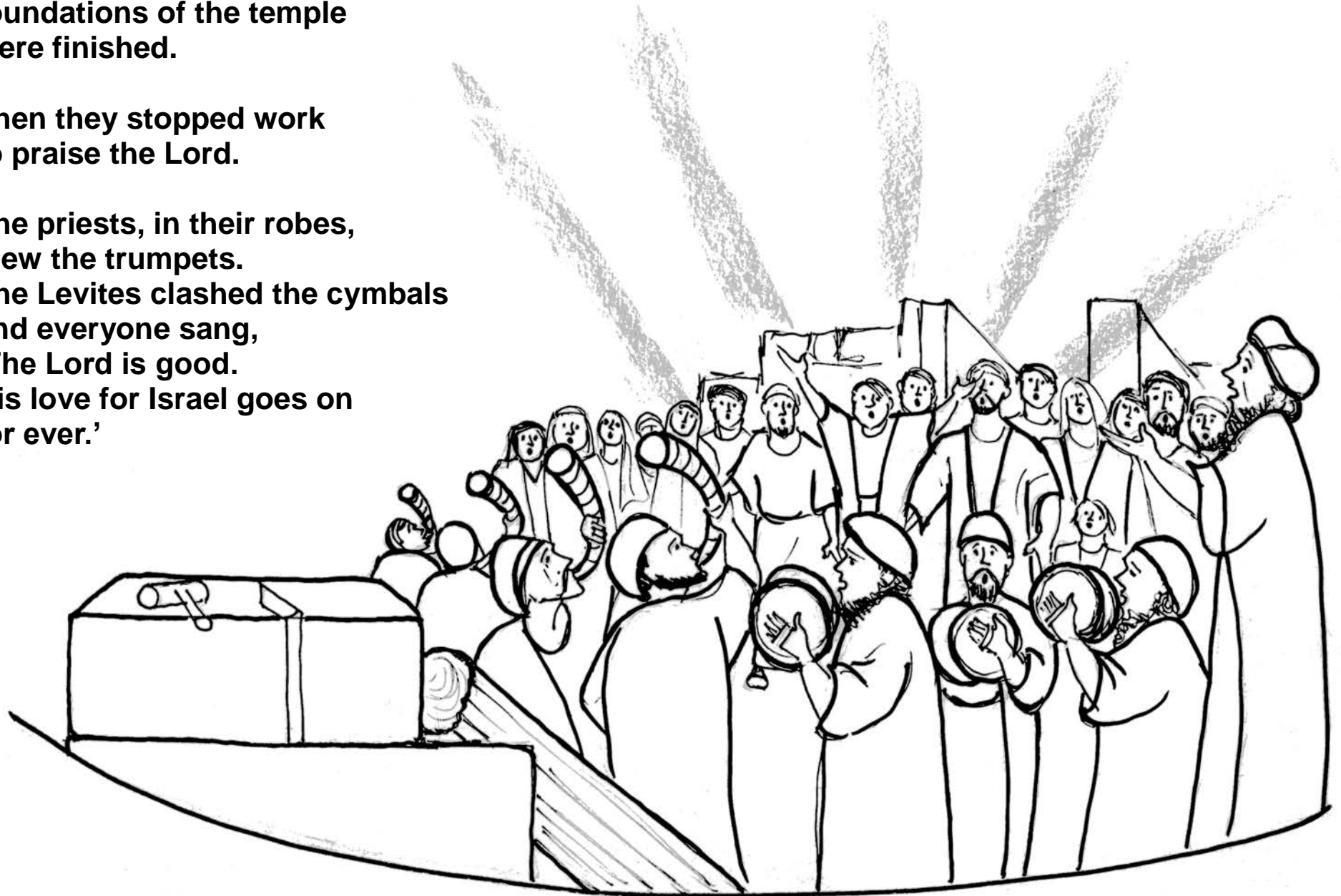
Then they built an altar to God, because He had saved them. Now they were asking for His protection from their enemies.

to praise the Lord.**

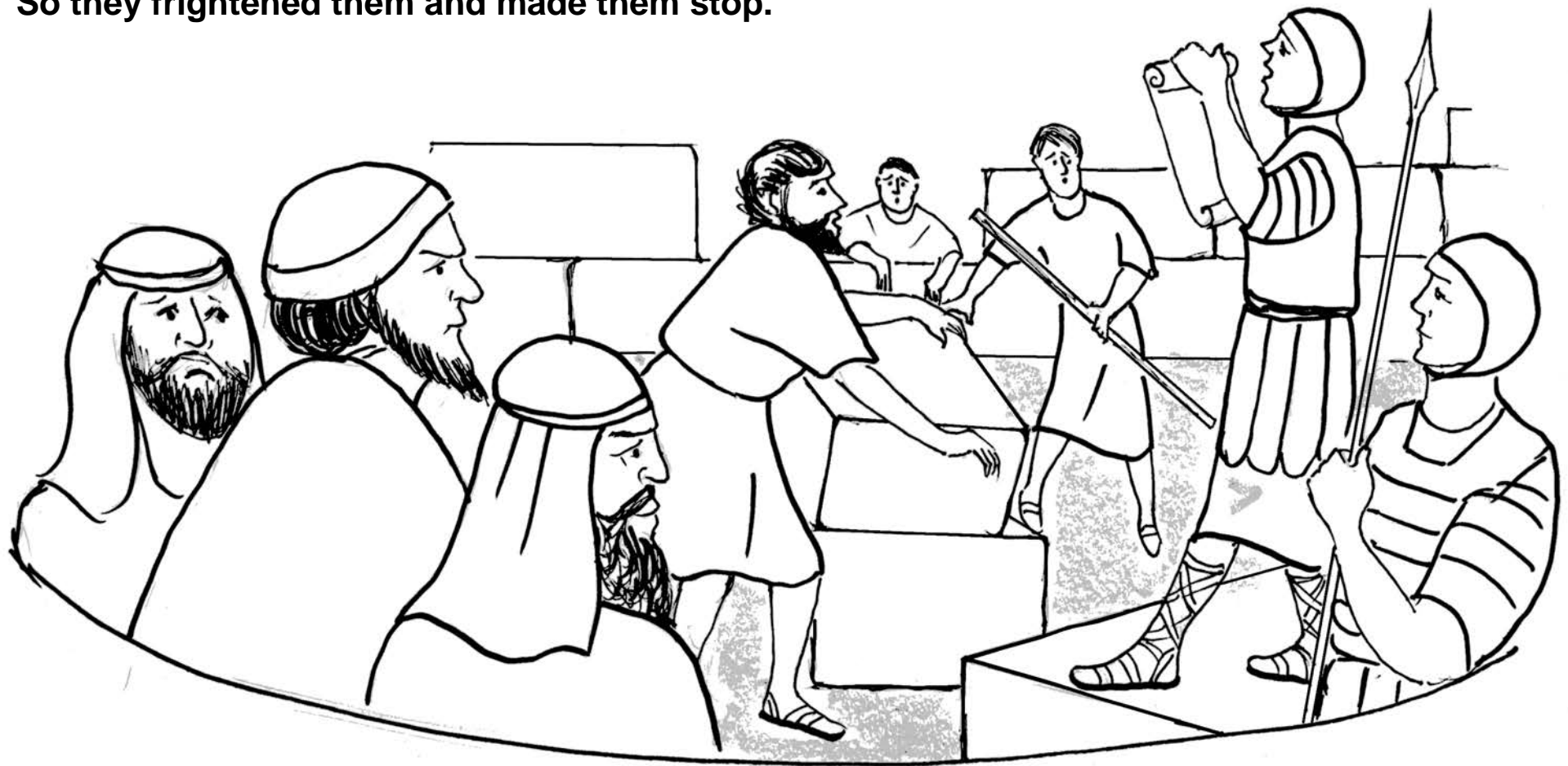
**The priests, in their robes,

So much noise was made that their enemies heard it and came to see what was happening.

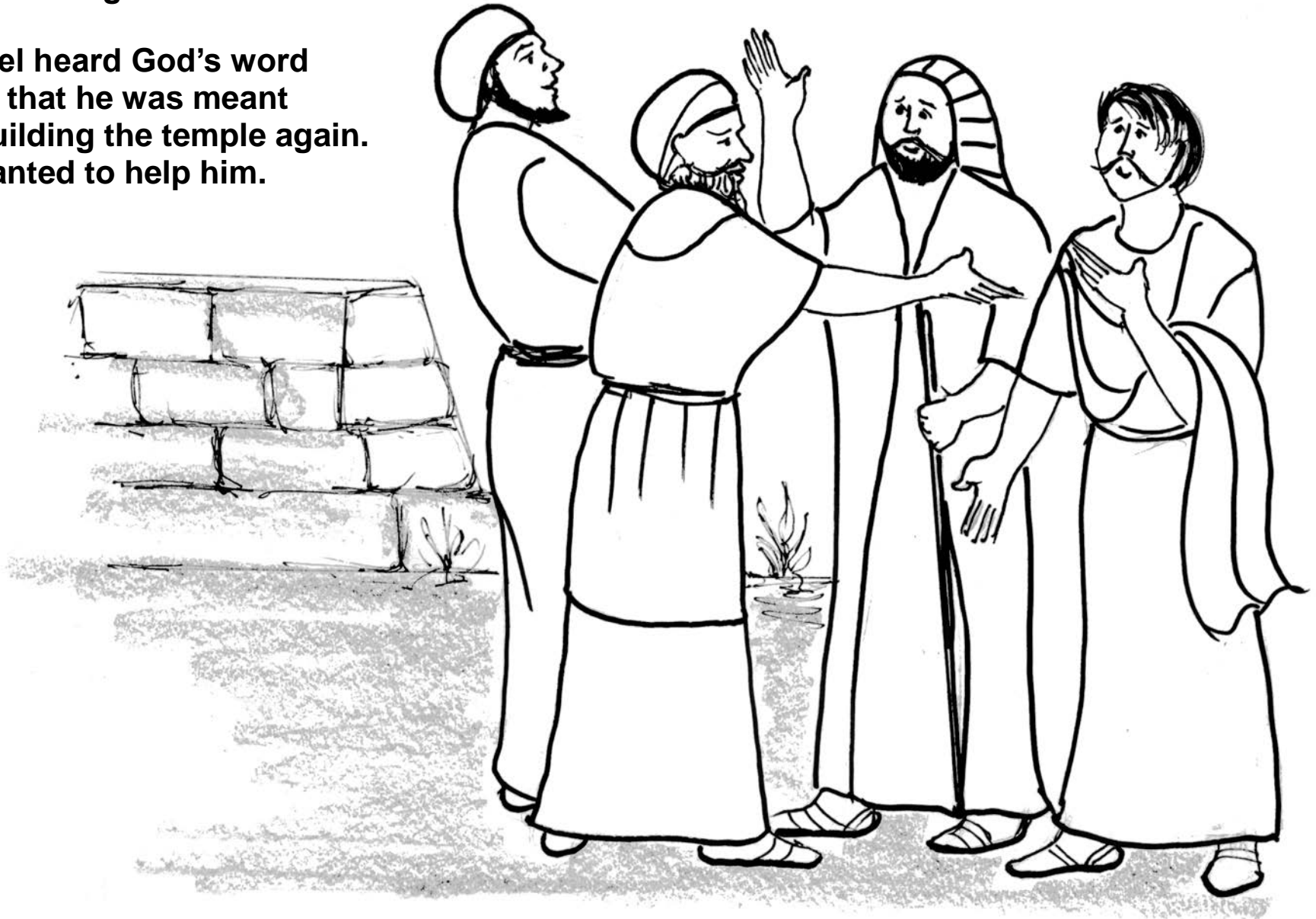
**They saw God's people praising God.

Some years later two prophets called Haggai and Zechariah started preaching God's word.

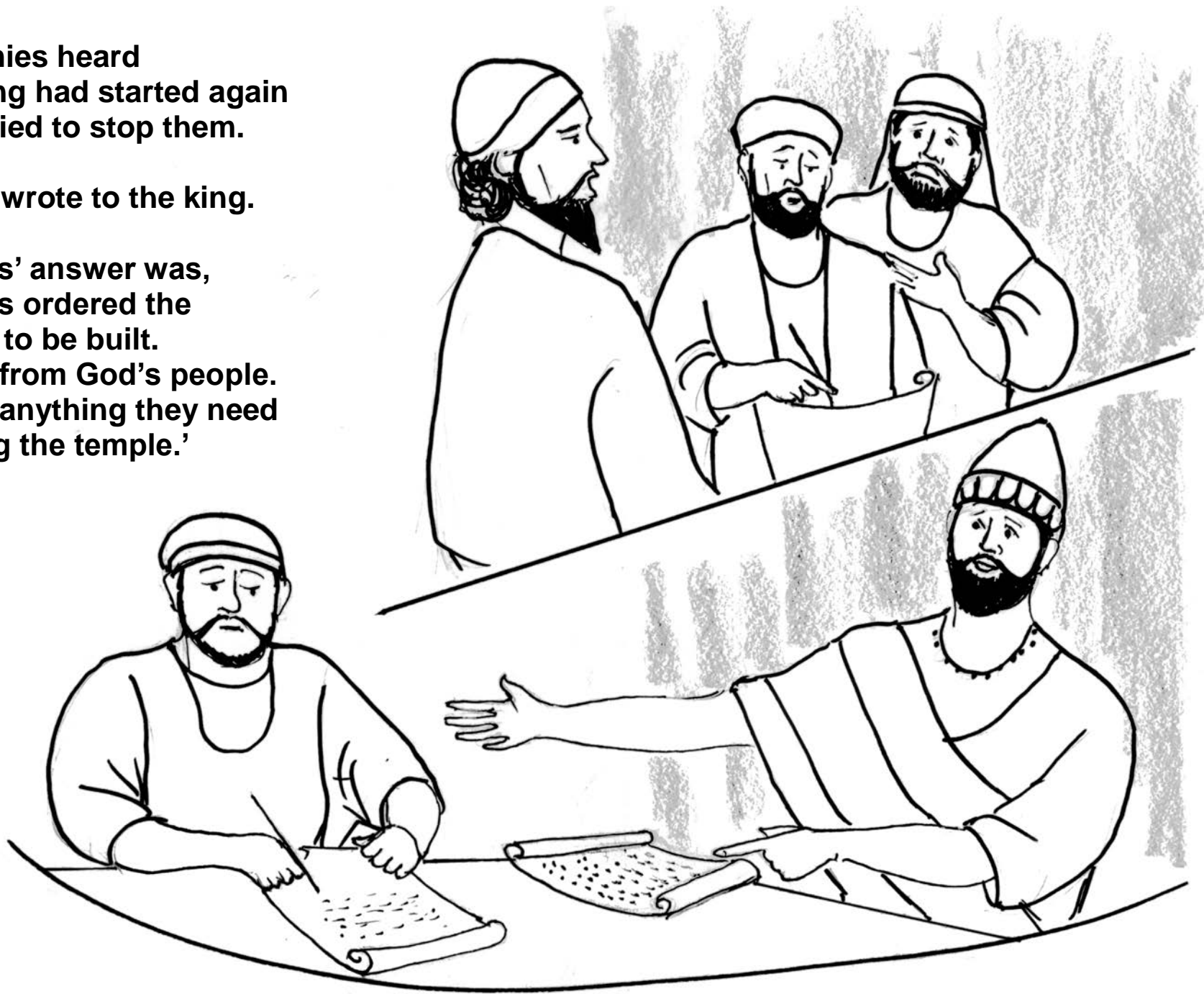
Zerubbabel heard God's word and knew that he was meant to start building the temple again. Others wanted to help him.



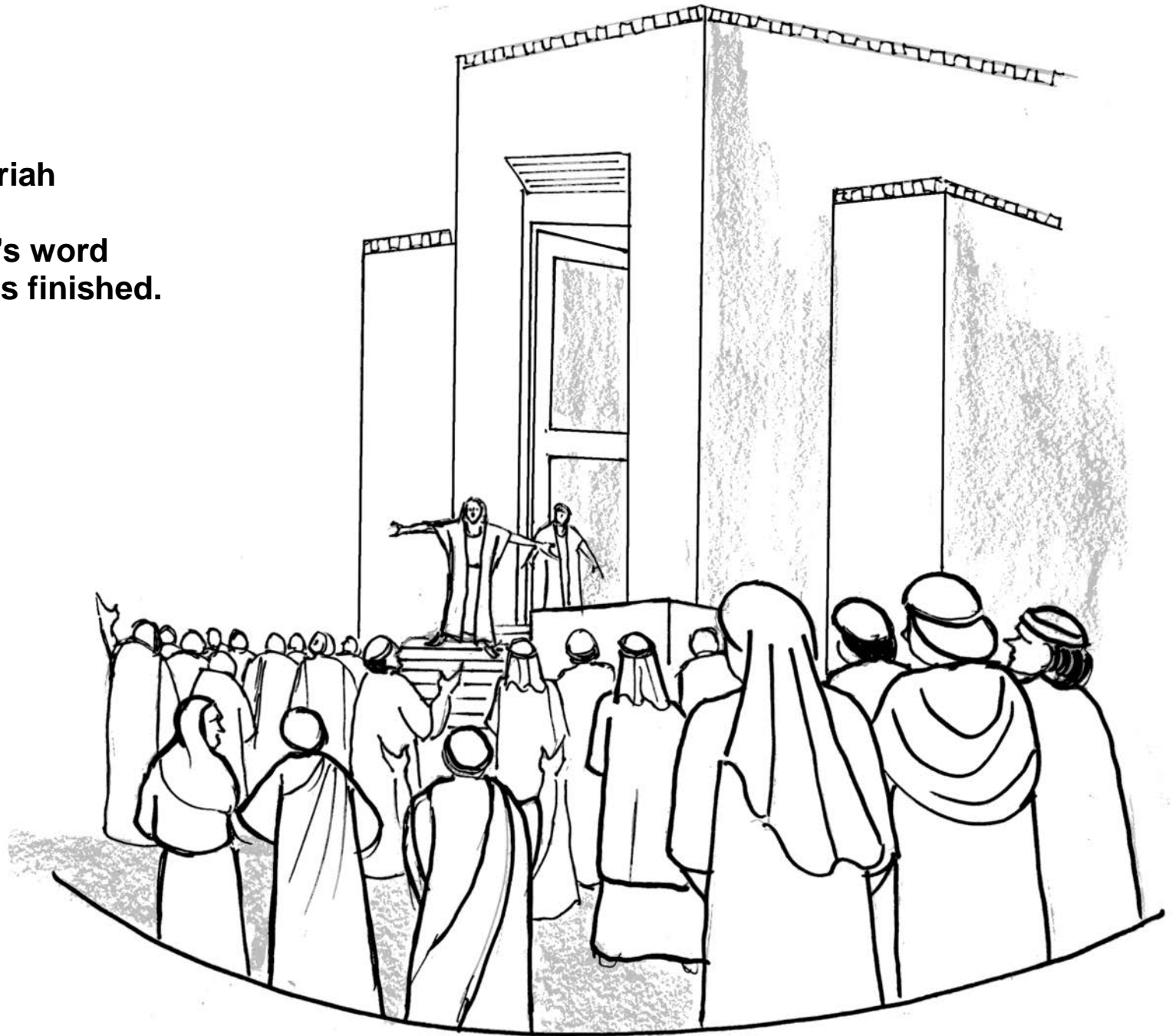
**Their enemies heard

a new queen.**

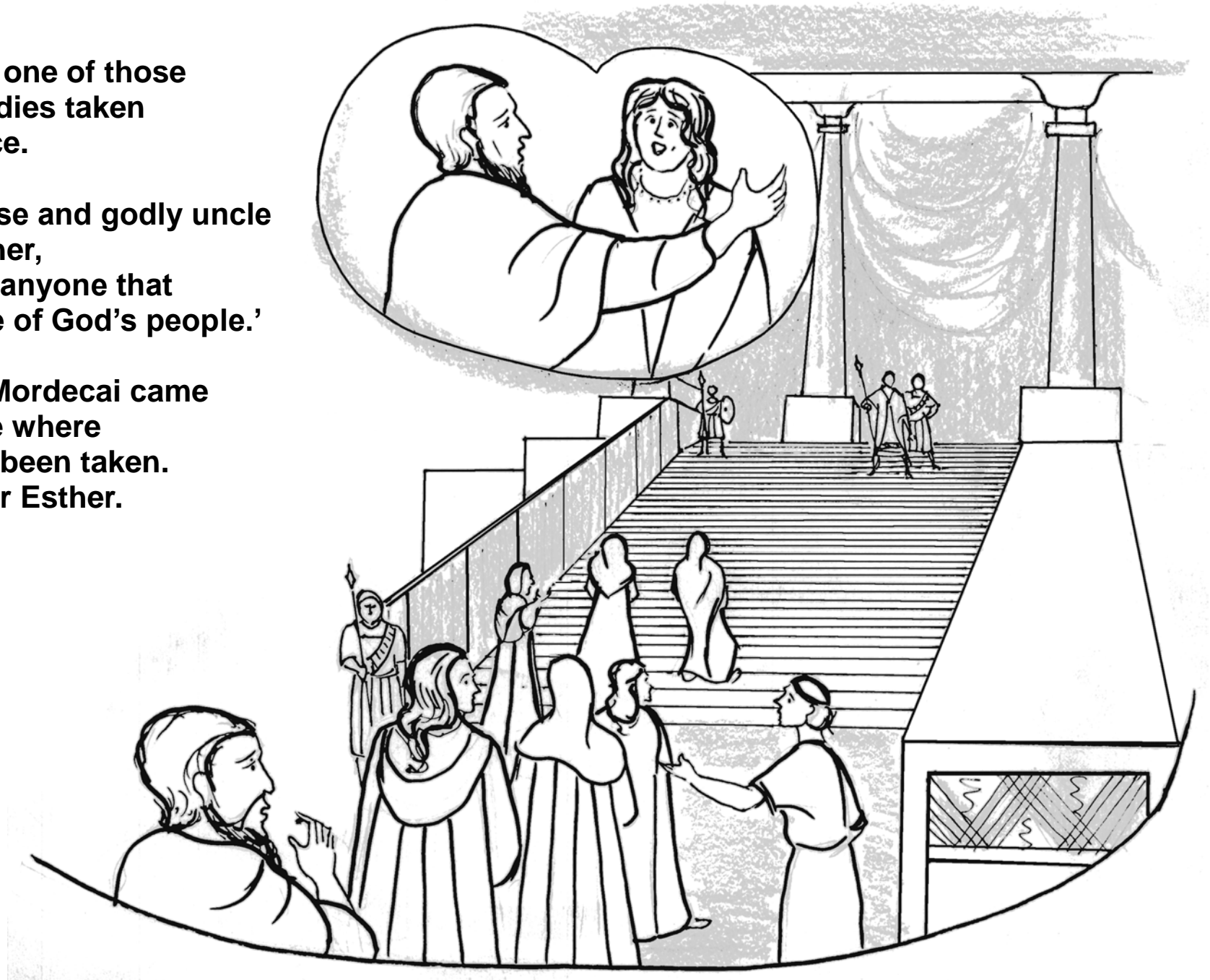
**So his helpers went

Esther was one of those beautiful ladies taken to the palace.

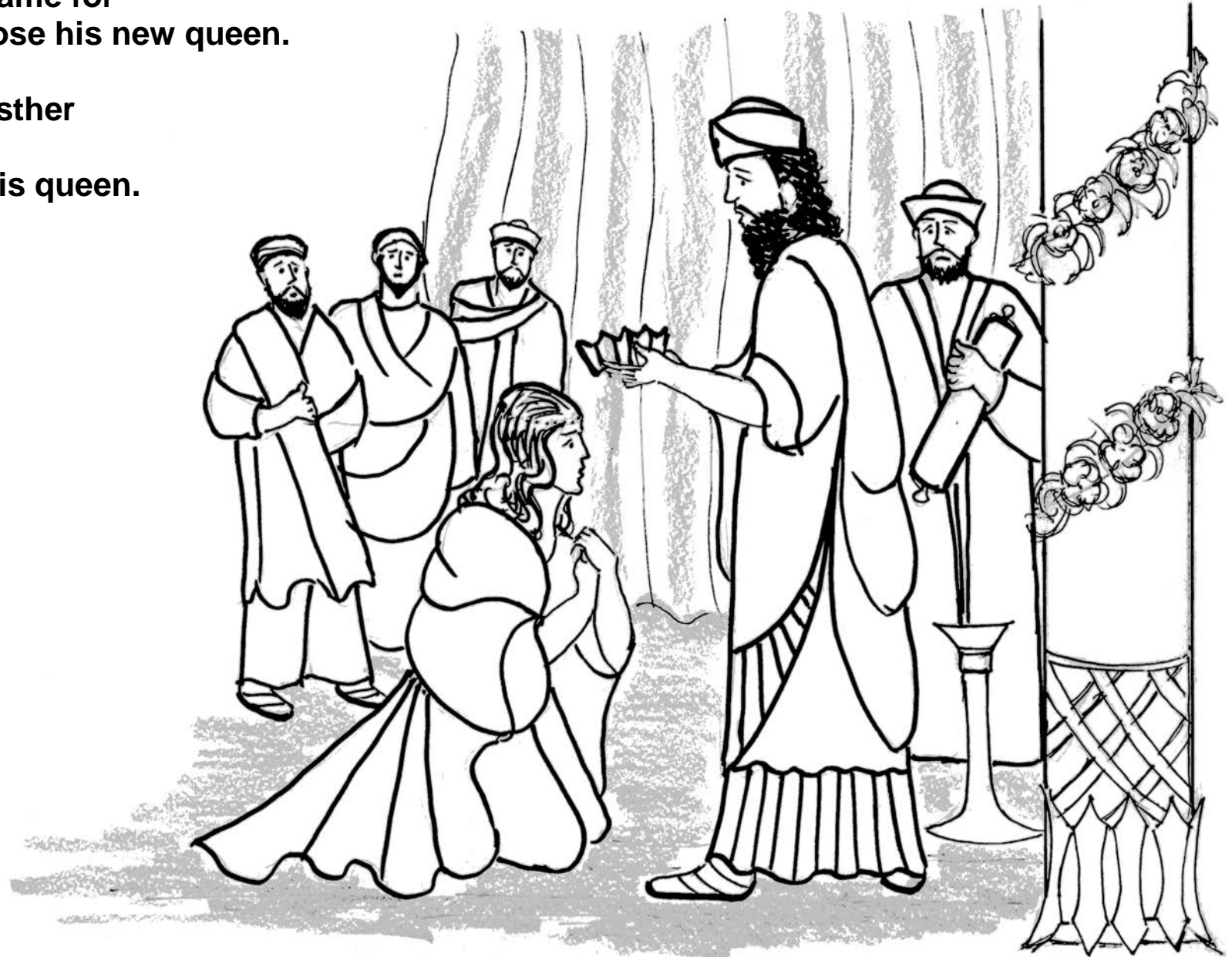
Esther's wise and godly uncle said to Esther, 'Do not tell anyone that you are one of God's people.'

the king to choose his new queen.**

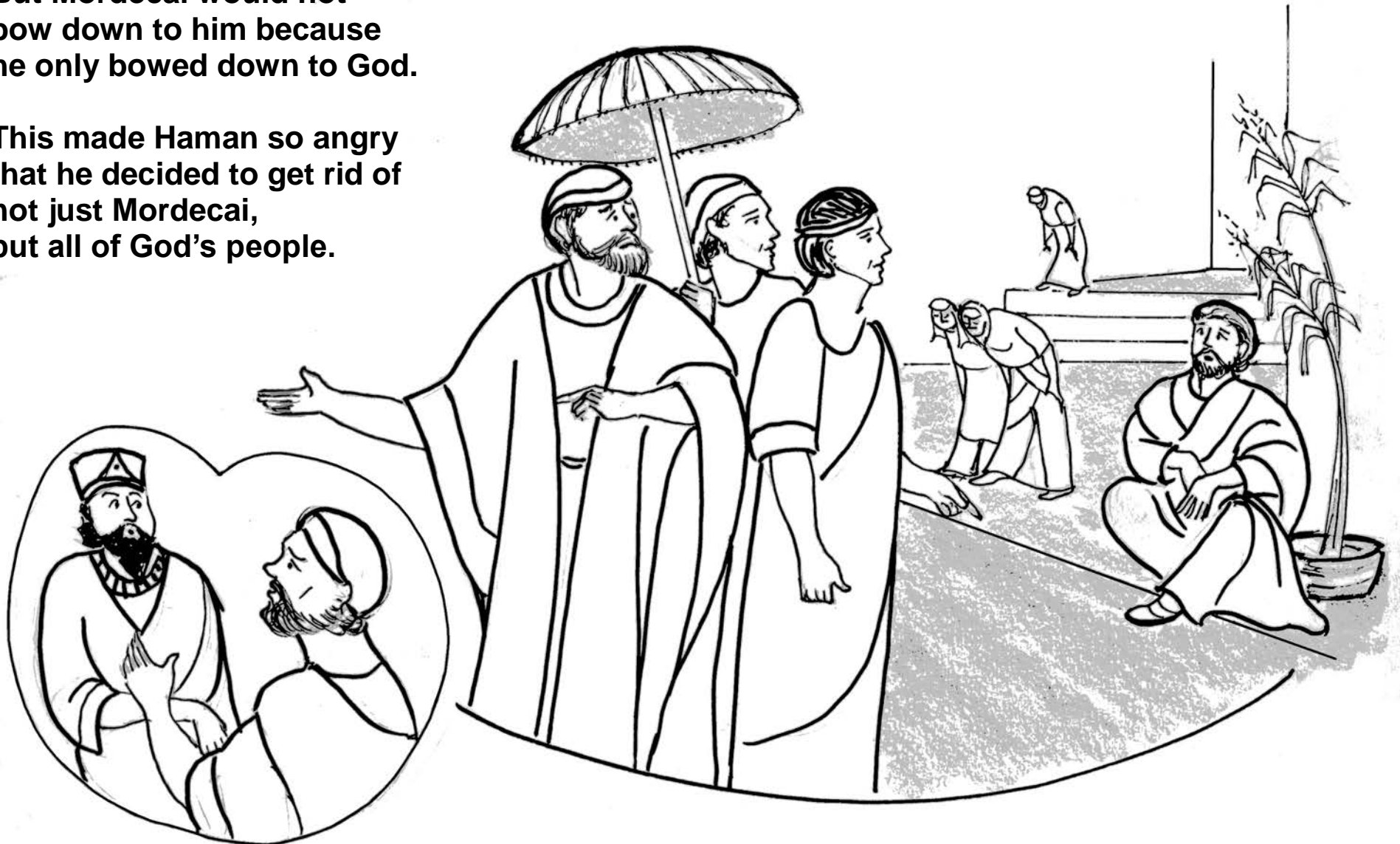
**When he saw Esther

but all of God's people.

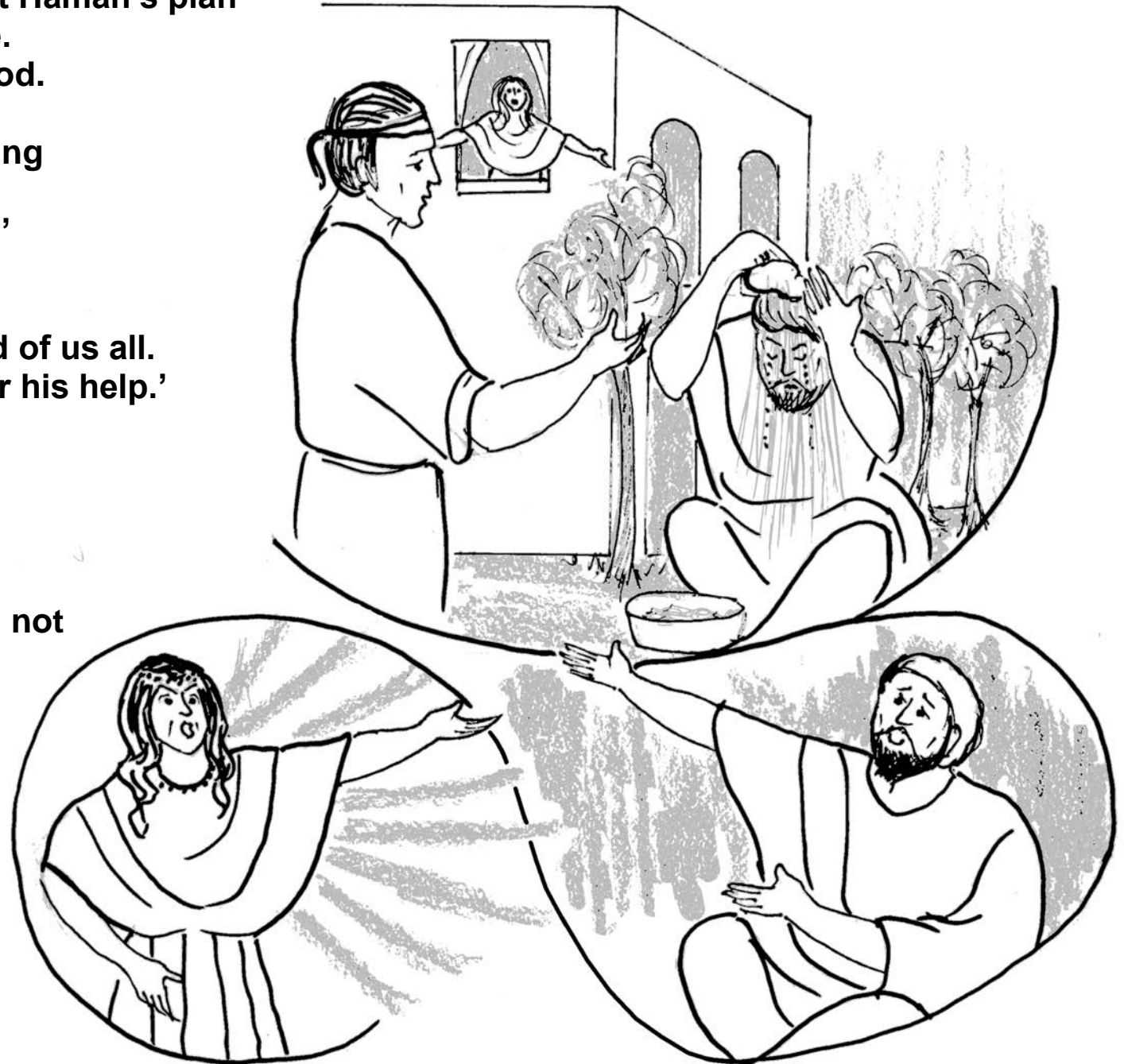


**Mordecai found out about Haman's plan

'What are you crying for?'**

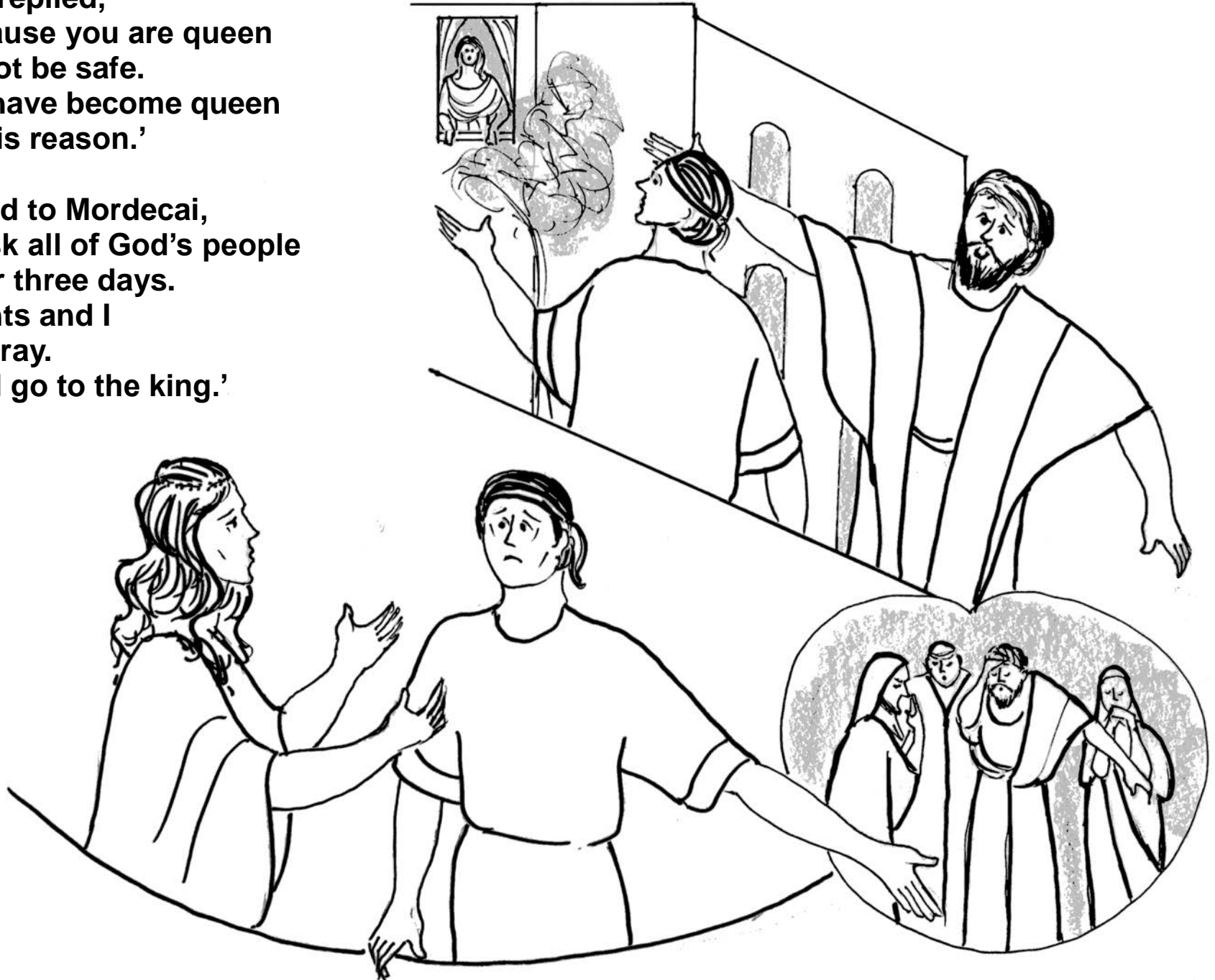
**Mordecai said,

for just this reason.'**

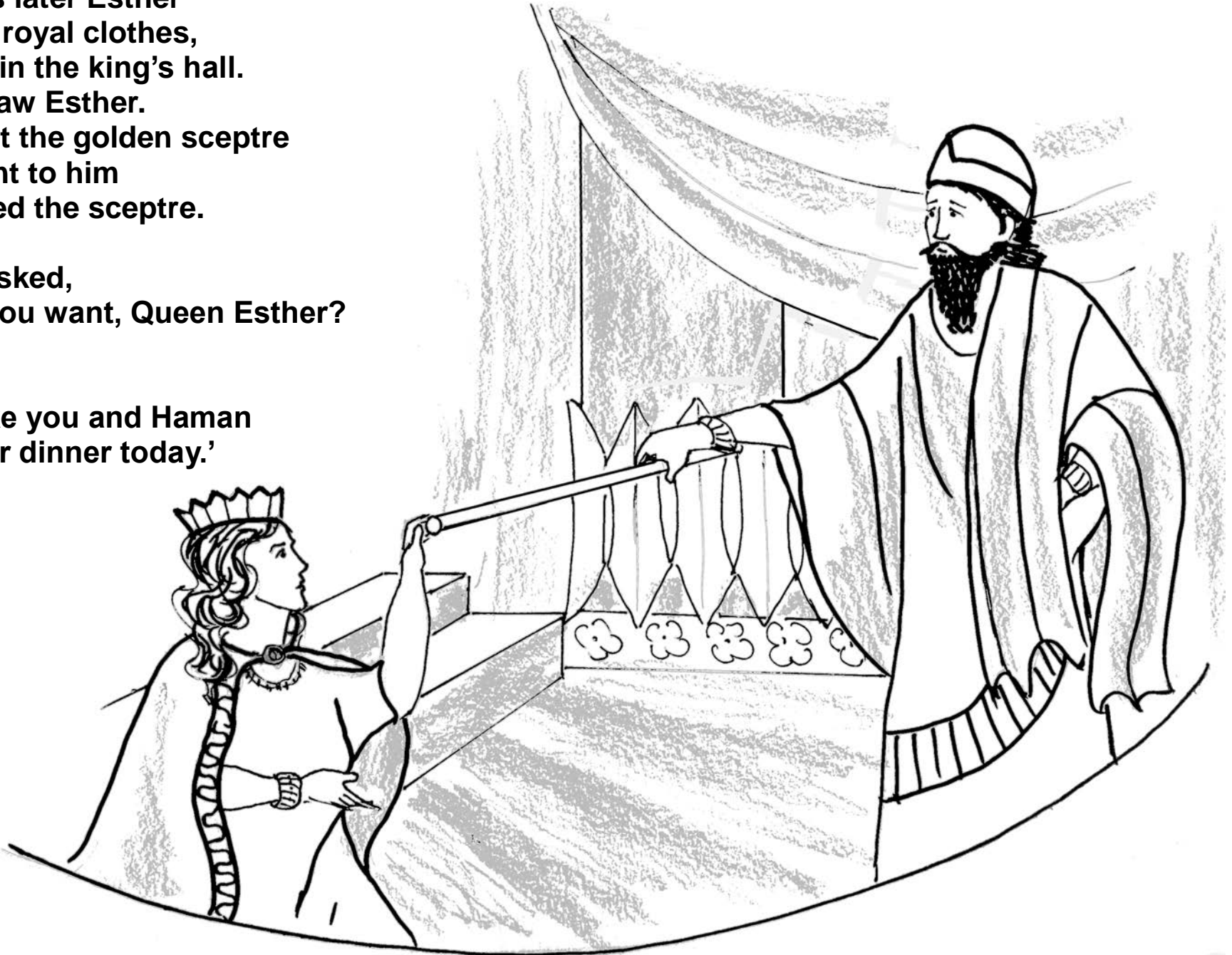
**Esther said to Mordecai,

and touched the sceptre.

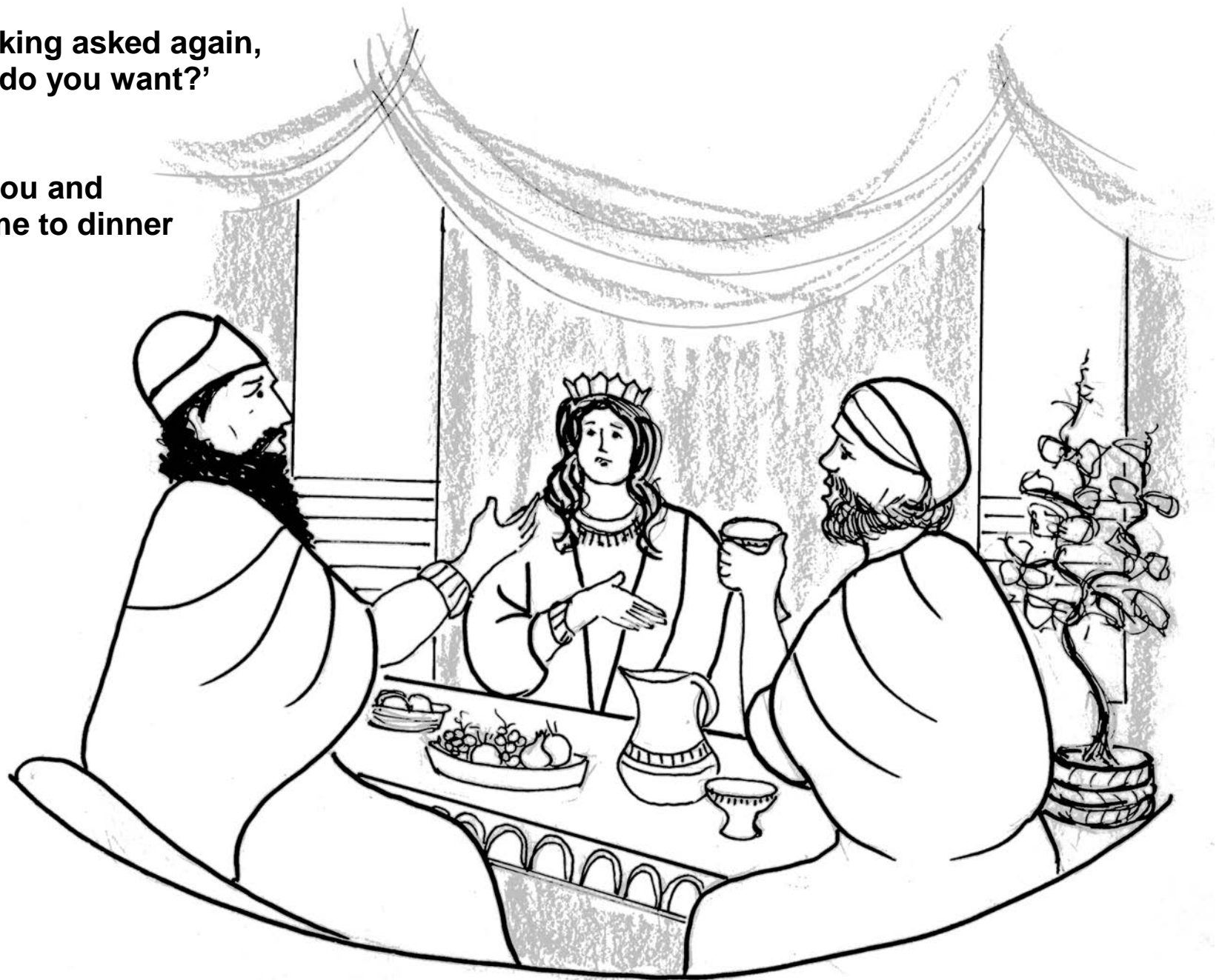
The king asked,

tomorrow.'**



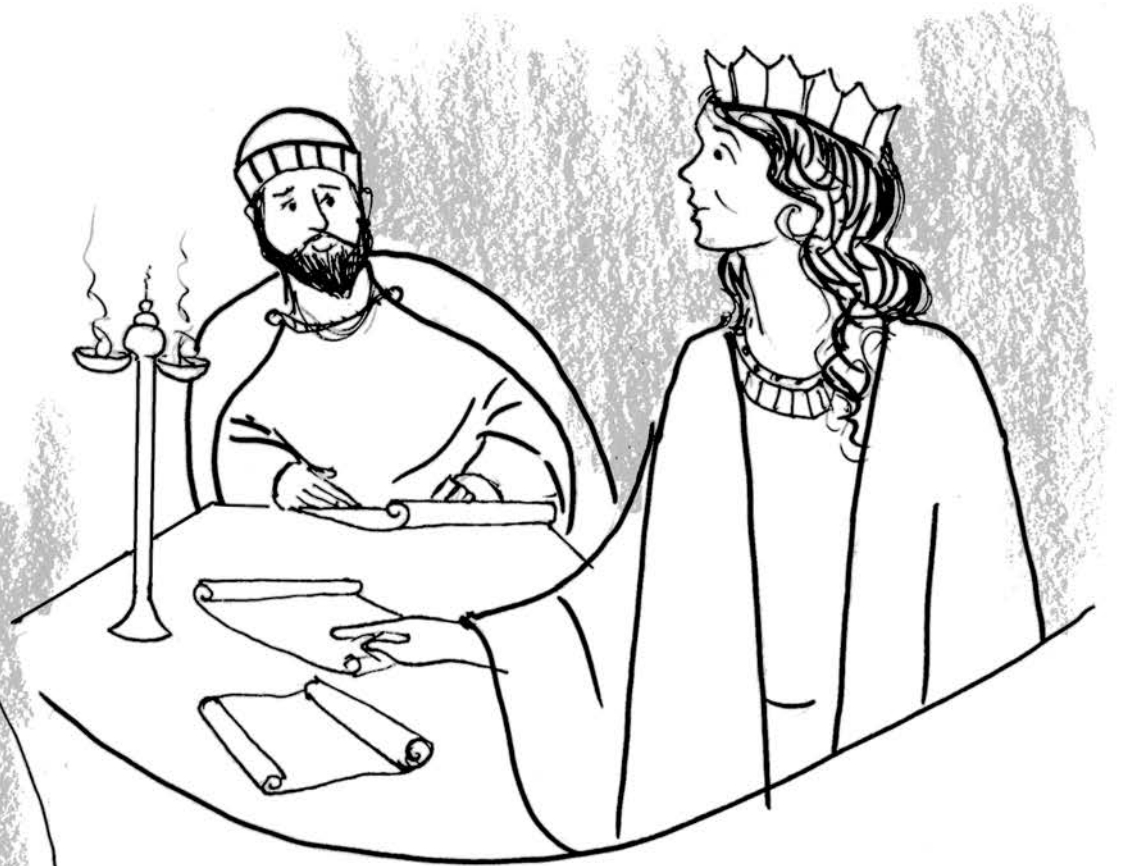
**At dinner the next day,

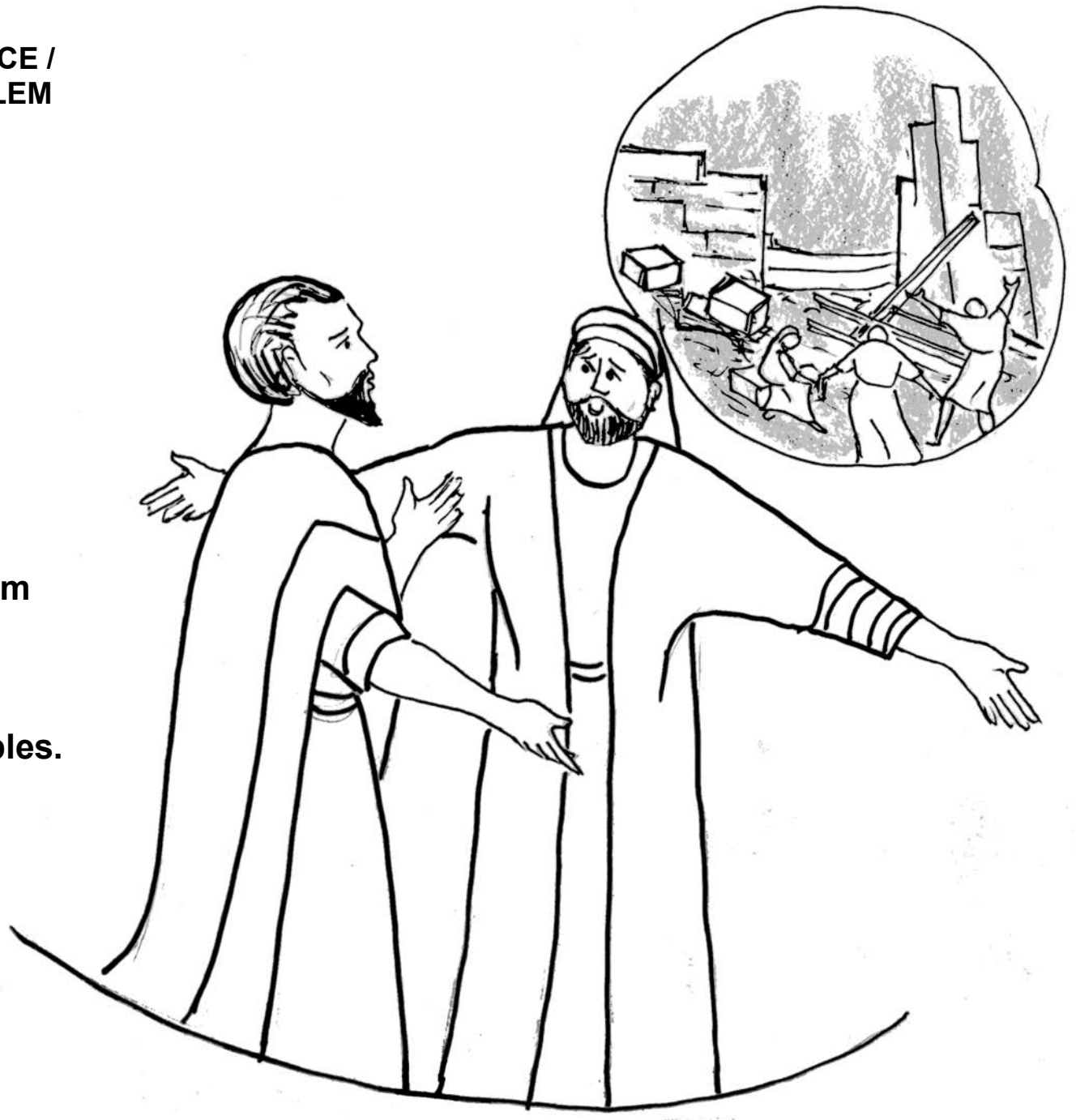
NEHEMIAH 1:1–2:18

and what is the city like?'**

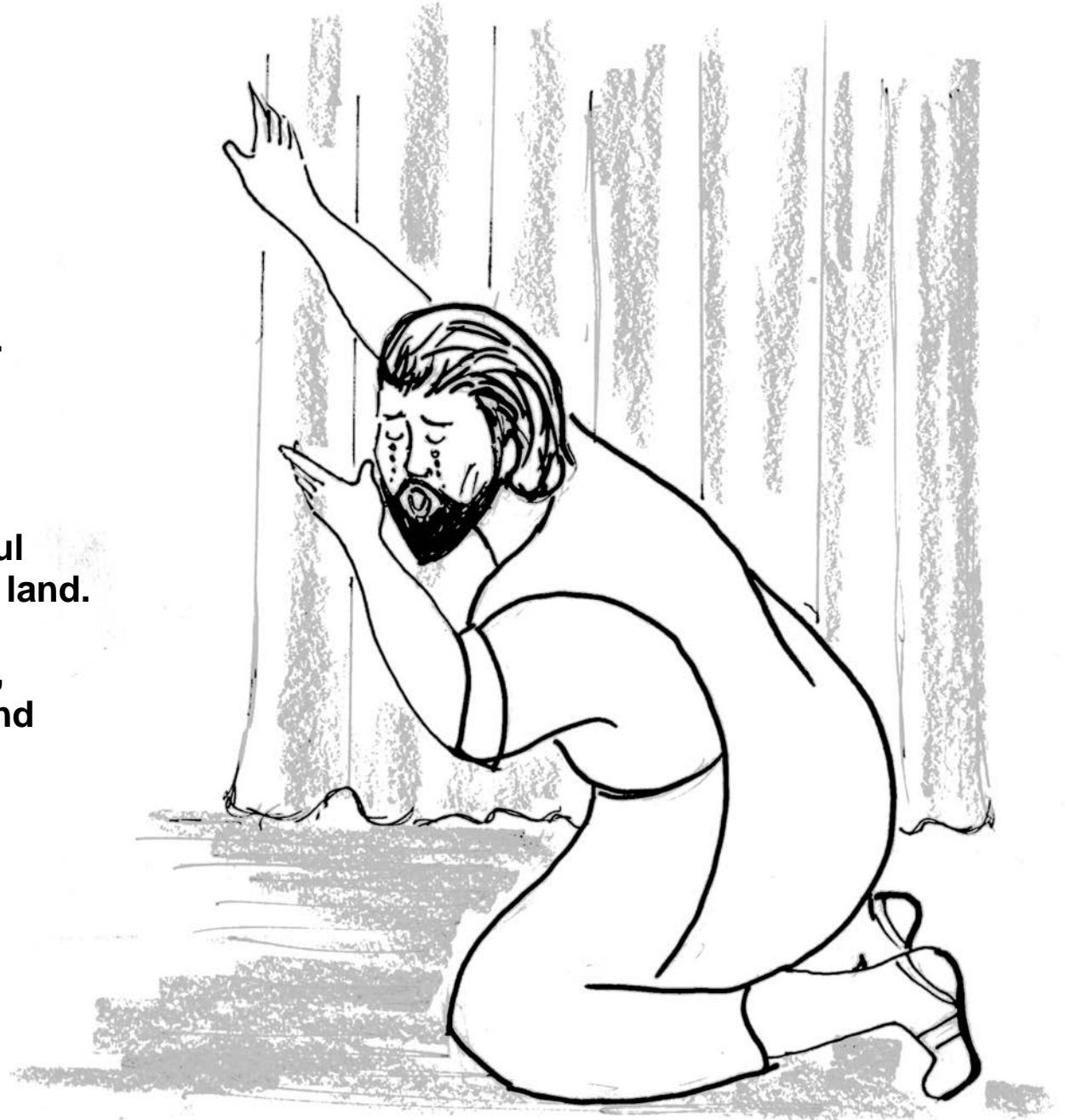
**His brother answered,

Nehemiah prayed to God then asked the king, 'If I have pleased you send me to Jerusalem to rebuild the city.'

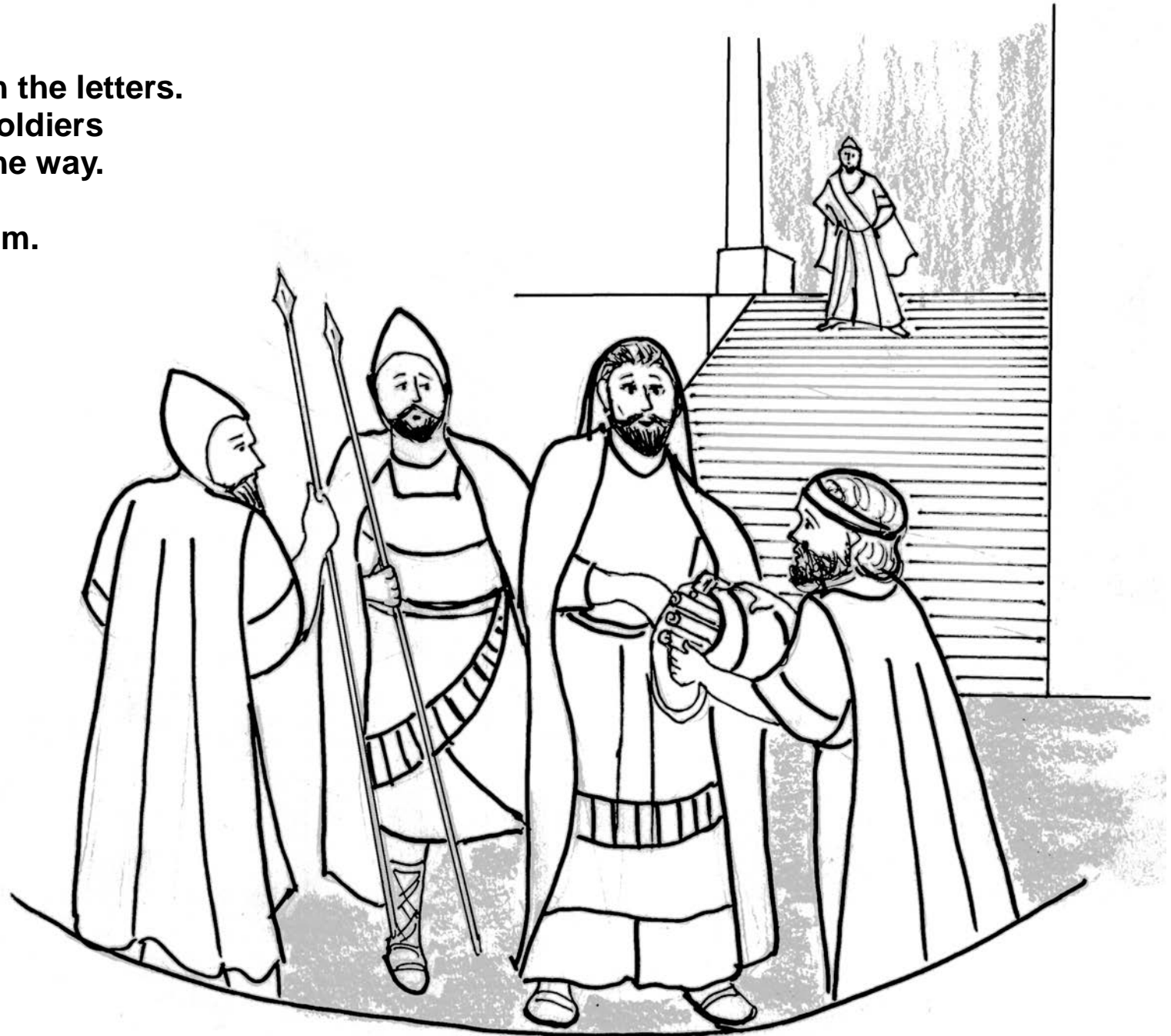
'How long would you be away?' asked the king.

Nehemiah told him, then asked, 'Would you give me letters to say that I can travel through your land and permission to use wood from your forests?'

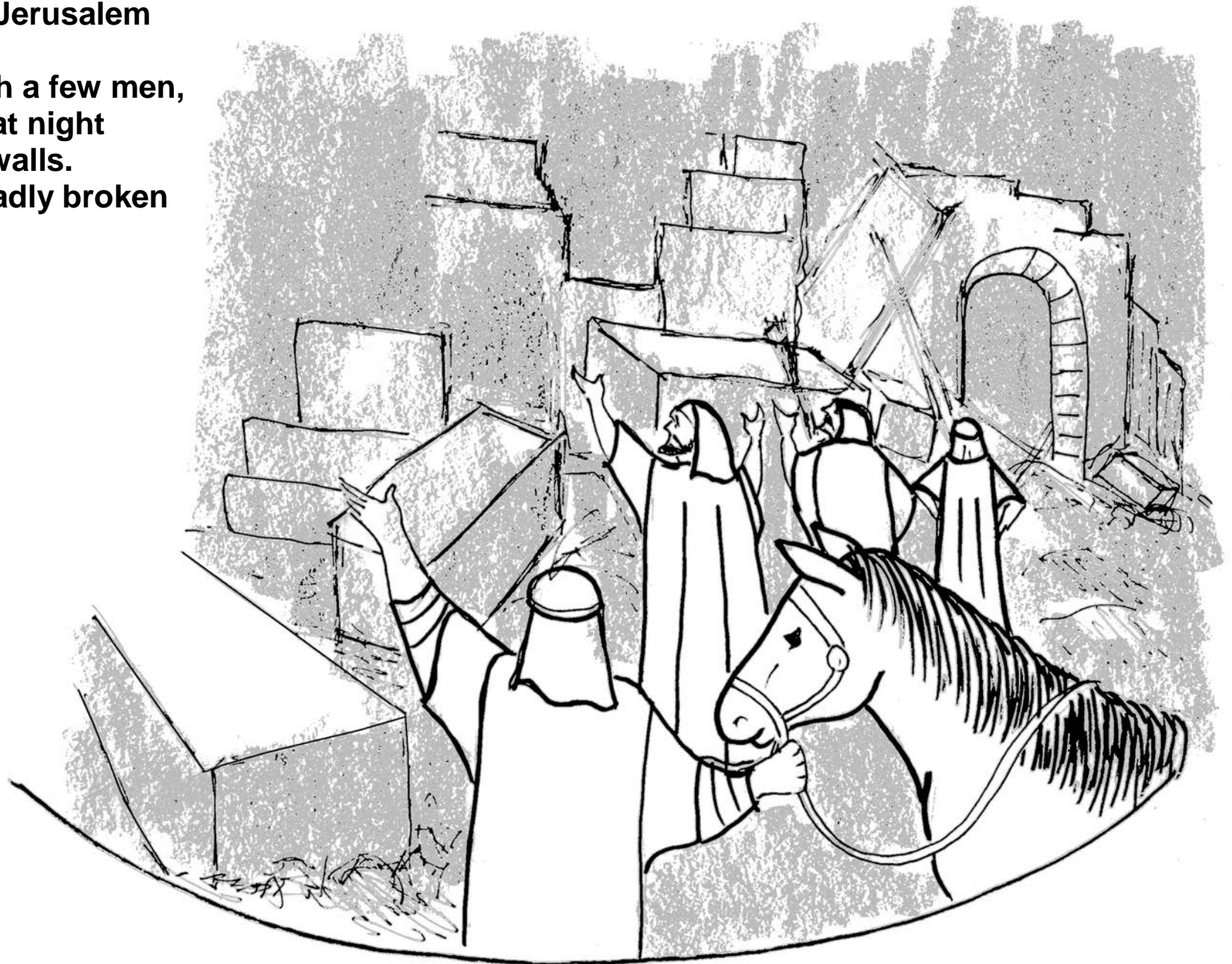


**The king was kind

God was helping him.



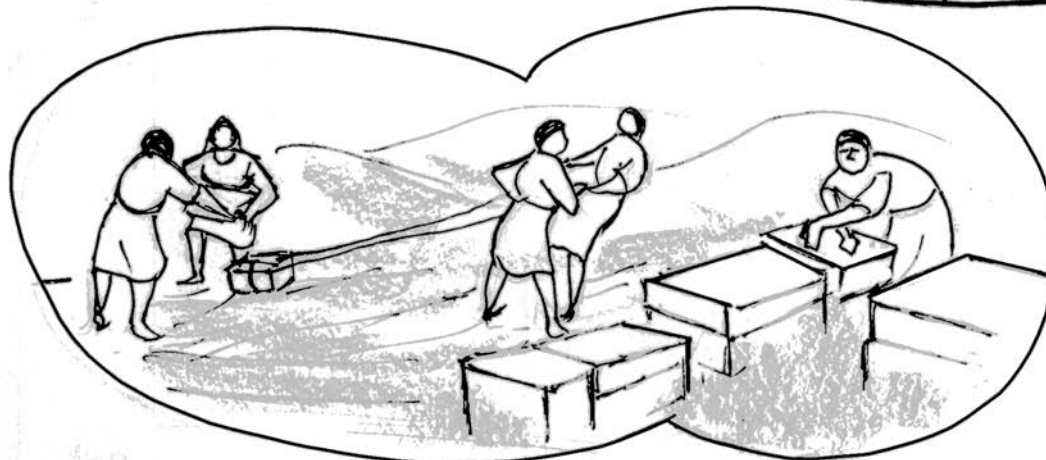
**After being in Jerusalem

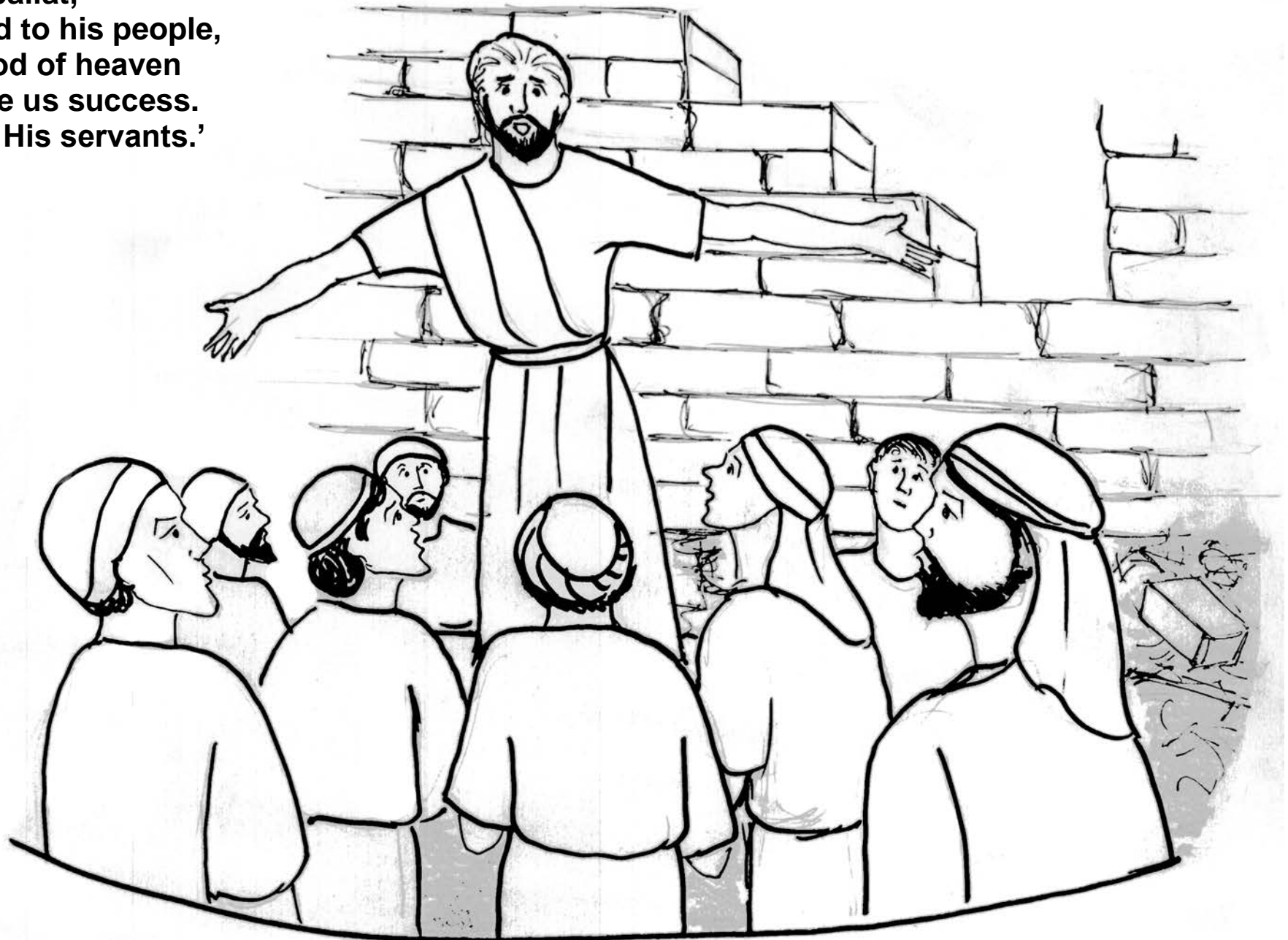

We are His servants.'**

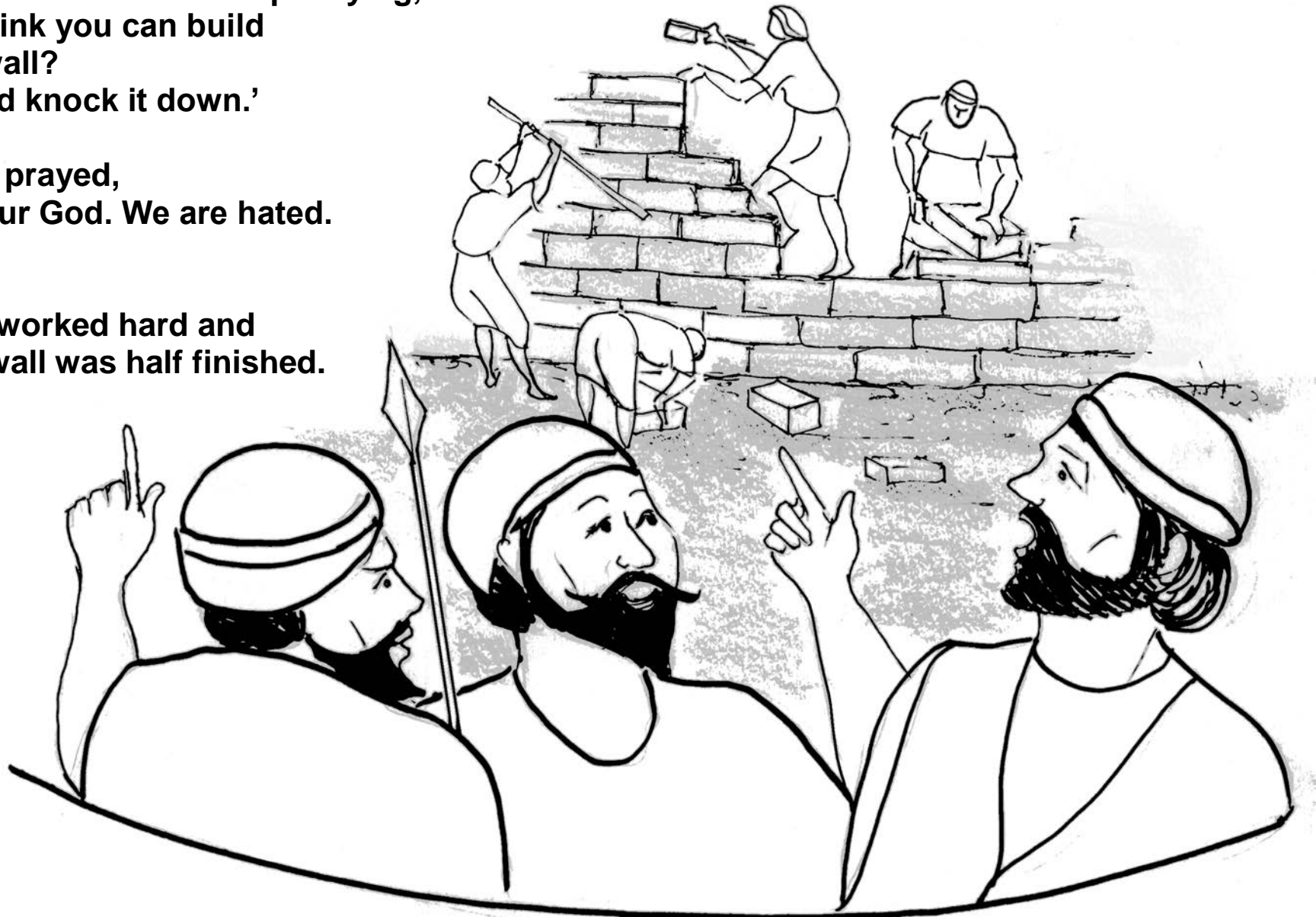


Each family was given a part of the wall to rebuild.

A fox could knock it down.'**

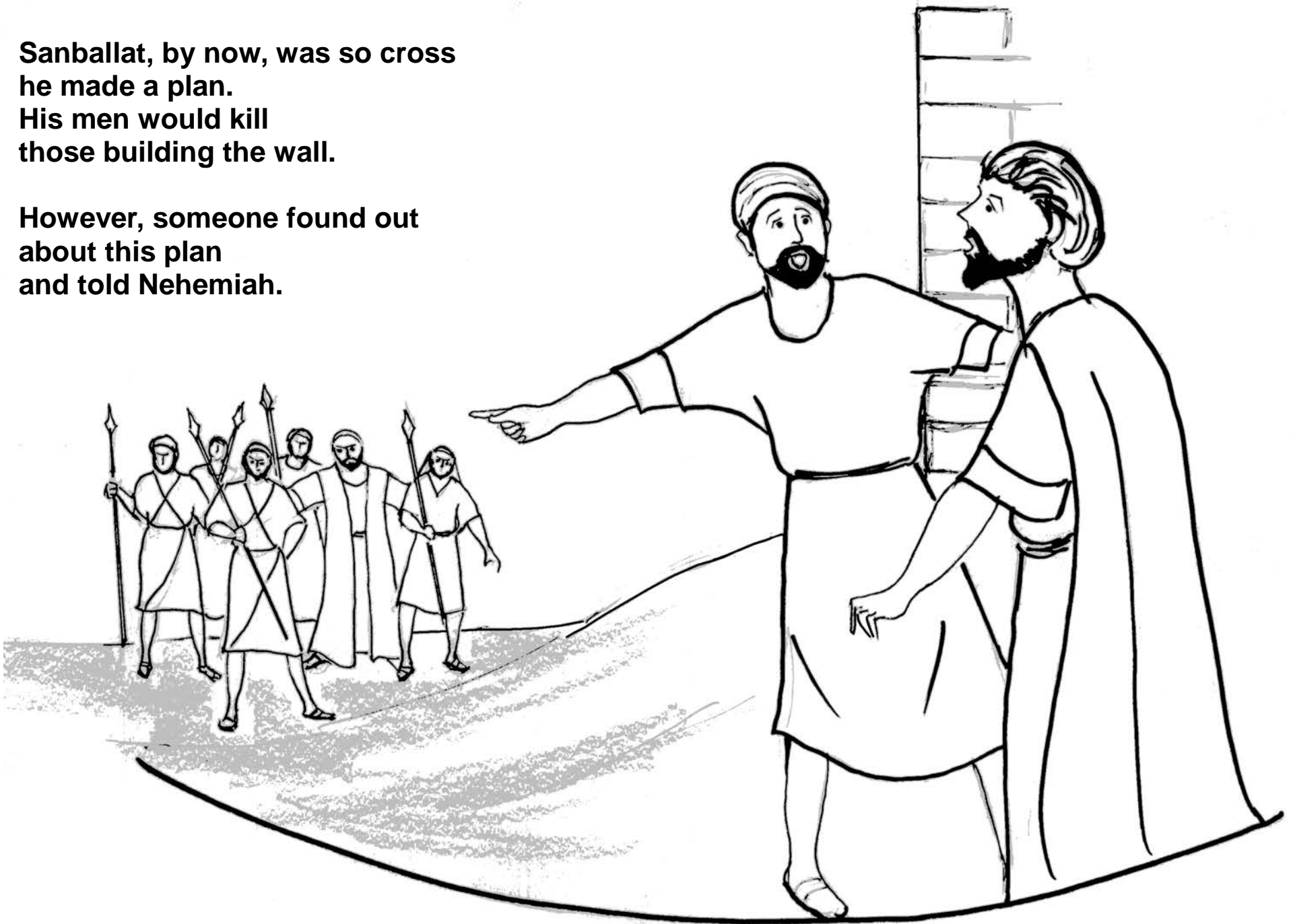
**Nehemiah prayed,

those building the wall.**

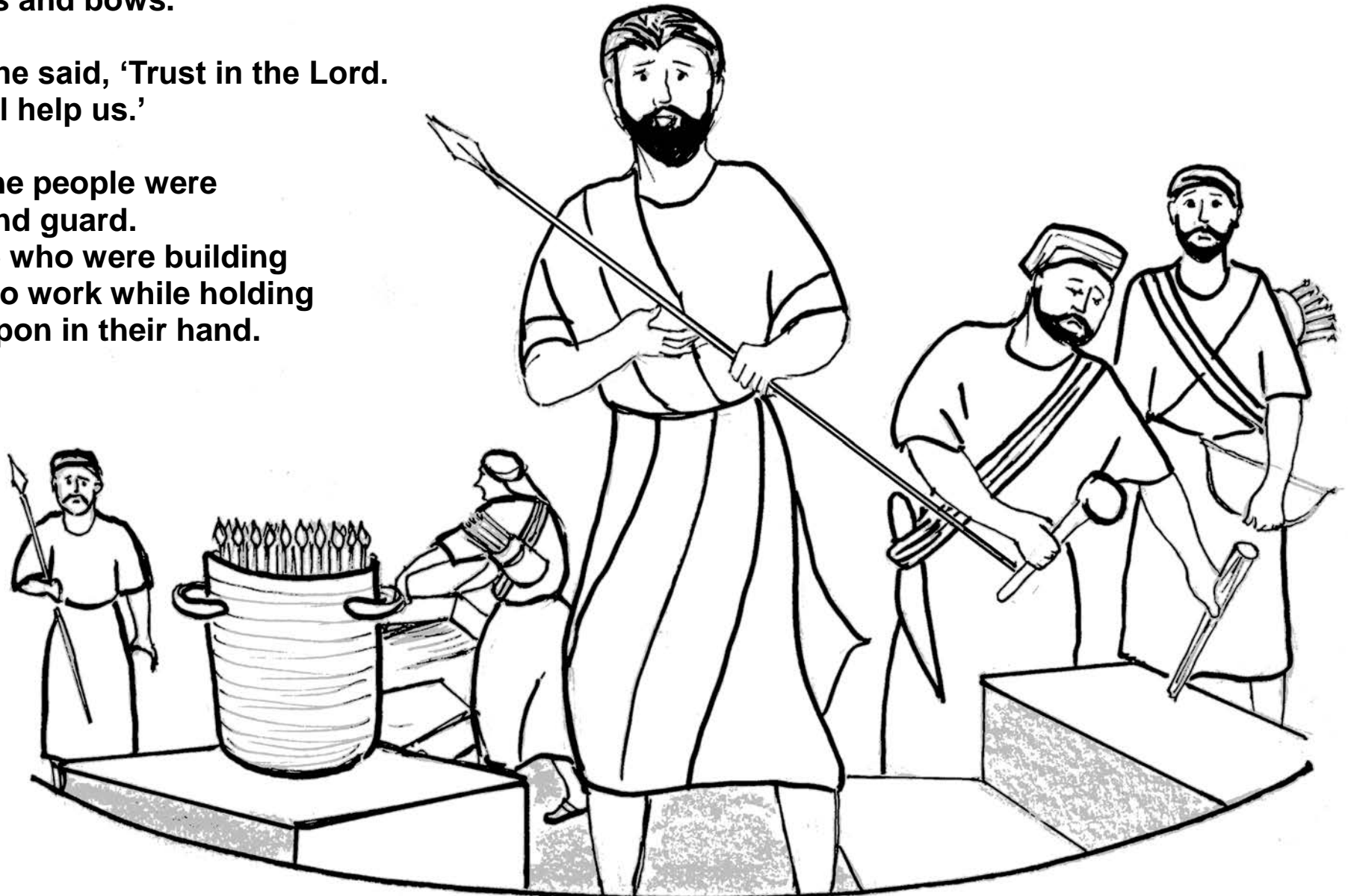
**However, someone found out

and told Nehemiah.**



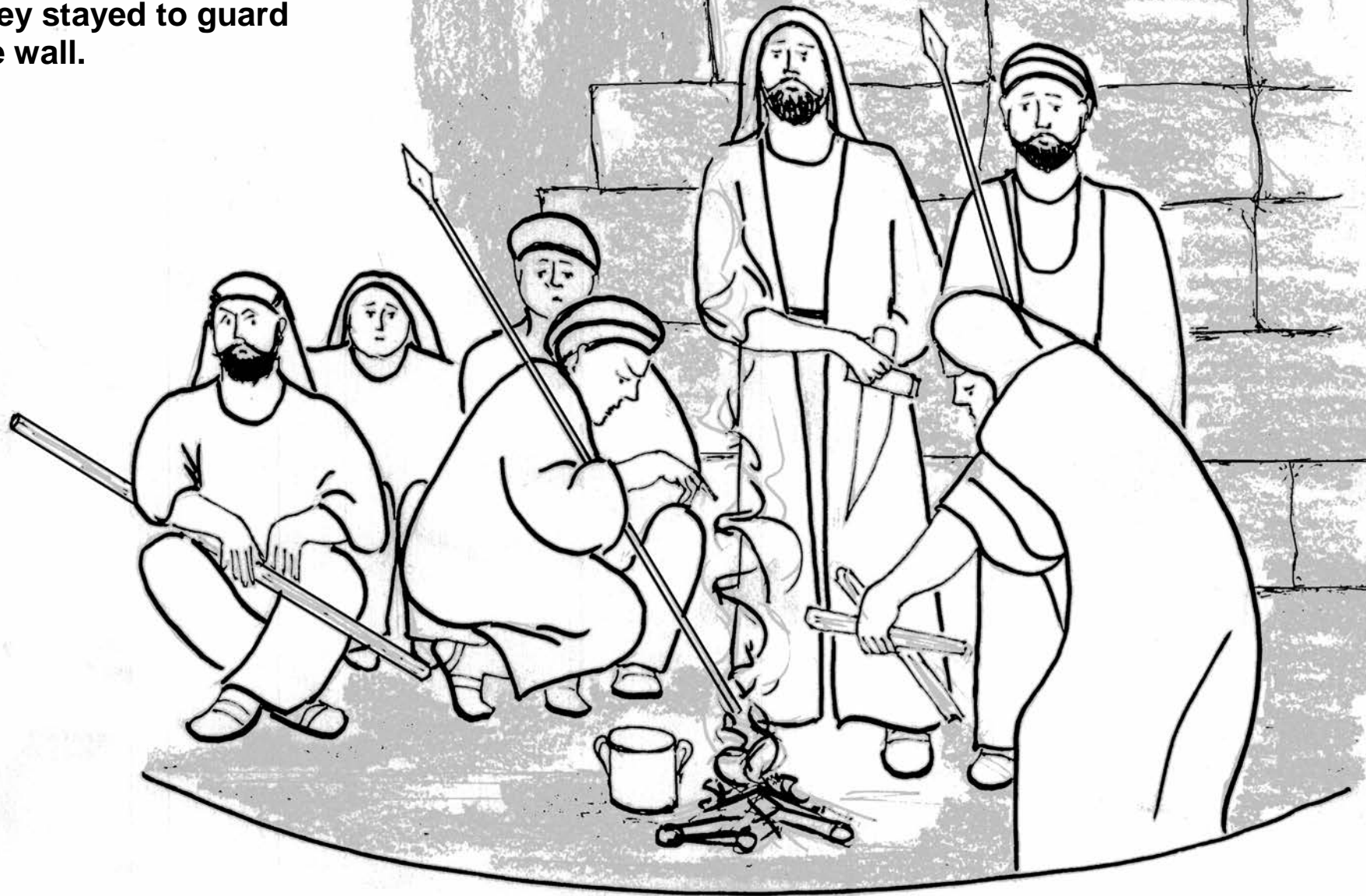
**Nehemiah told everyone to

a weapon in their hand.**



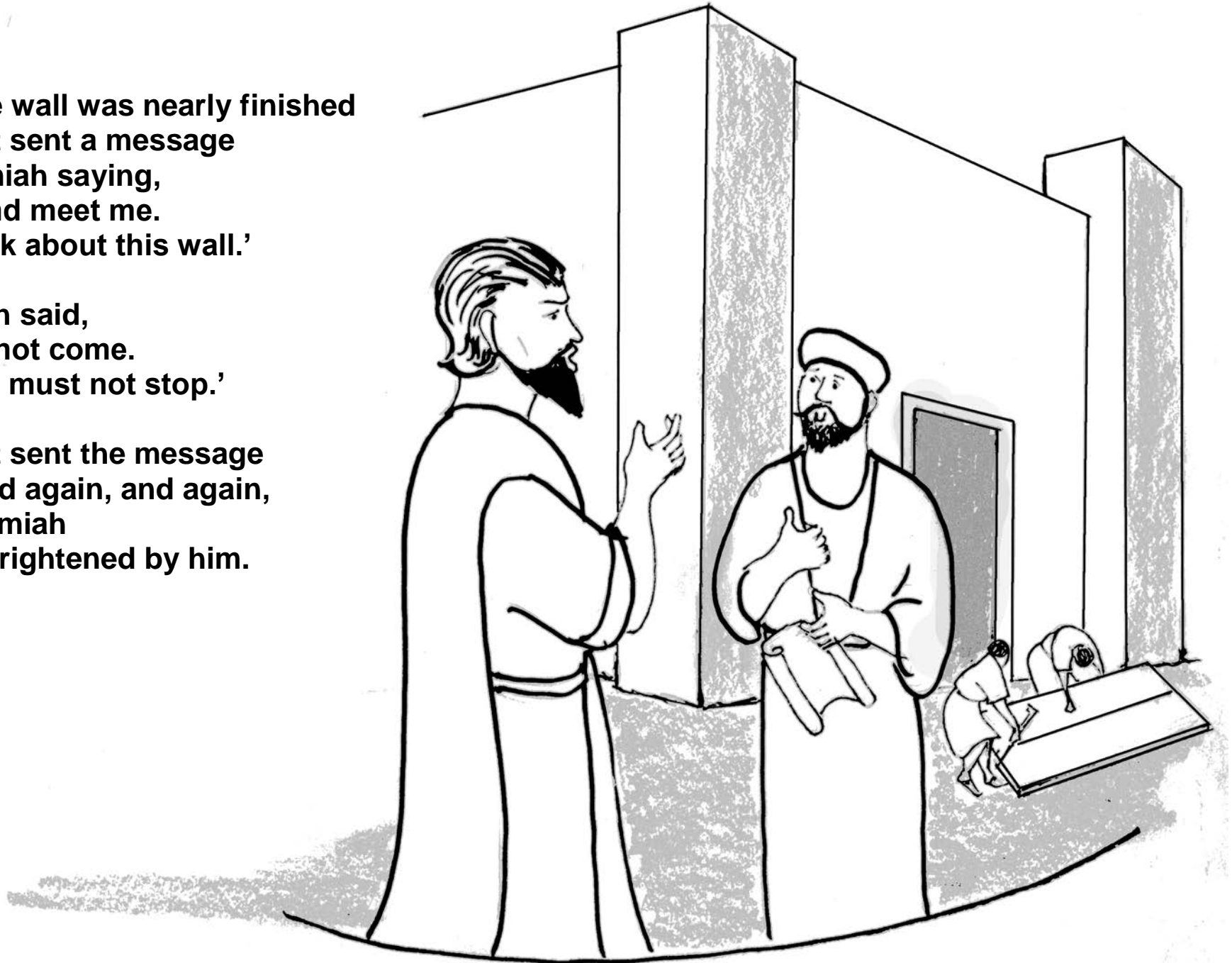
**At night no one went home.
