Saul's life was changed, when the Lord met him on the road to Damascus. He now knew that Jesus was the Son of God.


Saul stopped putting the believers in prison. Instead he stayed with them for several days.





Then he went to the synagogue and told everyone that Jesus truly was the Son of God.

From the scriptures he showed the Jews that Jesus was the Messiah.








Sometime later Saul went to Jerusalem.

The Christians in Jerusalem did not know that Saul had become a believer.


When he tried to join them they were afraid.
